




Let's have some fun!!!



Some students are involved in sports; any sport takes time


away from after school. Time away meaning they have practices almost every day after school and attend games at least once a week.




The students who are not in any sport usually spend time attending garnes to show off their school spirit and sometimes they go just because someone else is going.

"It was fun to get dressed up and hang out with my friends", Tavia Young said.












Much to learn about academics



how the season went," Coach Ron Arnesen said, "We were young and had many new lifters. All season we were competitive both as individuals and as a team."






coached by Mr. Jose Ortiz, and a varsity team, coached by Mrs. Jeri Garcia.













FFA was overseen by one new advisor, Mr. Benjamin Luco, and veteran advisor, Mr. Erwin Janszen.




