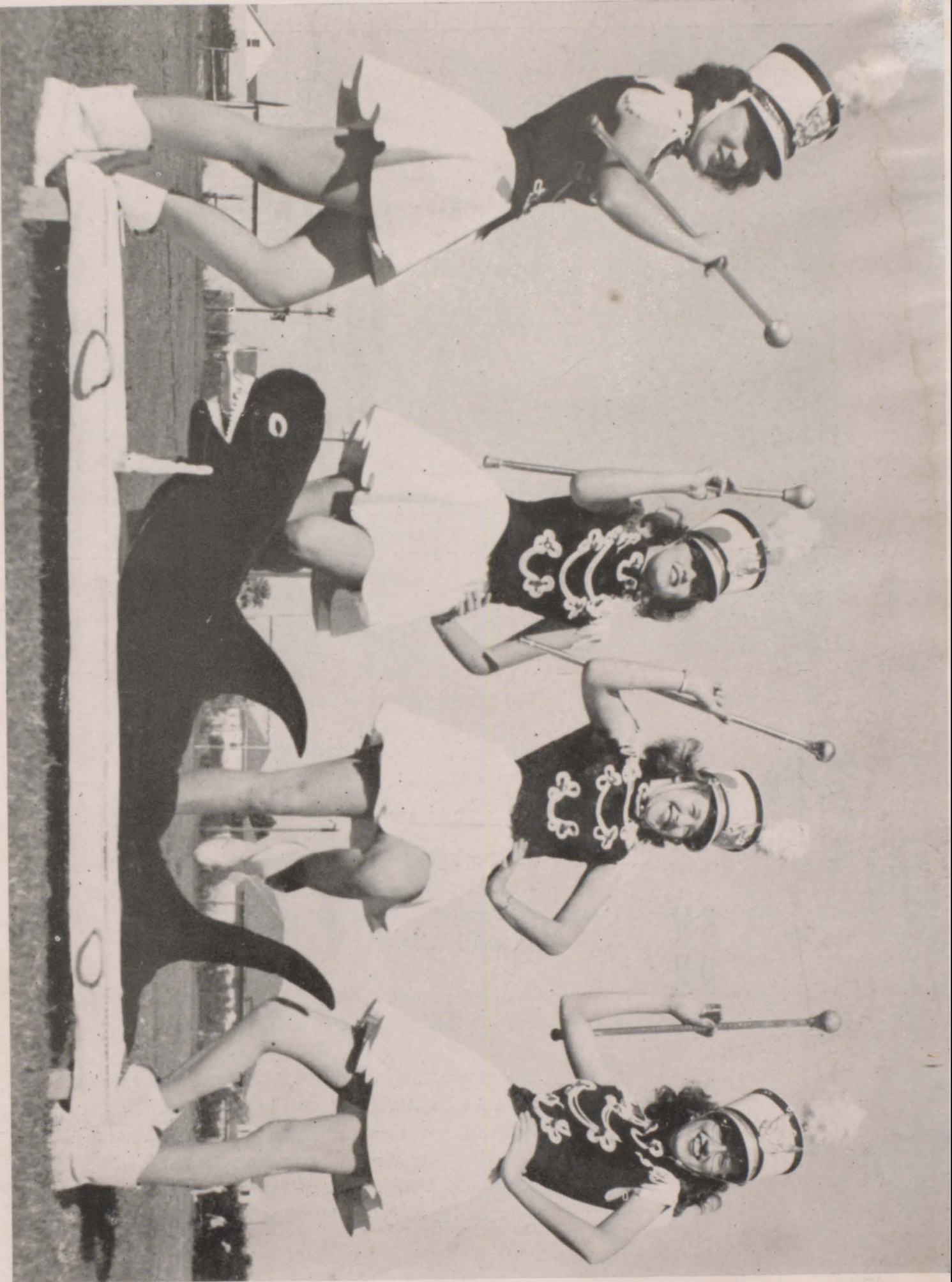

FOOTBALL

The Palacios Sharks began the 1946 football season with a new coach, Carroll Cairnes, and high hopes of making this a victorious year. Coach Cairnes, initiated the use of the "T" formation by the Palacios team, and after much grueling practice, this form of tactics proved quite successful.

The Shark's pre-season training camp was held in September during the first week of school. The squad, numbering 27 players, put in four hours a day of workouts and drills. A hearty lunch was served at the Green Lantern Inn each day.

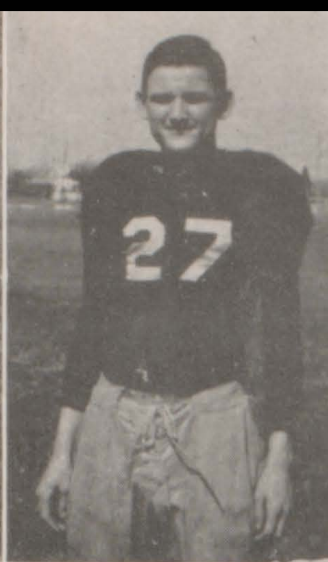
Coach Cairnes began the season with nine lettermen, and was soon able to complete the team. Not only the lettermen, but the other players as well showed remarkable ability in mastering the intricacies of the difficult "T".

The season opener for the Sharks was a conference game with Bloomington on the local gridiron. After a scoreless first half, the Sharks put forth all their efforts to come out with a 13-0 victory. Jensen and Manning stood out in the ball-carrying department, while the whole team played an excellent defensive game.

After an easy victory over Goliad, the Sharks suffered their first and only defeat of the season at the hands of the Yorktown Wildcats. The climax of the season was the Shark's annual tilt with the Port Lavaca Sandcrabs. The score was tied 6-6 until the end of the third quarter, when Jensen broke through for a touchdown to give us a 12-6 win.

The Sharks forfeited their chance at the District Championship by their loss with Yorktown.

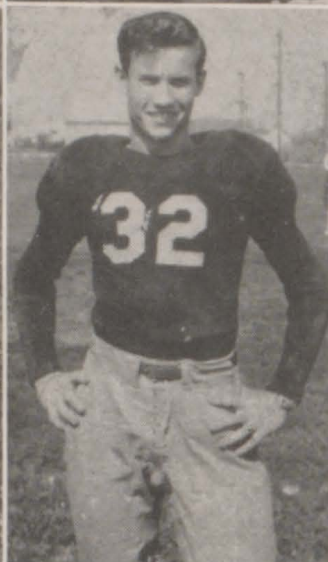
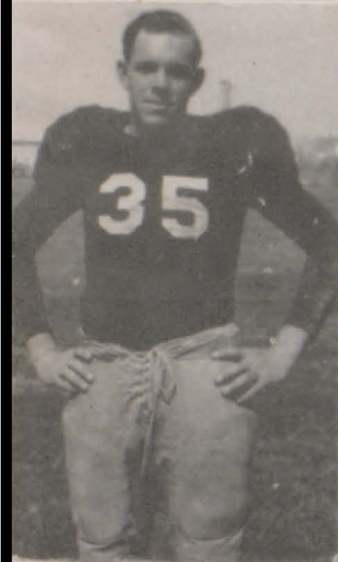

On December 27, 1946 the Palacios Sharks played their first game of the season with the Palacios Pirates. It was a practice game, but a thriller. The score was 31-31 ending in a tie.

On January 10, 1947 the Sharks went to Port Lavaca for their first district game. Each team was in good condition and out to win. The Sharks won by a 10 point margin.

Palacios went to a tournament at Blessing on January 18 where they played Louise and Bloomington. The Sharks defeated Louise 19-11 and lost to Bloomington 37-25.

The following Tuesday, the 18th, the Sharks played again at Bloomington and were beaten again by the Bobcats. The next game with Bloomington was at Palacios.
