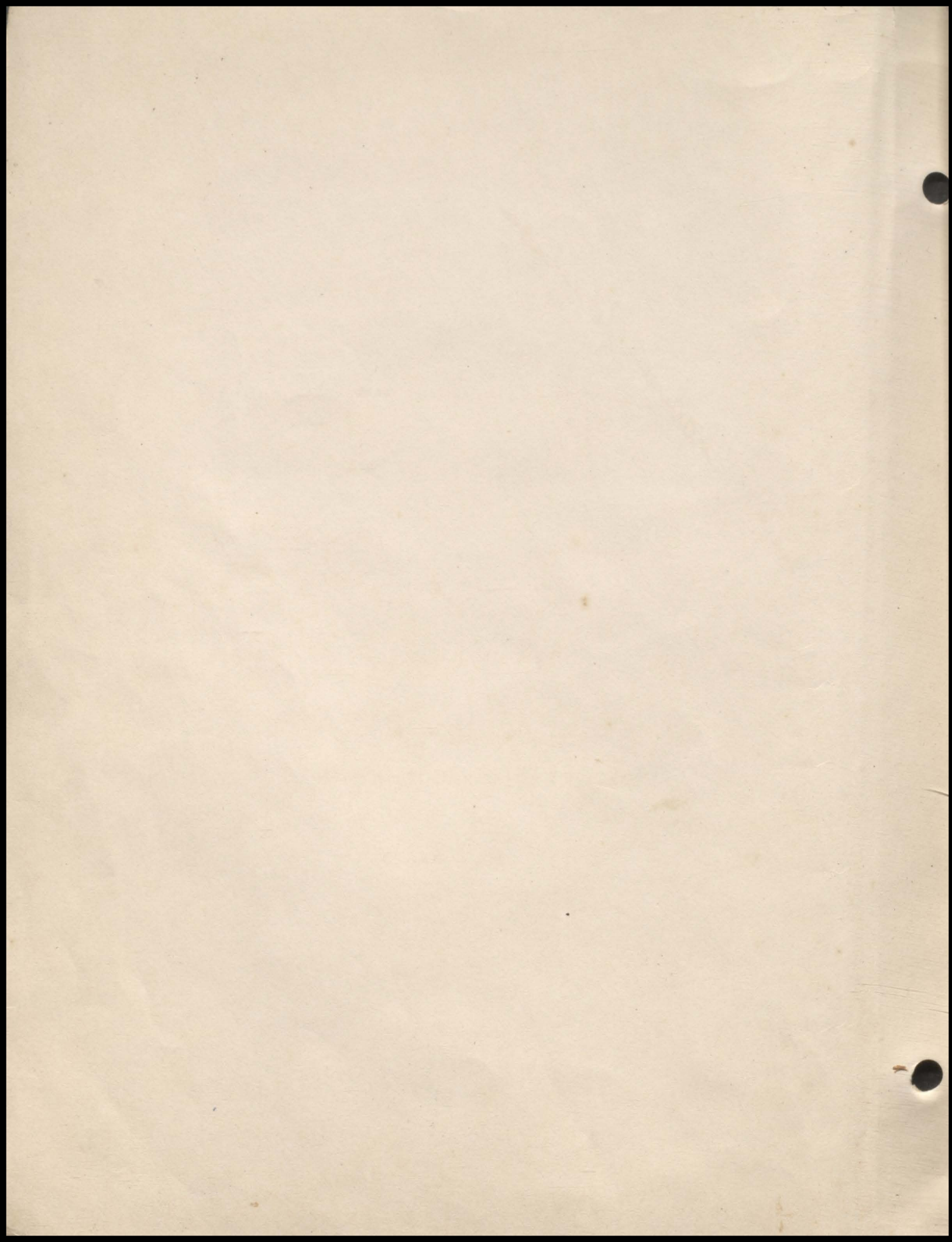


## MARSHAL HIGH SCHOOL

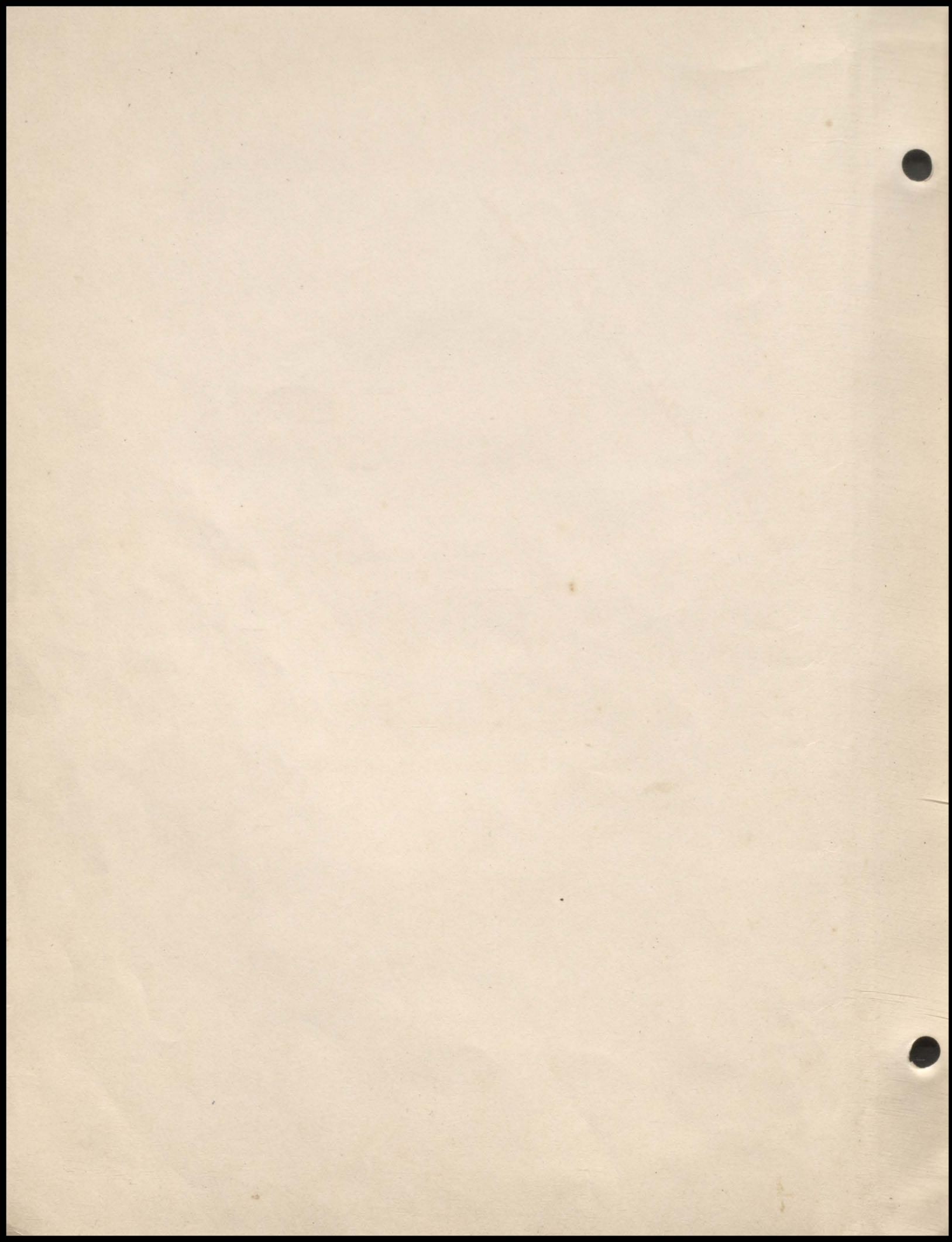






### CLASS PROPHECY

### FOOTBALL

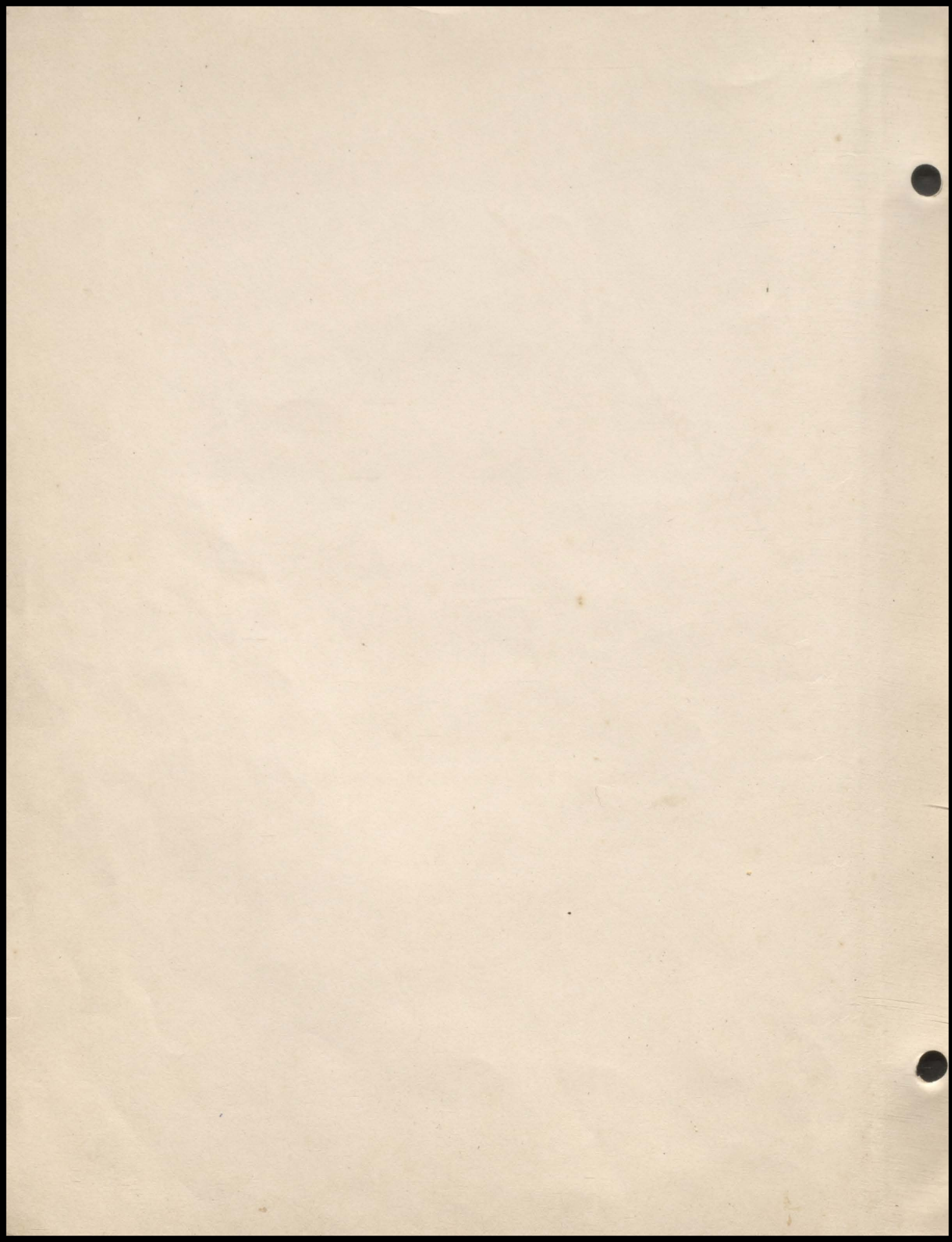
The Blue and Gold will add football to its sports roster during the coming fall. A schedule of eight games, four at home and four away, has been drawn up. The home games will be night games.
