Congratulations to the Tiger 1988 Area Champs on a great season.






### Home Economics










### Art


In another part of the year, students do block printing. They carve a design, put printing ink on the design and then print the design on paper.

### Health

Health class with Coach Haines is a very open class. Many things are discussed that are very helpful to the students. Good nutrition is one of the topics learned about. Students come to realize they cannot survive on candy bars. Social problems such as drugs, alcohol, teen suicide, and pregnancy are also discussed. Coach Haines points out ways teens can get help with these serious problems and he answers all questions in order to

help the students understand why they may need help. At the end of the year, students learn CPR (Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation) by practicing on a dummy and also learn the Heimlich manueuver, which is very helpful because it could save someone's life.

All of these subjects are covered well by Coach Haines in the hope that students will leave his class having all their questions answered.





The students learn about life (which is what bio means). This includes plant, animal and human life. Heredity and chromosomes are two interesting things you learn concerning human life. Dissecting


the animals is probably the best way to learn about animals and the way their bodies are made. The bug collections teach about the different types of bugs and which ones to stay away from!!

Besides all of this, Ag classes found time to plant and maintain shrubs and flowers by the Ag building. They also planted grass around the Administration building.
















## A Winning Journey




### A Raging Season










# Swinging With a Winning Season









# J.V. Volleyball










