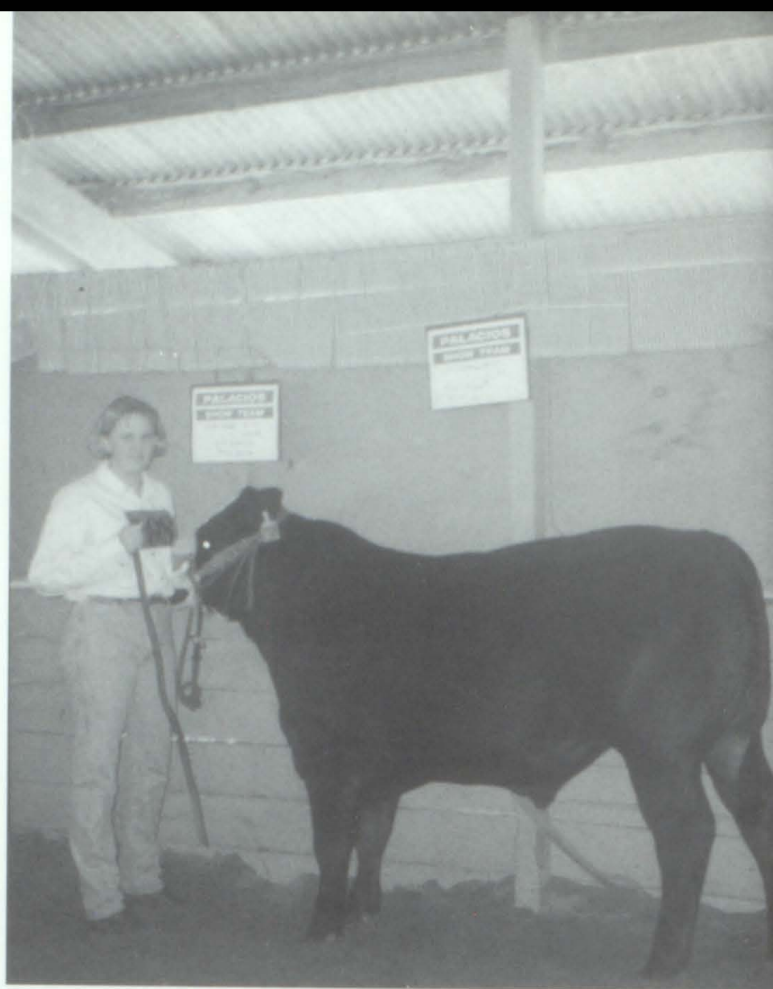

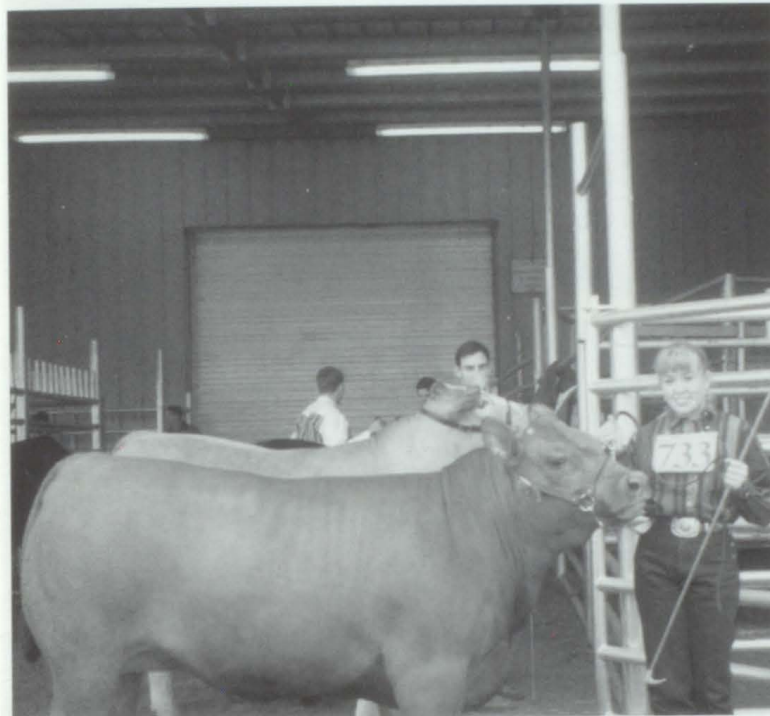

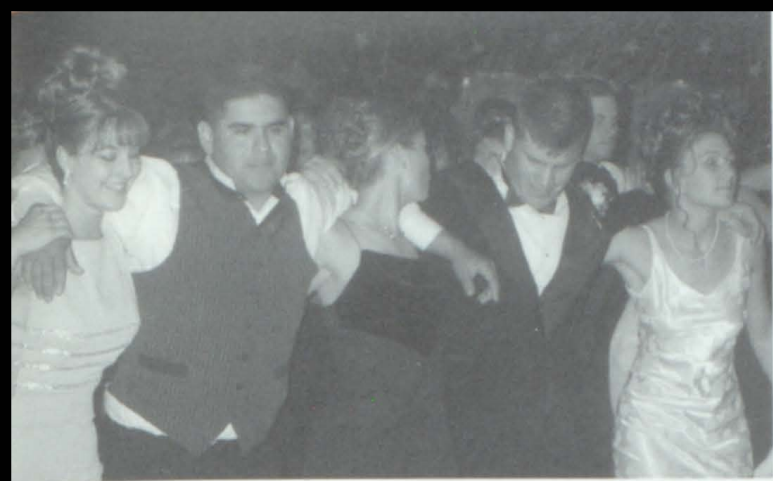

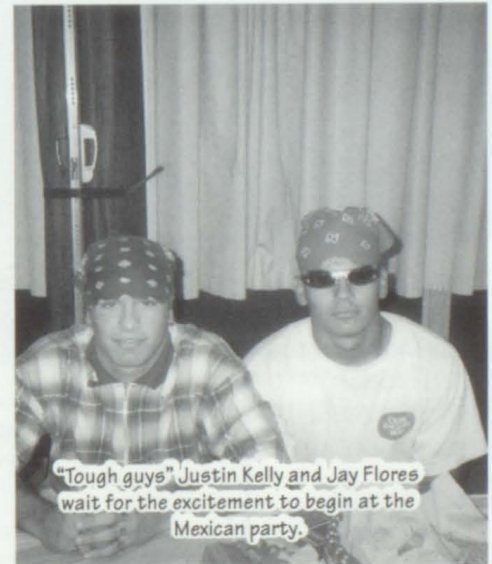

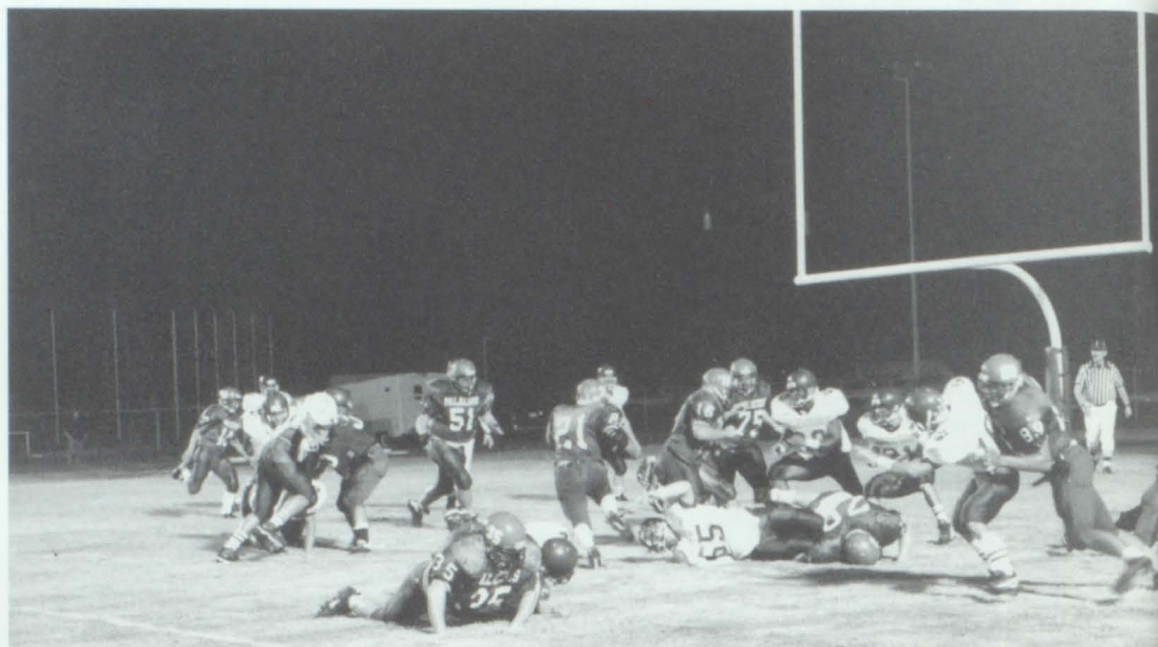

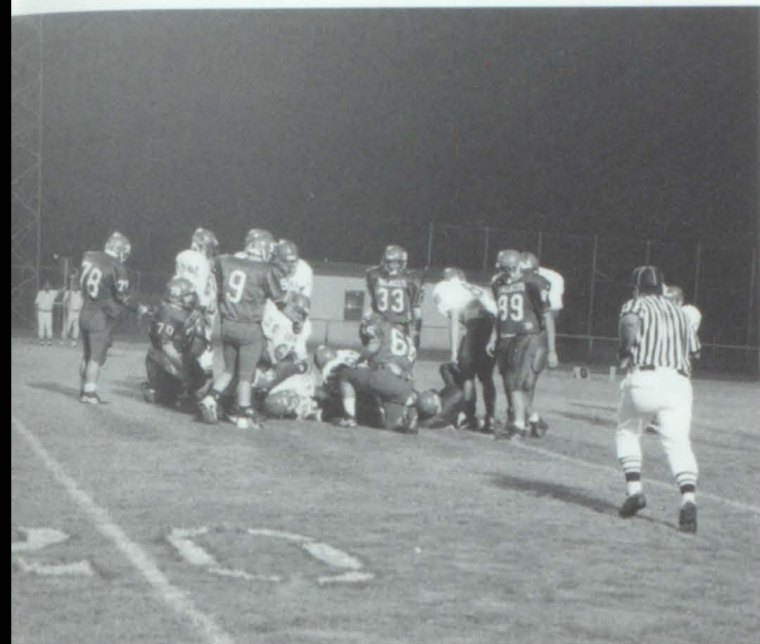
The Sharks took the field for their "Midnight Madness" workout in August with high expectations. The team geared up for a new season as the variety worked together trying to improve over last year's record.

The Sharks posted only two wins for the season, but a

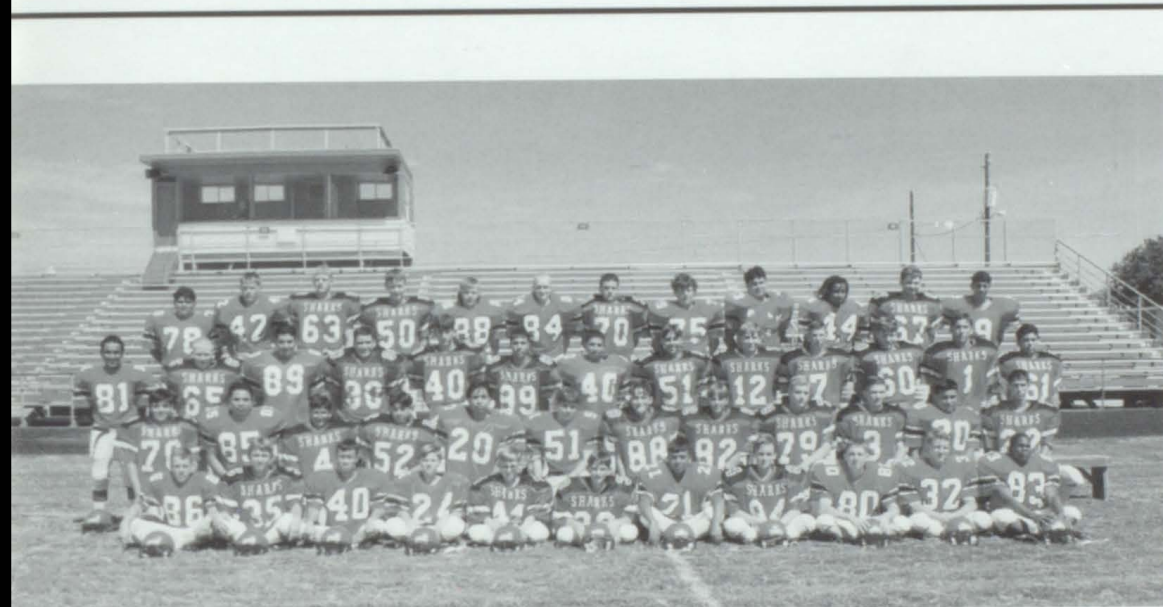
victory over rival Tidehaven was of some consolation to the team.

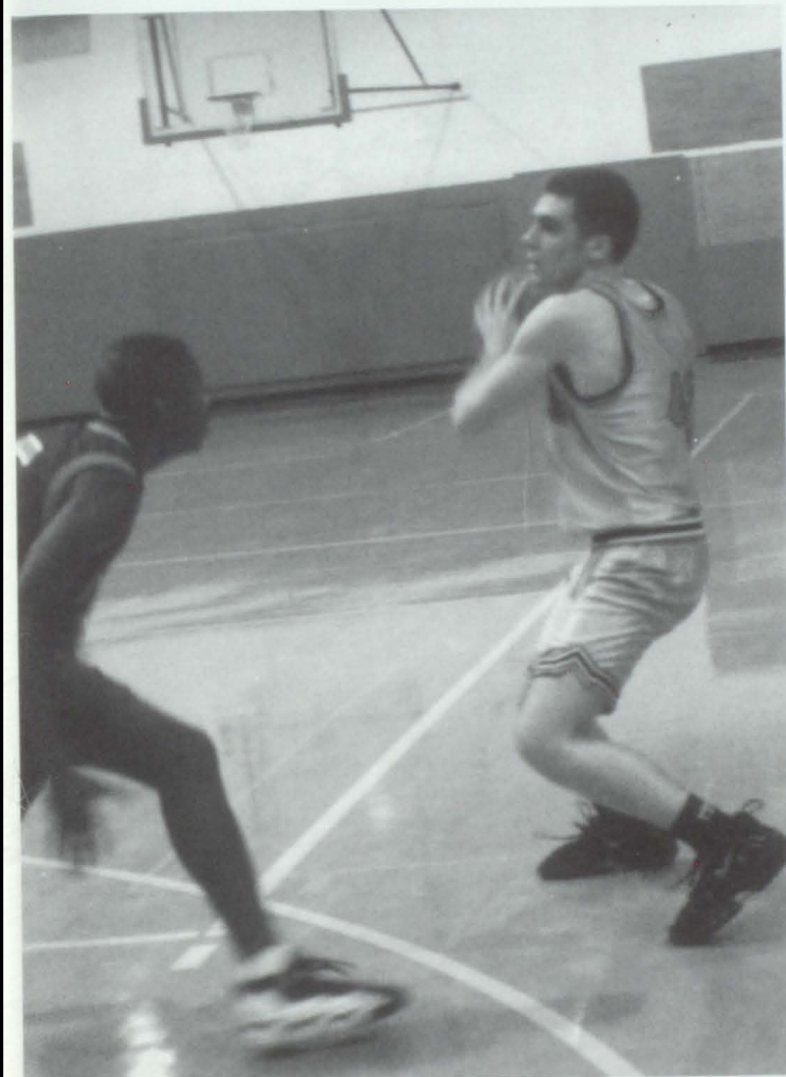

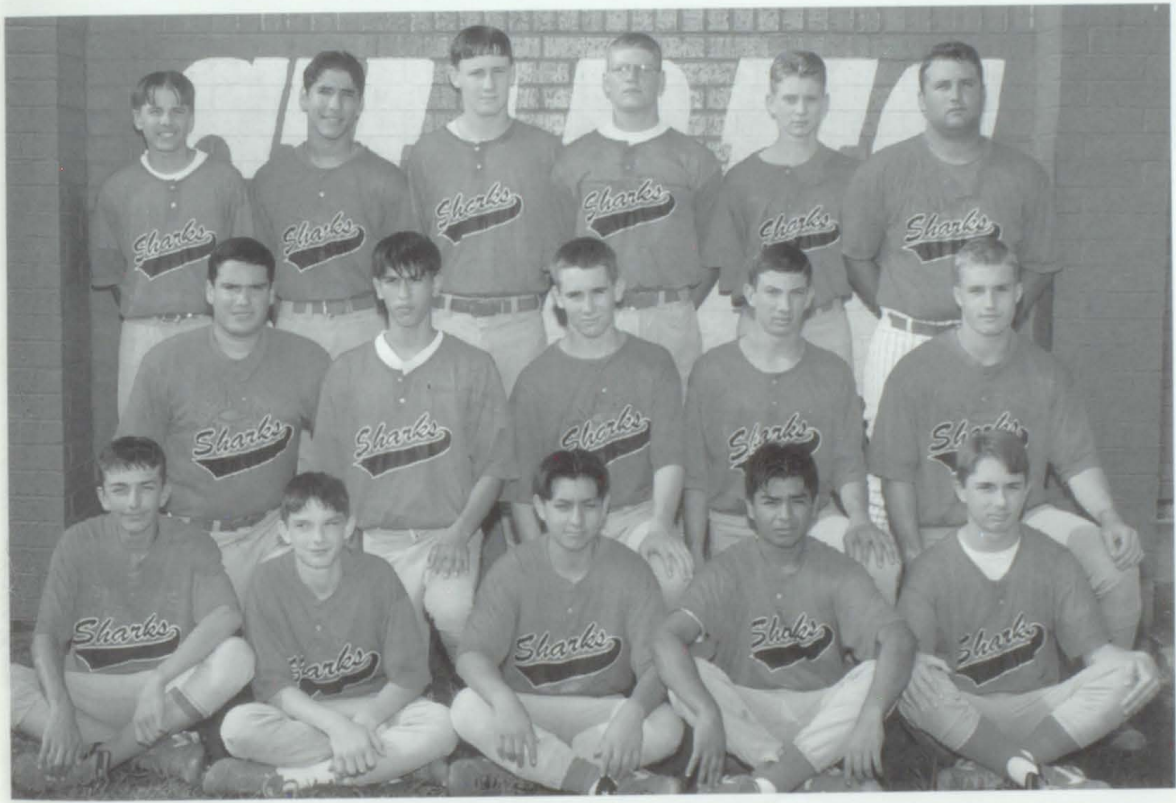

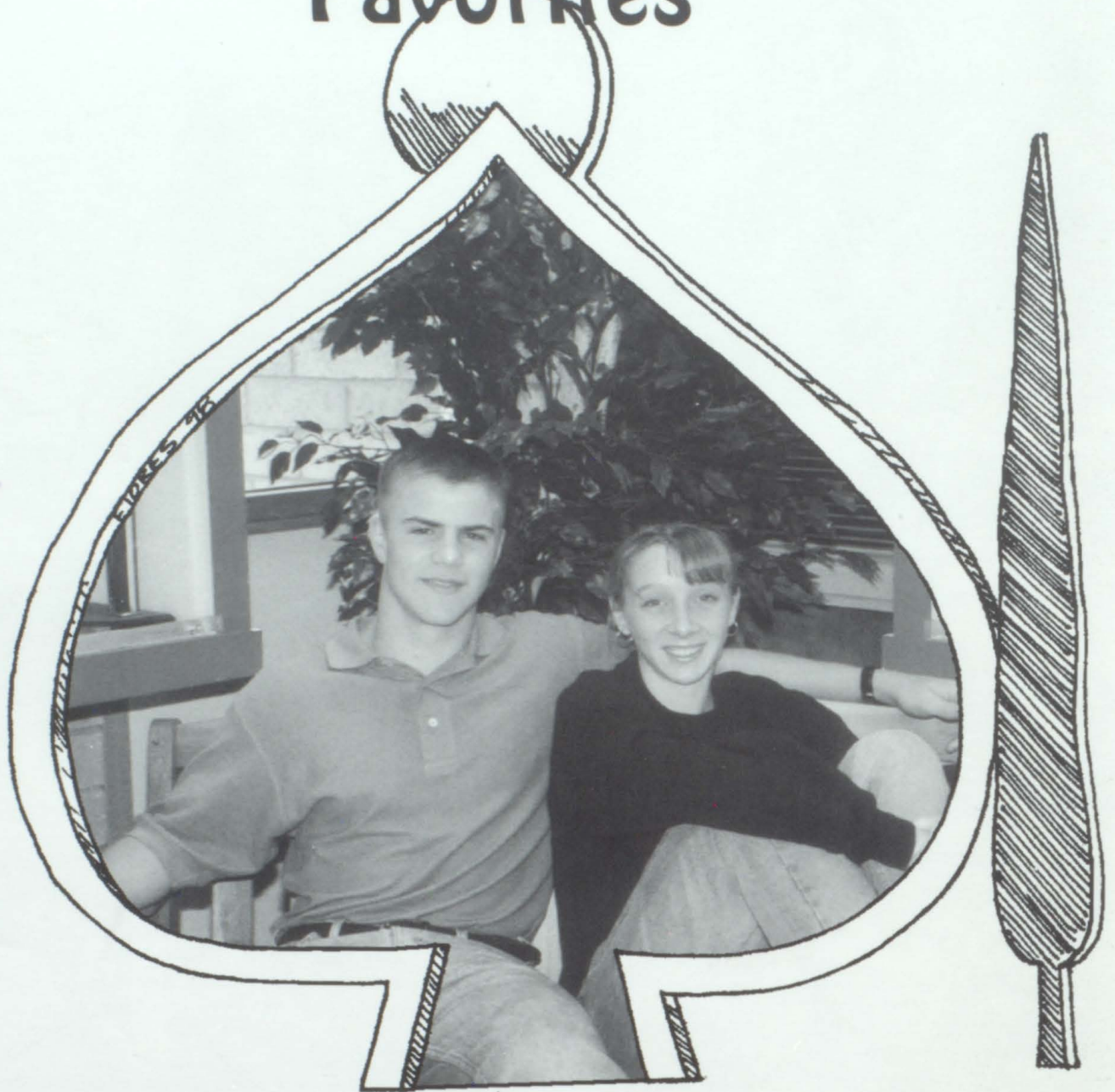

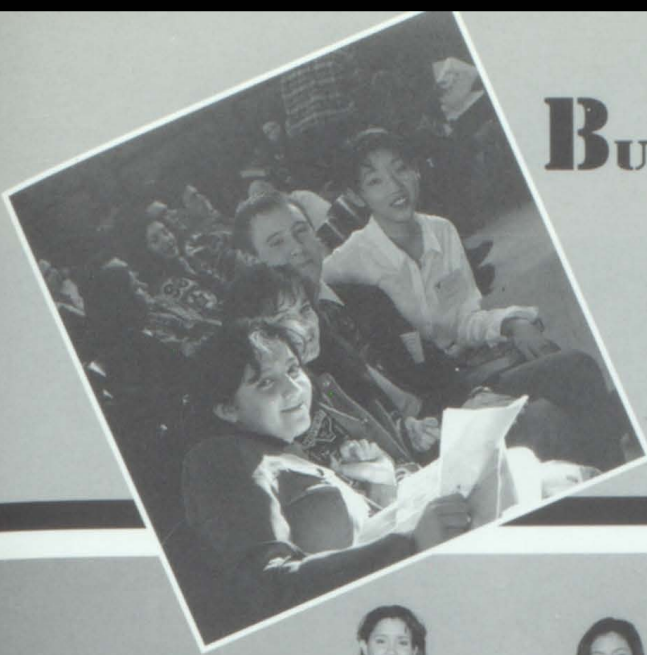

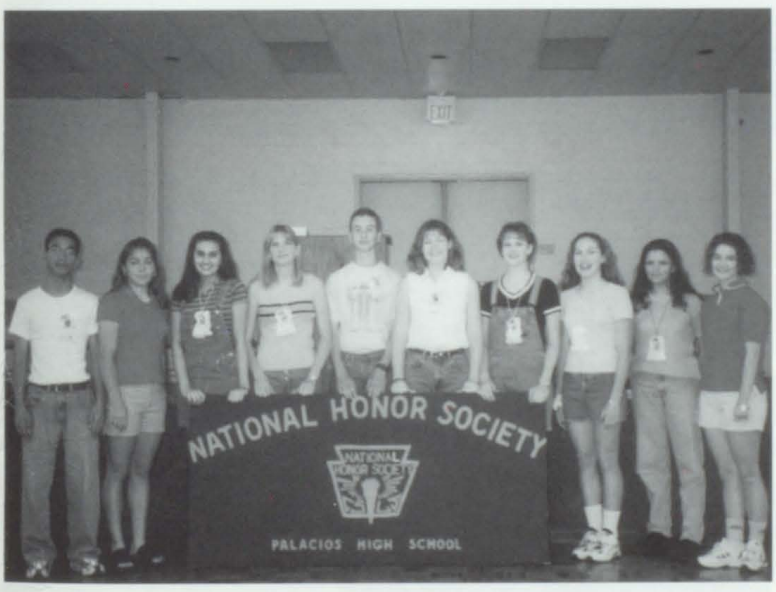

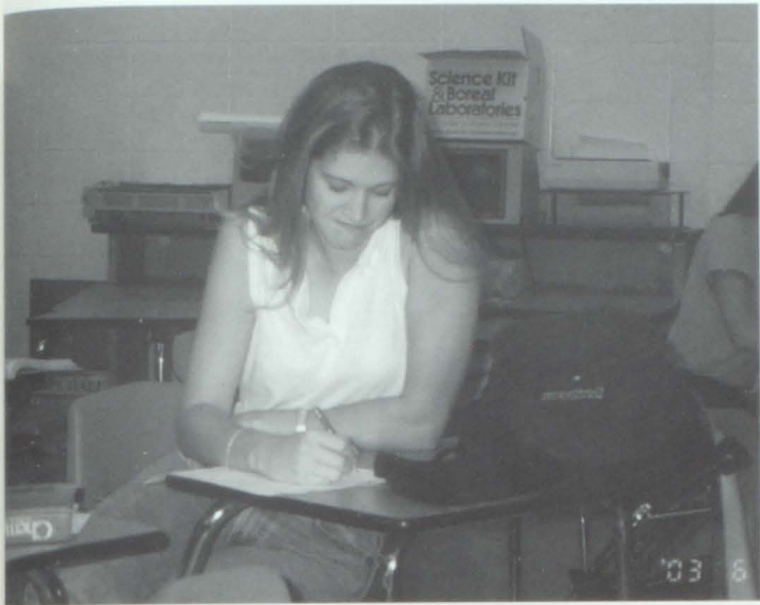

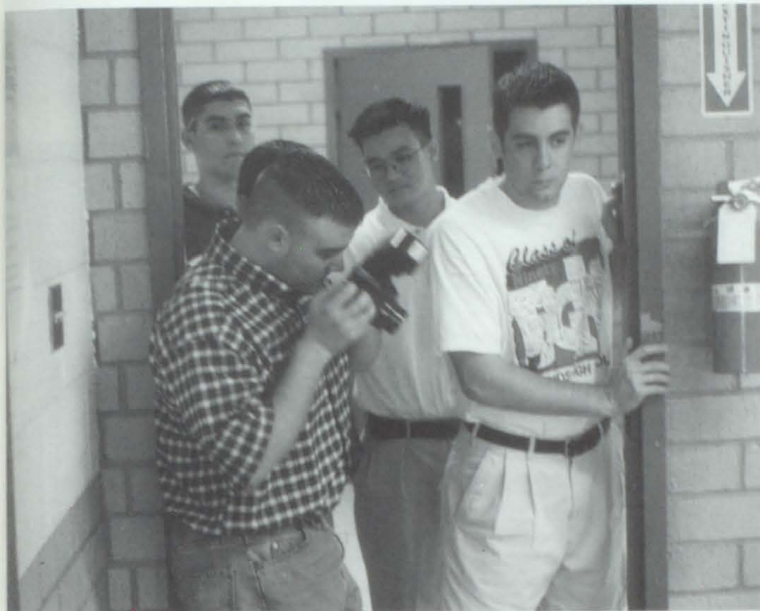
