Coach Joe Newbill came to Palacios from La Porte as new head football coach in July of 1957. That year the Sharks were voted "Most Improved Team" with a record of 4-1-5. The following year Coach Newbill was joined by Toney Carr, a fellow alumnus of Rice Institute. That year the Sharks had a 4-0-6 record. The following year proved exciting, however, as the Sharks, coached by Joe and Toney advanced to semi-finals. Over the three years Coach has amassed a record of 20 wins, 2 ties, and 12 losses.
