

1980: Two major eruptions of Mount St. Helens. U.S. boycott of Moscow Olympics. Rubik's Cube. 1981: Prince Charles and Lady Di Married. Ronald Reagan sworn in as 40th President. Ayatullah Khomeini frees American hostages. MTV debuts. 269 Americans die of new disease, AIDS (Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome). PacMan. 1982: Vietnam Veterans Memorial - listing 57,939 Americans killed or missing in action - is dedicated in Washington. E.T. The Extra Terrestrial is top-grossing motion picture in history. 1983: Manuel Noriega grabs power in Panama. The Red Air Force shoots down a Korean Air Lines 747 overflying in Soviet airspace, killing the 269 aboard. M*A*S*H* demobilized. Cabbage Patch kids. 1984: Ronald Reagan reelected. Los Angeles Olympics. U.S. aid banned to Nicaraguan contras. Vanessa Williams dethroned as Miss America for posing nude in Penthouse. Trivial Pursuit. 1985: 5 year drought in Africa triggers massive relief efforts. Mikhail Gorbachev becomes Soviet leader. Titanic wreckage found 73 years after it rammed an iceberg. Willie Nelson & Farm Aid I. New Coke & Coke Classic. Transformer toys from cars to robots and back. 1986: Challenger explosion - seven die when the shuttle hits the ocean. Chernobyl melt-down - 31

die. Revealed that U.S. sold arms to Ayatullah & the profits went to buy guns for Nicaragua's contras. Halley's Comet. ALF (Alien Life Form). Teddy Ruxpin. 1987: Marine Lt. Col. Oliver North acknowledges he was a key Iran-contra player but insists he was following orders. 20 states raise highway speed limit to 65. Spuds MacKenzie. The California Raisins. 1988: Fires char Yellowstone. Drought covers 43 states. Mistaking an Iranian passenger jet for a fighter, U.S. downs it; 290 die. Canadian Ben Johnson stripped of Olympic gold medal for steroid use. Nintendo. 1989: Iron Curtain lifts. Berlin Wall starts to crumble. Japan's Hirohito, 87, dies, ending 62-year reign. George Bush becomes 41st President. Exxon Valdez runs aground in Alaska, spilling 11 million gallons of crude oil. San Francisco earthquake. Batman.





In Texas, the eighties opened with record-breaking heat waves. After that came floods, tornados, ice storms, hurricanes, and hailstorms.

Two Delta jetliners crashed at Dallas-Fort Worth Airport. Tampa and Pasadena experienced chemical plant explosions. The Challenger explosion in 1986 shocked people worldwide, especially those in the NASA community near Houston.

The Houston Astros won a divisional title. Texas Rangers' pitcher, Nolan Ryan, compiled 5000 strikeouts. The Houston Oilers made the NFL playoffs twice while the Dallas Cowboys ended the decade with a new owner and a new head coach.

In politics, there was an emergence of women. Kathy Whitmire is presently in her fifth term as Houston Mayor. San Antonio, Dallas, and El Paso also elected female mayors. Ann Richards was in charge of the state treasury and a main speaker at the 1984 GOP National Convention.

Other news events included the rescue of Jessica McClure from a well in Midland. This episode brought worldwide attention. "Lonesome Dove" was a television mini-series and a Pulitzer Prize for its author, Texan Larry McMurtry.

Executions resumed in Texas in 1982. In 1984, the no-

pass, no-play law was passed, affecting every public school student. 1987 brought Pope John Paul II to Texas on a tour. Shuttle flights resumed in 1988.

As the eighties came to a close, Texans were gearing up for the new decade, in the hopes that things would improve.

As residents of Matagorda County approached the end of the 80s, 1989 made its' mark. Several events changed the county and its inhabitants.

Tragedy struck in April. Gunfire pierced a peaceful Palacios afternoon, leaving Justice of the Peace, T.J. 'Jack' Dooley and his assailant dead. A specific shooting motive was never determined.

In May, Matagorda County purchased the county fairgrounds for \$1.15 million. This was met with disapproval from segments of the county. The commissioners agreed to lease it back to the Fair & Livestock Association for the annual rodeo over the next eight years, for \$5000 per year.

In June, local and Houston Lighting & Power officials "plugged in" the South Texas Nuclear Project. After 16 labor years and \$5 billion over initial projections, STP became a working nuclear plant.

Tidehaven made big marks in 1989. The first mark was by the Tiger basketball team which compiled a 30-6 record on their way to the state basketball finals and ended the season with a 2 point loss to Edgewood, 46-48. Finishing as state runners-up, the Tigers claimed a second straight District 29-2A title. Tidehaven earned its' first football playoff birth since 1981 and a first win over East Bernard

since 1971. Refugio ended the Tigers' year in the bi-district game, 36-13. Also, Tidehaven returned to baseball playing after a 30-year absence, ending with a 2-5 record. Tidehaven was definitely in the news for 1989.

As 1990 rolled around, residents of Matagorda County are looking forward to new challenges. Good luck in the 90s!!












Trivia

Making The Grade



TEAMS

Just when you think that all you have to do to get out of school is pass your classes, the rules of the game change. In 1985, a new hurdle was added to the graduation obstacle course. This hurdle is the TEAMS (Texas Educational Assessment of Minimum Skills) test. Students get plenty of practice on this test which includes math, English, and writing. The TEAMS tests are given in the first, third, fifth, seventh, and ninth grades and the Exit level test is given in the eleventh grade. If a student fails the Exit level test the first time, they have three more chances before graduation. This important test will determine whether or not a student receives a high school diploma.












