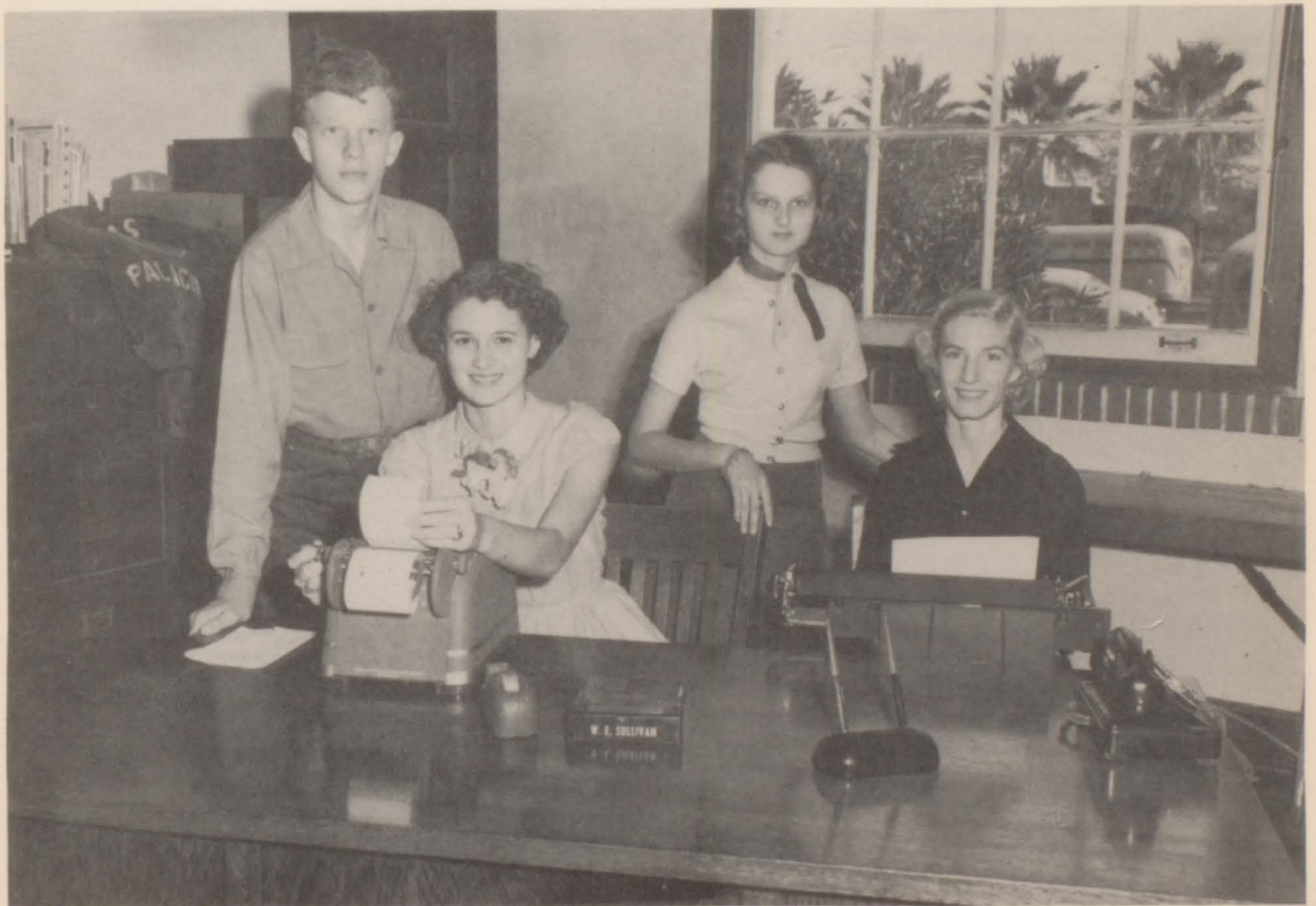
FOREWORD

TO THE STUDENTS OF PALACIOS HIGH SCHOOL:

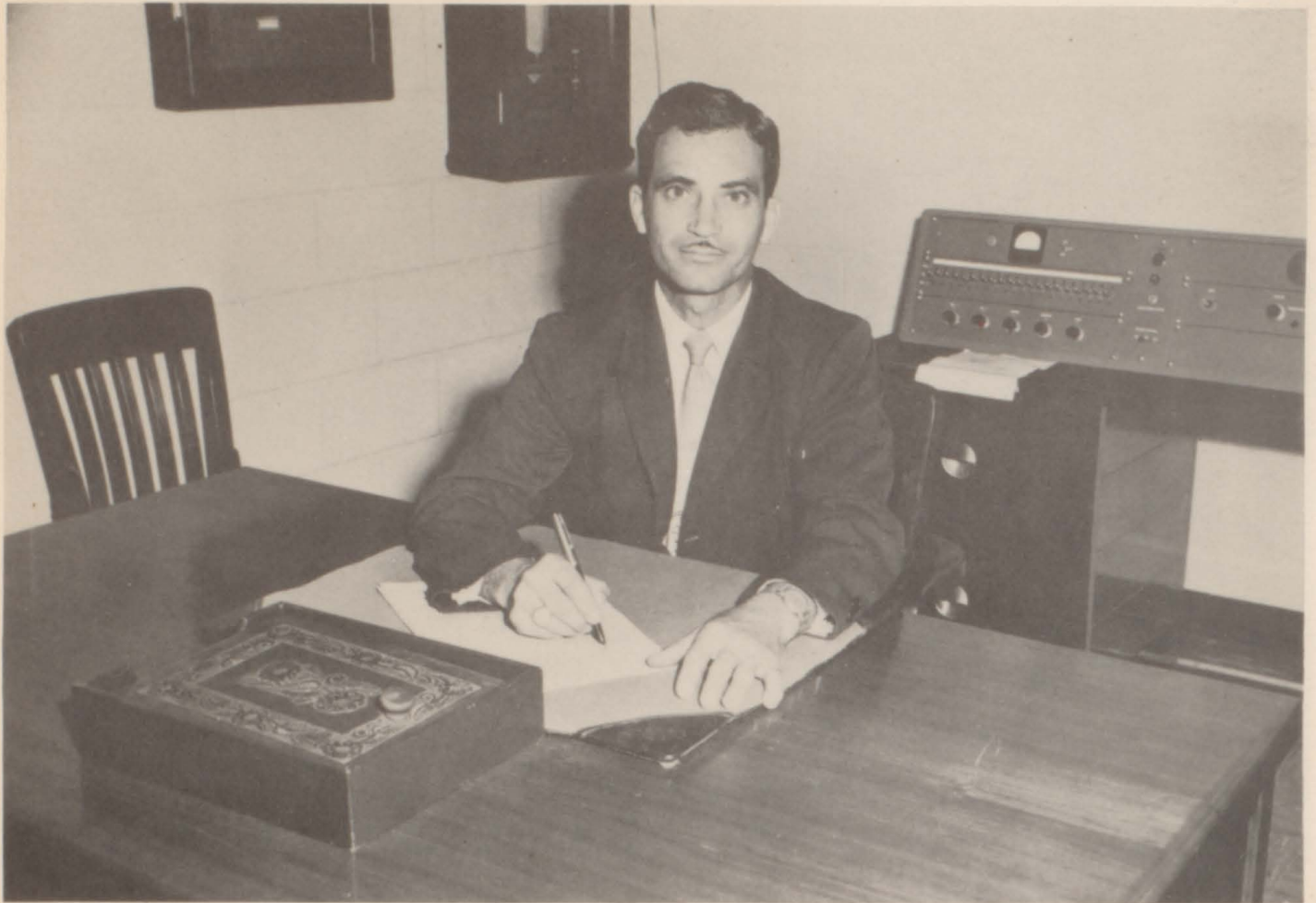

1953 FOOTBALL

September 25--Palacios-19, Sweeny-27

The Sharks suffered their first defeat of the season due to injuries in the game. The Sharks lost Dean Blackwell, Nelo Seaman, Leroy Smith, Paul Guttenberger, and Clint Wratlslaw. The Sharks scored first on a line plunge by Wratlslaw. Bowers kicked the point. The score at the half was 7-7. Sweeny scored two long touchdowns to go ahead to stay.

October 2--Palacios-20, Port Lavaca-12

November 13--Palacios-27, Ganado-0

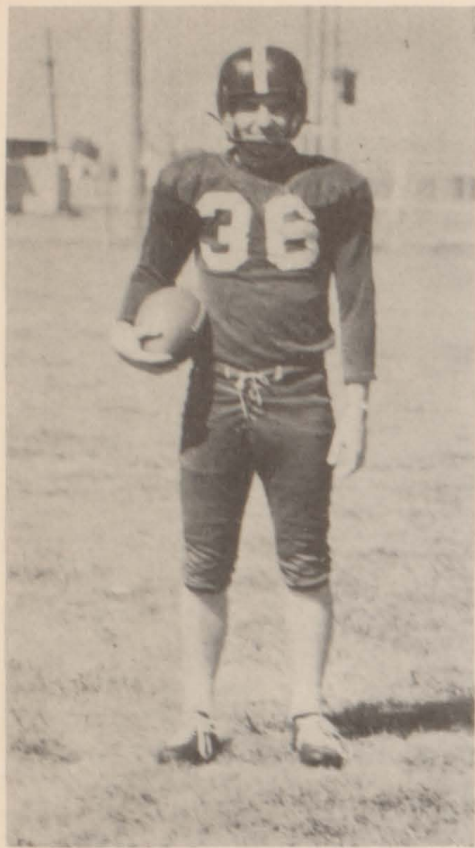

December 4--Palacios-0, Deer Park-13

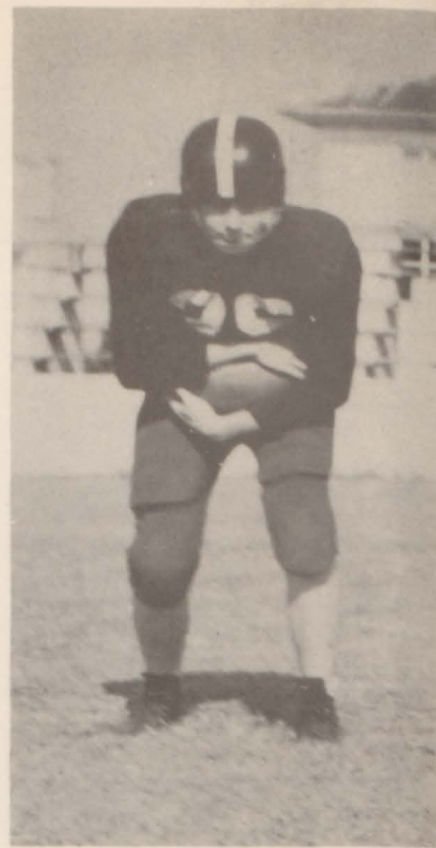
