
Facebook.....who doesn't have an account? It's where everyone is at night--the biggest meeting place in Palacios.



Texas State with my partner in crime Alicia Torres."


He is not sure of what career path he will choose. "I know by working at my aunt's restaurant it will help me with my future career because I will be working with people either way," Liem said.

Q: Why do you run?




Q: Name a few famous marathons you have run.

21 sixth period advanced theatre students put on two outstanding productions - Tom Sawyer for Fall play, and The History of Tom Jones, for the OAP.



"I enjoyed seeing the wide-eyes enthusiasm when the robot performed its task. This was our first year and everyone was motivated," Morris added.




