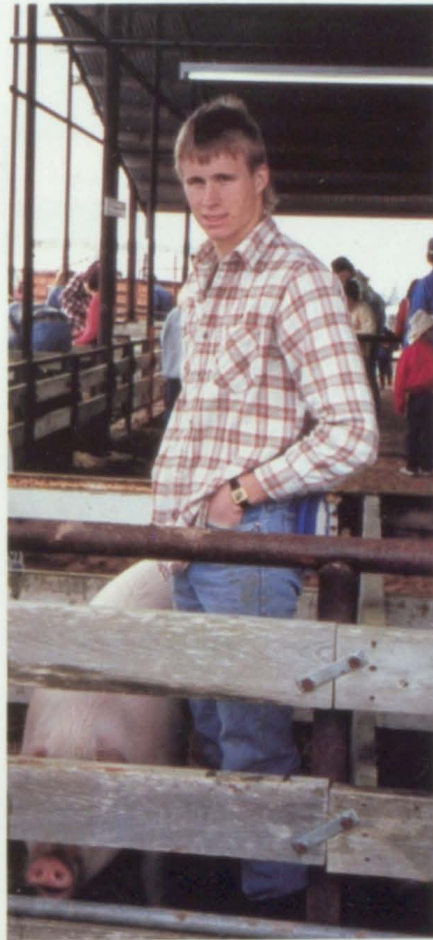

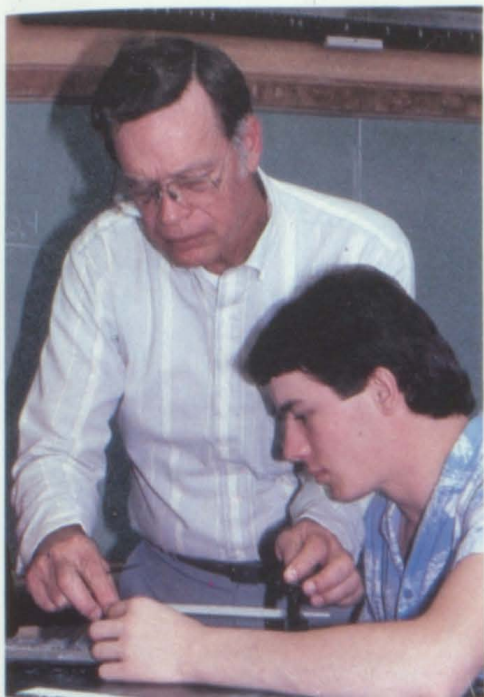

Physics - Trigonometry

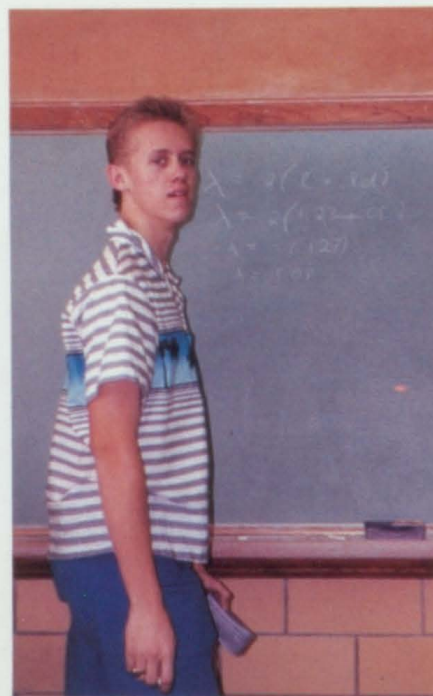

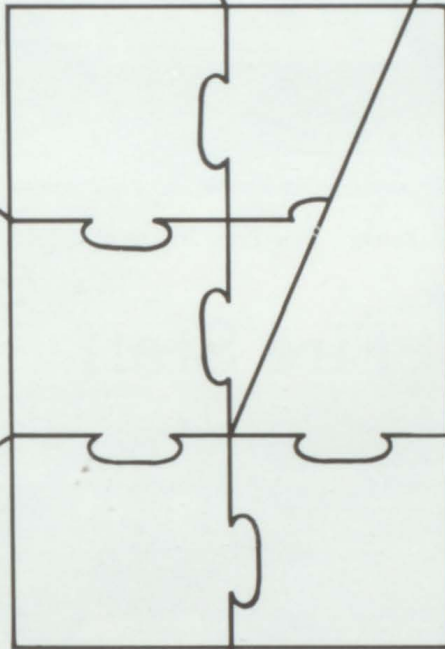

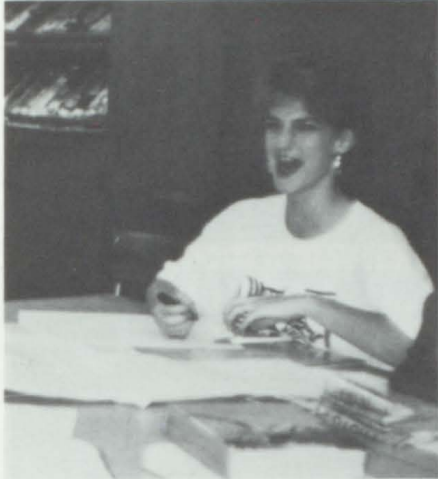

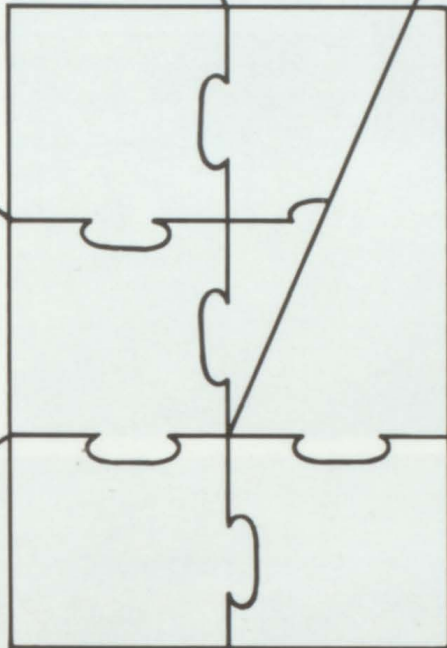

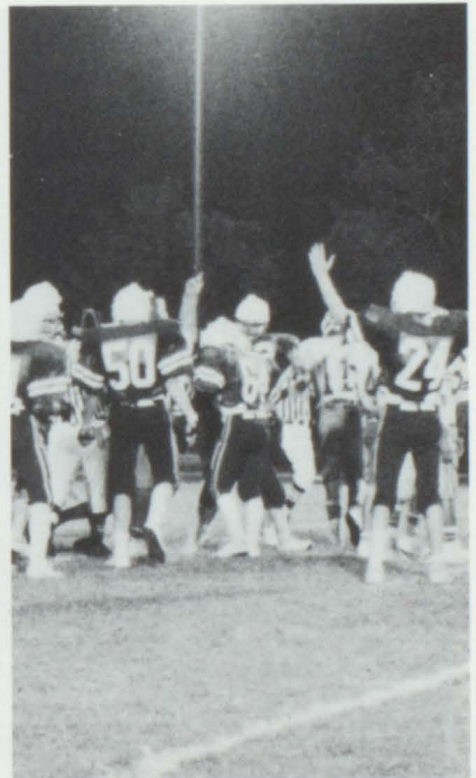

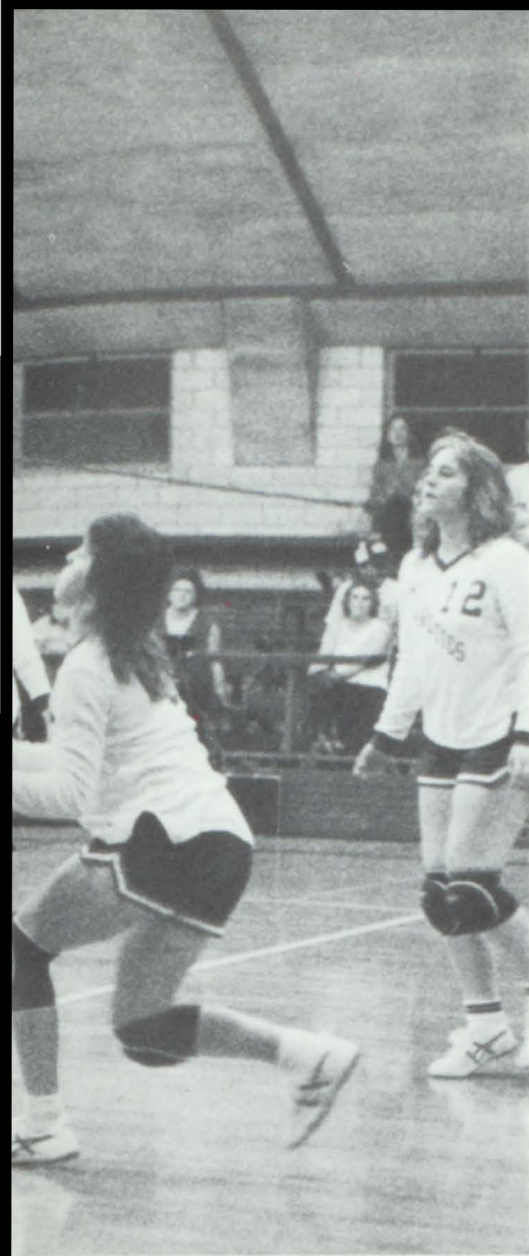
