B O Y ' S V O L L E Y B A L L

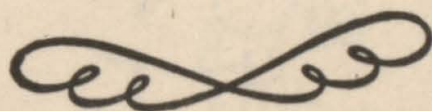
The boys drew Louise first and after a slow start they went on to win. In the finals they drew Blessing and defeated them to cop the second trophy.

SENIOR TRACK

At the Conference track meet held at Boling on April 6, the Markham Mustangs won third place in the meet with a total of seventeen points. The Crescent Bluejays won the meet with a total of 57 points. The teams of Crescent, Van Vleck, Markham, Louise, La Ward, Palacios, and Blessing High Schools participated.

In the Senior division Sparks tied for first place in the pole-vault with Thompson fourth in the same event. Krenek won third place in the 880 yard dash. Frick came in second in a record breaking mile event which was run under 5 minutes for the first time. M. Valigura won fourth place in the high hurdles, and Wind copped fourth in the low hurdles. The Mustangs took second place in the 440 yard relay, and also took second place in the mile relay.
