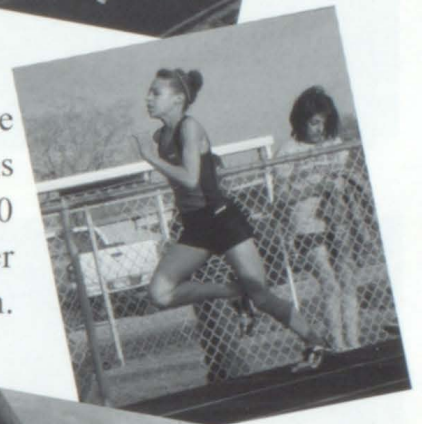

Governor Rick Perry

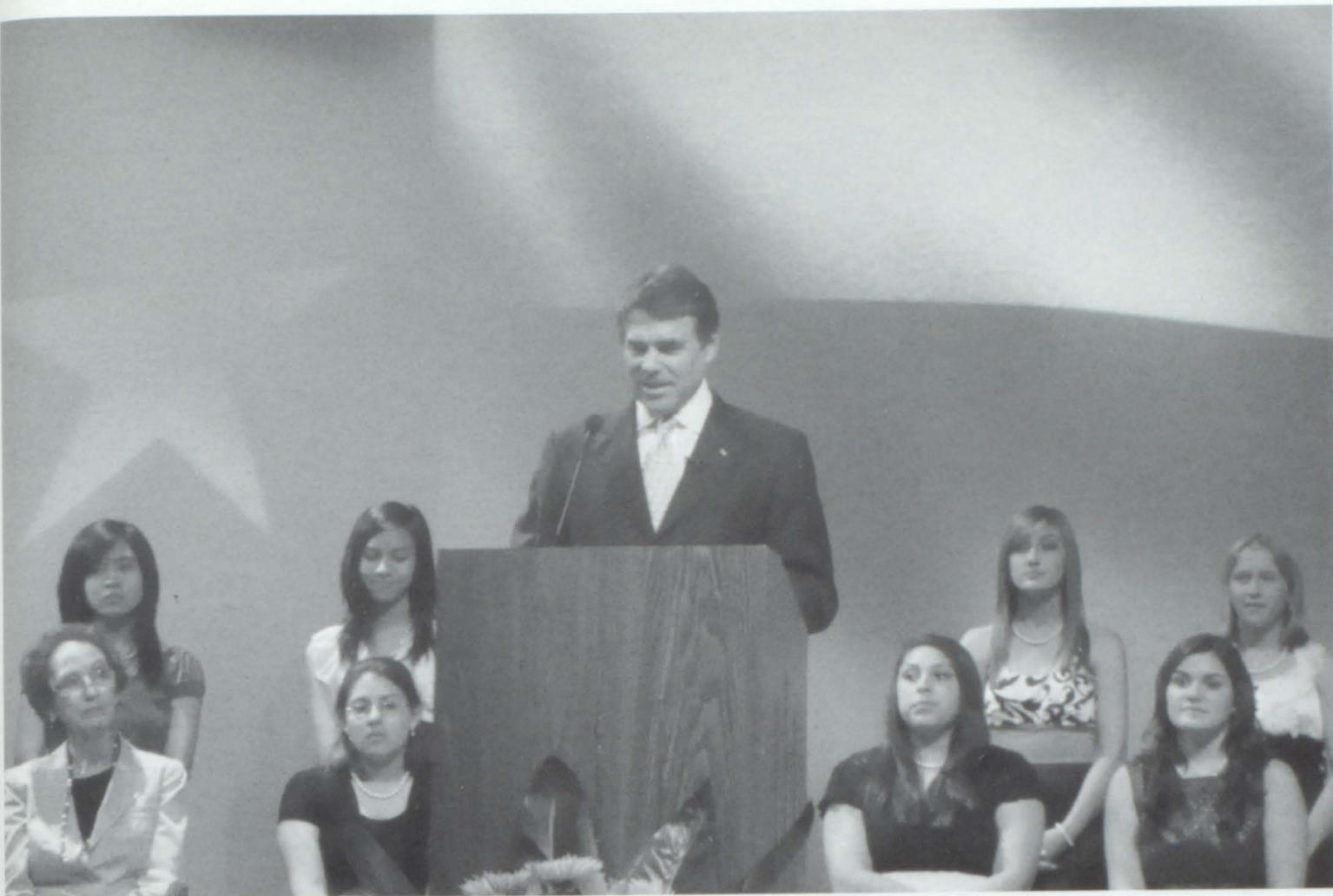
