We extend our gratitude to both for playing such significant roles in the development of T.H.S.

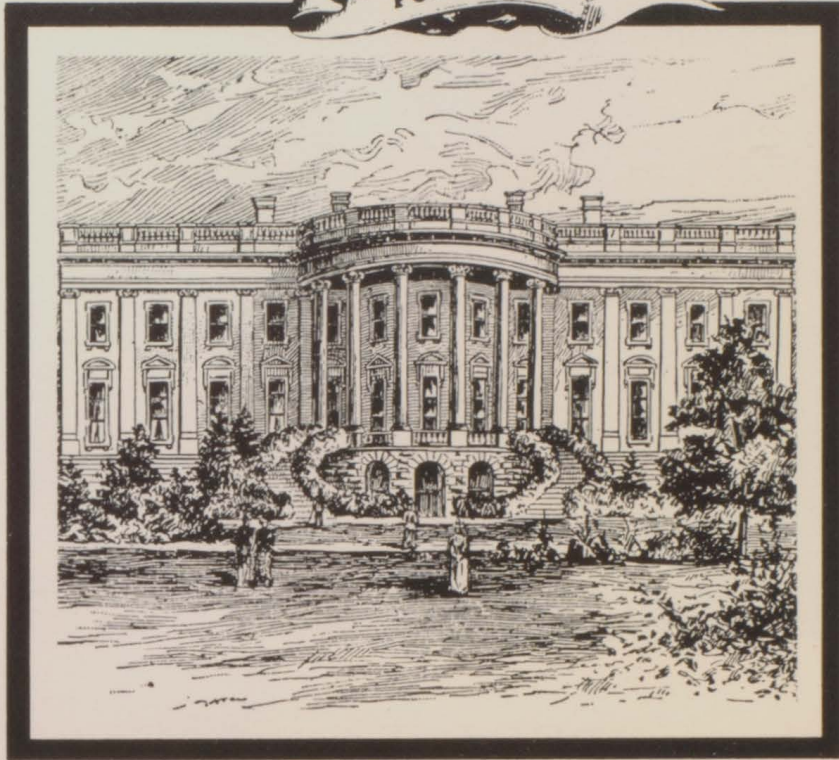

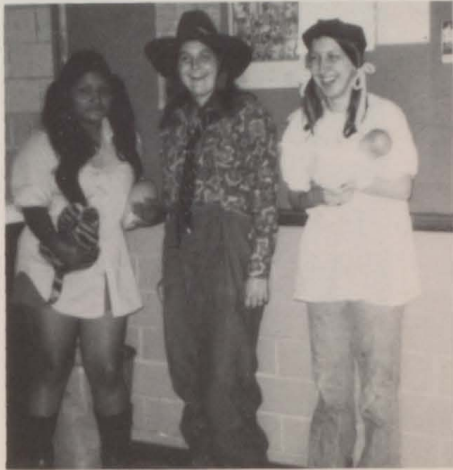
SENIORS
