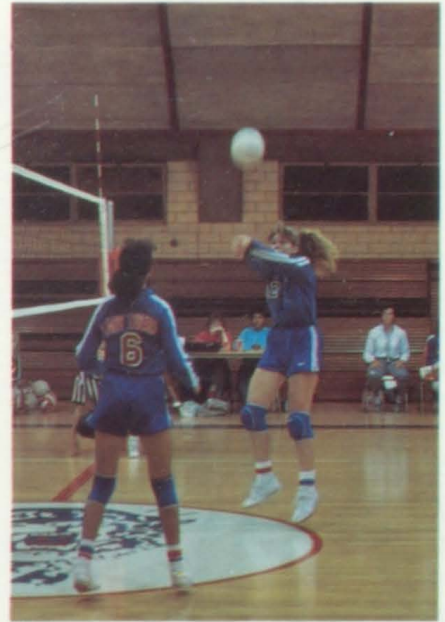

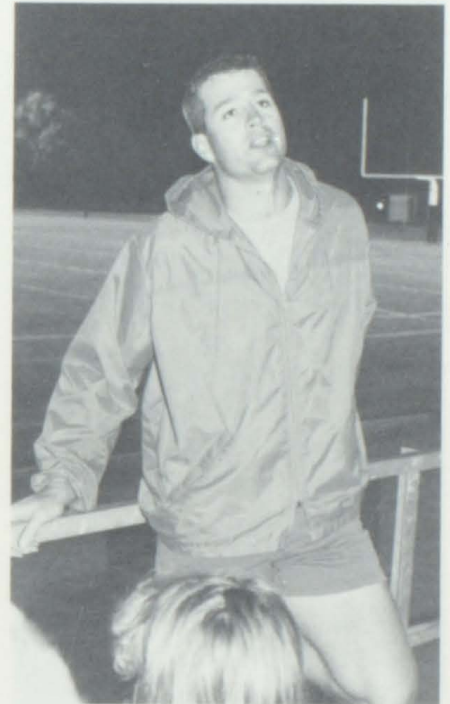

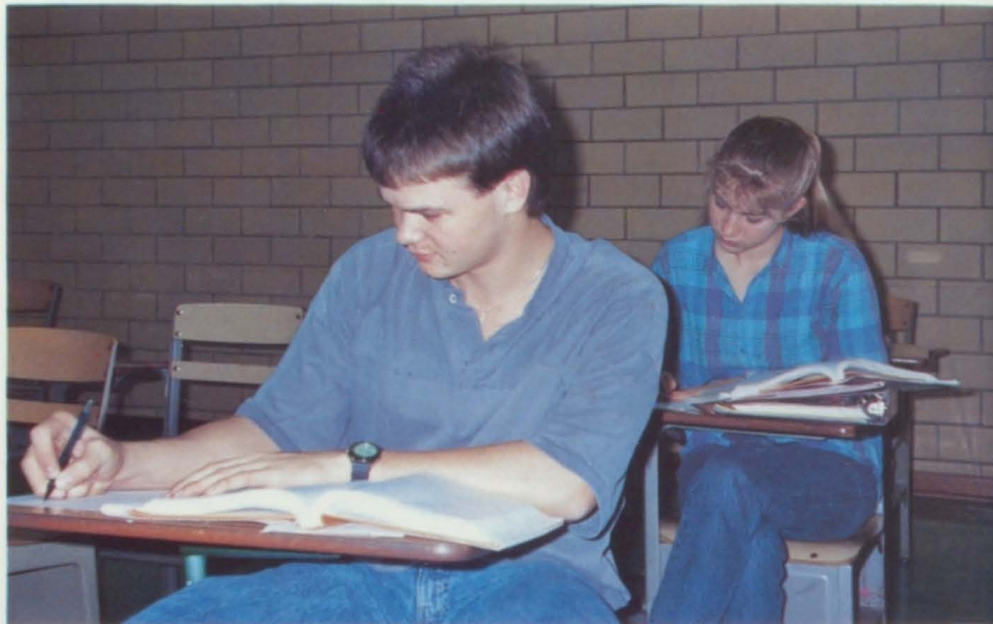

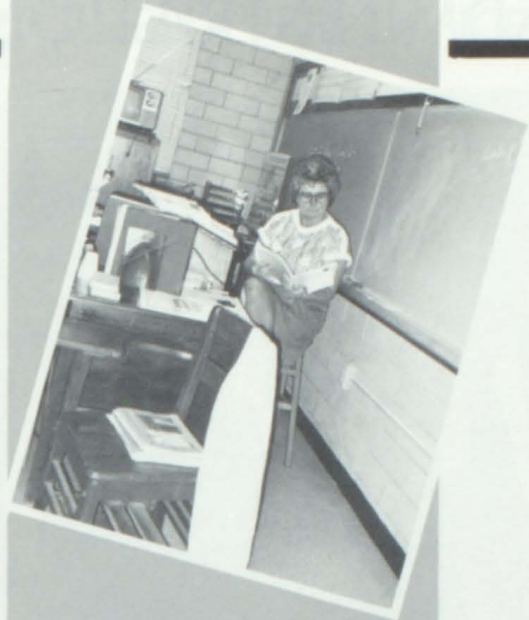

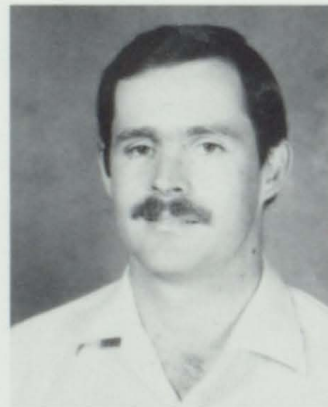

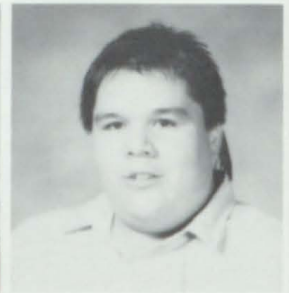

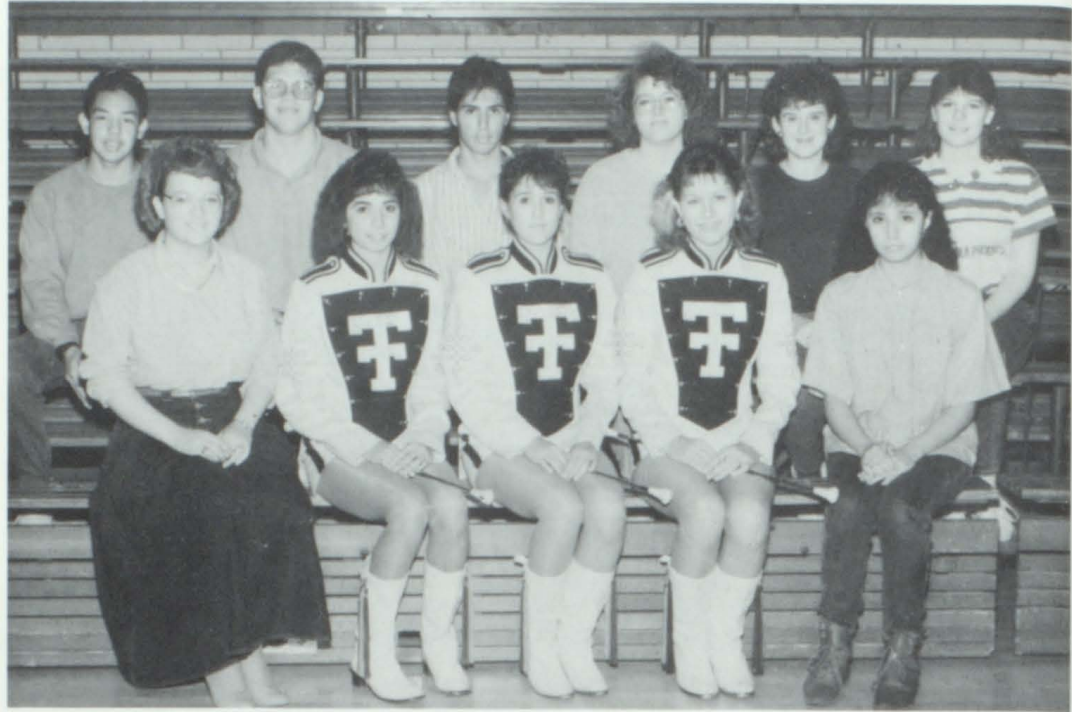
The final performance for the 1988-89 Tiger band was on graduation night when the band played the procession-al, school song and re-cessional.

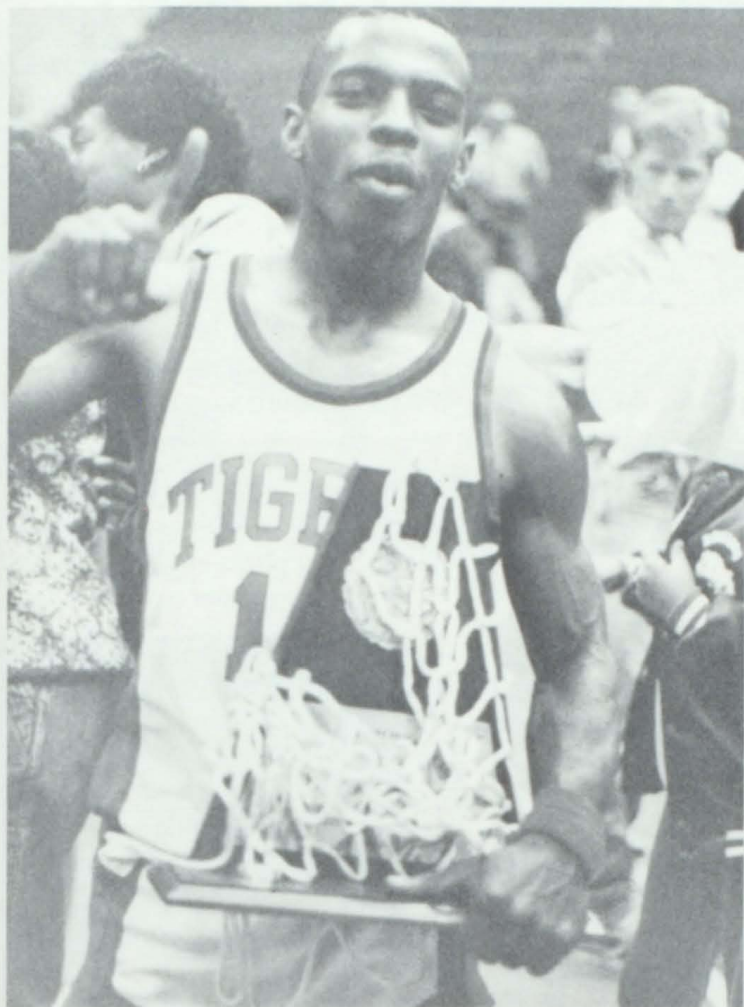

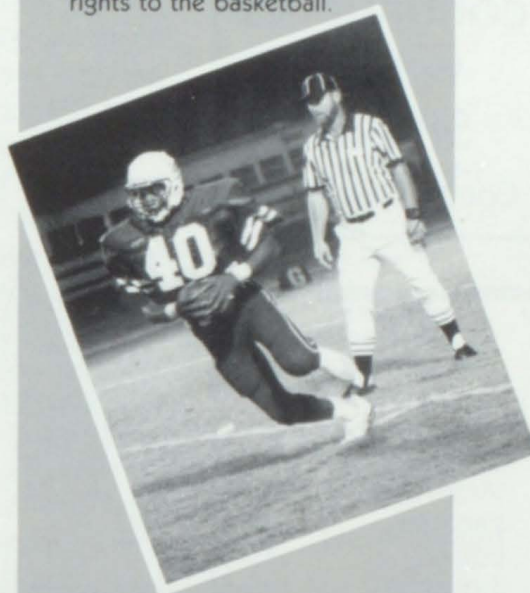

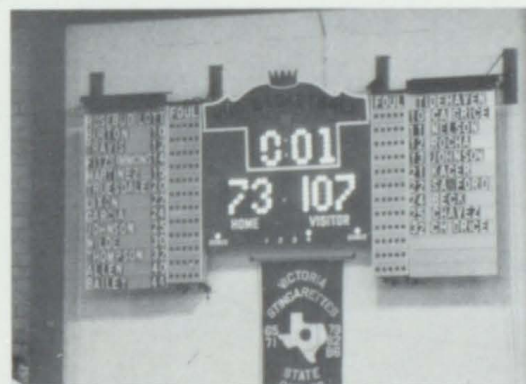
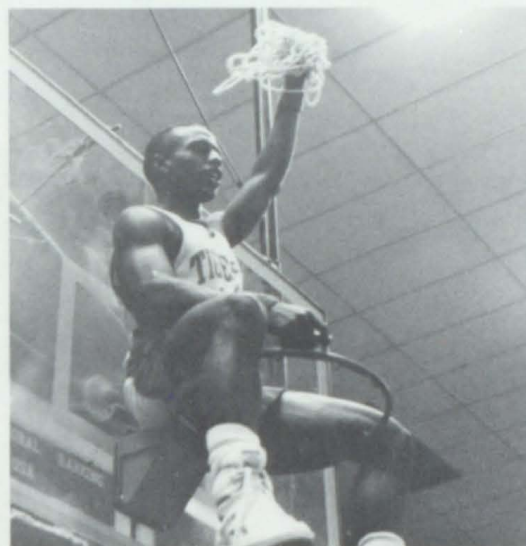
