




TYPICAL DAY













103 seniors walked the field to receive their diplomas at graduation on May 30.




The class flower was the orchard and the class song was "Dare You To Move" by Switchfoot.



"These kids were a great group with lots of talent and creativty. They had a very succesful bake sale," Sponsor Keith Garnett said.


Member Lauren Mills summed it up best. "Art Club is exciting because you learn how to become more of a leader."









Skills USA at PHS is comprised of cosmetology taught by Mrs. Dianne Rojas and Building Trades led by Mr. Jose Ortiz. Cosmetology students have class three periods while Building Trades is two periods long.

"This year was a very successful year for Building Trades. The enrollment doubled from last year, and we did great in both contests. In District 9 we received blue ribbons on wood projects and won all three spots in the carpentry skills competition. In the state competition we placed superior with the wood project; Joseph Tschatschula placed third in the carpentry skills contest out of 15 contestants," Ortiz said.

Cosmetology tripled in size this year from last year with 21 students. Mrs. Rojas's students received four blue ribbons and two red ribbons at district, and at state two reds and one white. "This group has probably been one of the best groups I've had in a long time and I really enjoyed having them," Rojas said.





Due to the playoffs, the band had four extra road trips. "I thought it





Fiorini and Stahlecker auditioned for Pre-Area.



Sharkspeare theater stepped to the challenge this year and won district advancing play and qualified for area with the one act play *Charley's Aunt*.



2007-2008 was a banner year for sports with many firsts. In the fall, the football team went to the playoffs after 43 years, and had only the fourth 10 game winning season in PHS history (since 1914). Volleyball dominated with an unbelievable 30 win season, going five deep into the playoffs--the first time in history. 

How Far We've Come

A magical year to end a 43 year play off drought

It was a year like no other. When the season began with a one point loss to Edna, who would have predicted the Sharks would be playing until the first week of December, four deep into the playoffs, and seeing a town unify with community pride and spirit? This year's motto "Bring the Pride Back" definitely rang true.

"Making it to the State quarterfinals was definitly the highlight of the season," said Coach Mike Treybig, Victoria Advocate All-Area Coach of the year, the man who turned the football program around in three short years.

Records were broken all over the place--the Sharks had not been in the playoffs in 43 years, had not a winning season or won two consecutive district games in 16 years, had not won its final football game in 19 years, and had not won its final road game in 14 years, according to Treybig.

After the Edna loss, the Sharks put it in gear, going on to win the next five predistrict games. When district rolled around, the Sharks lost to Cuero, and then to Gonzales by two, and then won the next two district games, stomping Yoakum 51-15 to clinch the playoff spot. Then the real fun began. Against all odds from the sportswriters, the Sharks won game after game in the playoffs, defeating West Oso, Rio Hondo, the State ranked team, and Llano before falling to Cuero in quarterfinals.

The Sharks also racked up the indiviual awards with Aaron Buckley and Henry Solis leading the pack. Buckley was District Defensive MVP as well as AP All-State linebacker and MVP; Solis was District Offensive MVP and AP All-State Second Team RB. Making All-District first team were Alex Sanchez, Aaron Buckley, Solis, Alex Buckley(also All-State HM), and Eric Rojas. Second team members were Russell Laws, David Hunt, Cody Smith, Armando Sanchez, Kyle Hamlin, and Rusty Kubecka. Honorable mention were Lucas Garcia, Tony Nguyen, Jairo Perez, Marcus Ferree, Julio Ramon, and Lee Cink.

"It was a great group of young men and coaches. The Sharks greatest strength was they played as a team," Treybig said.




Cross Country began workouts in a scorching August, continuing on in a sizzling September, and getting no relief in a still hot October.







"This year's team was superb--the girls were together and never gave up," Coach James Schuetz said.


The most difficult part of the season was losing the last match to Wimberly, according to Schuetz.




In the six team boys division the Palacios Sharks placed fifth overall.

The girls placed in the top five at every meet in which they competed, capturing first place team overall at the Hitchcock meet.













with her. It makes me feel good to hear her cheering in the crowd," Brittany said.



Brittany gives much credit to the team's success because "we all were very close. We hung out with each other all the time and had many sleepovers."











