We don't know much about Robert and Jackie, but I heard Jackie had to furnish her class with candy one day because she was caught eating Hersheys in school.




New articles for the Homemaking Room were bought as: pyrex, pot plants and crystal.

The Homemaking I girls are learning how to knit and they made gifts for Christmas.


