











Steers require constant care including feeding, exercising, and grooming. KELLY KURTZ exhibits some of that TLC with her heavy weight steer.










I'll tell You, if you tell Me!








Your Guess is as Good as Mine.

Most years Palacios High is privileged to have exchange students visit us for a year or so and attend our school. This year was no exception as we welcomed several from


Germany. We hope their time in Palacios was beneficial and enjoyable to them. It was a great pleasure for the student body to get to know them.






Palacios Junior High
