JEAN ANN WESSELMAN will become a geometry teacher at ole P.H.S. With her as teacher and Norris as principal, Palacios High will really be rocking.



The Palacios Band enjoyed many trips this year. Their first was to the Bay City Rice Festival where they marched in the parade.


