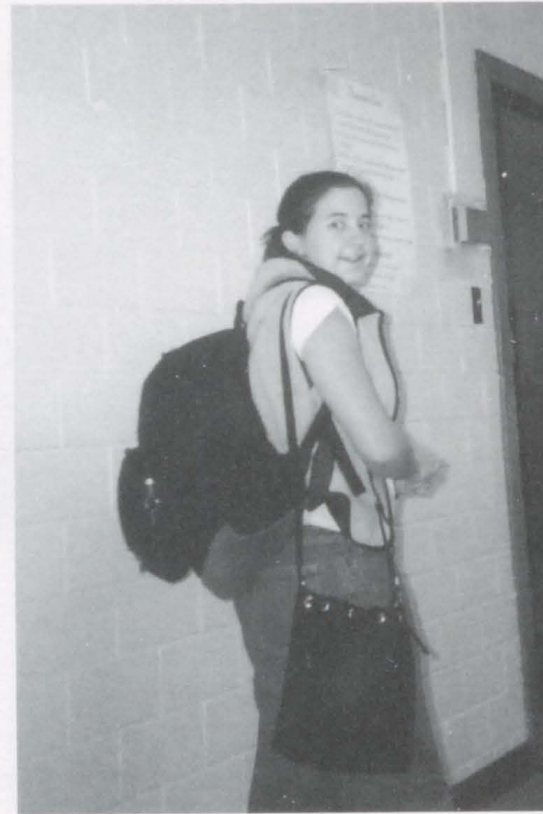

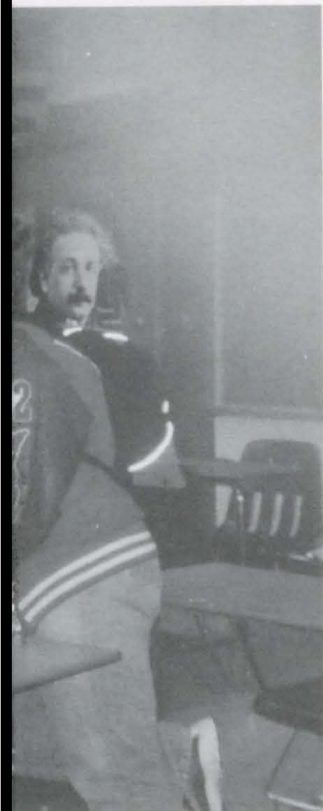
PAIN

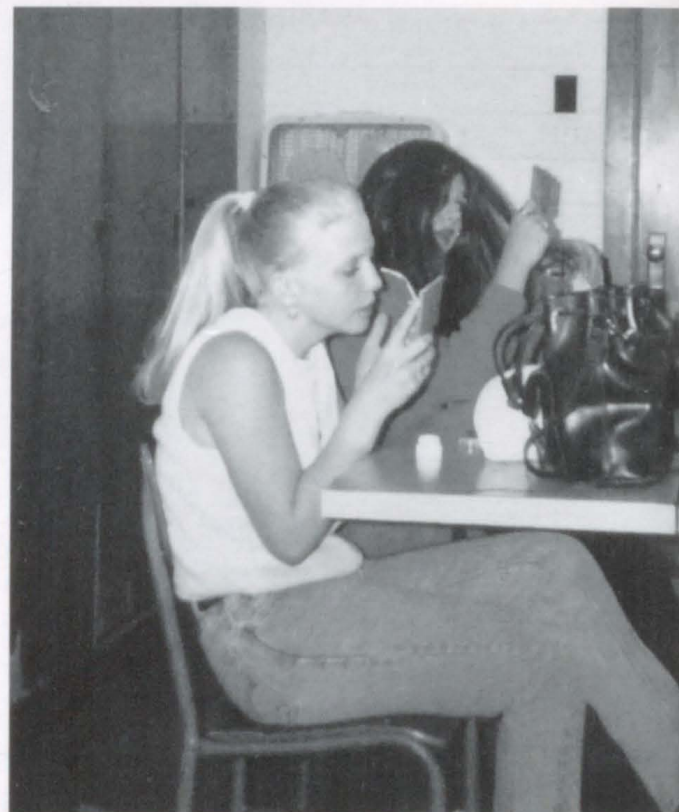

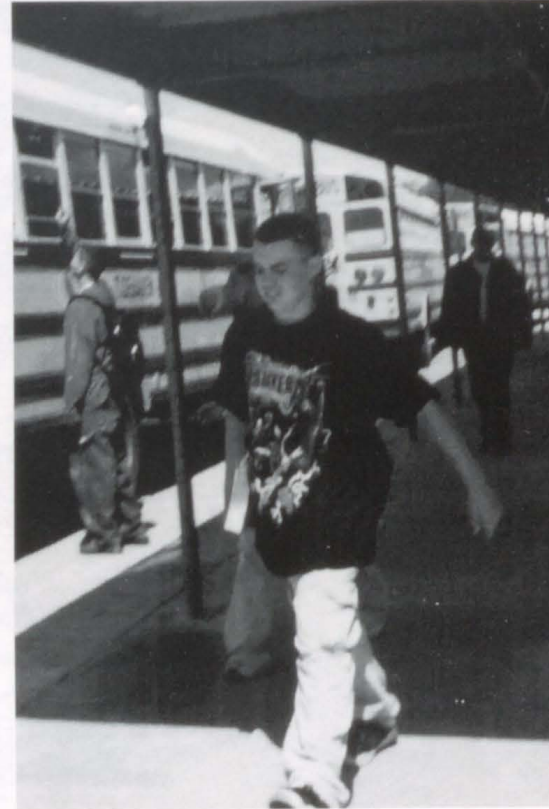

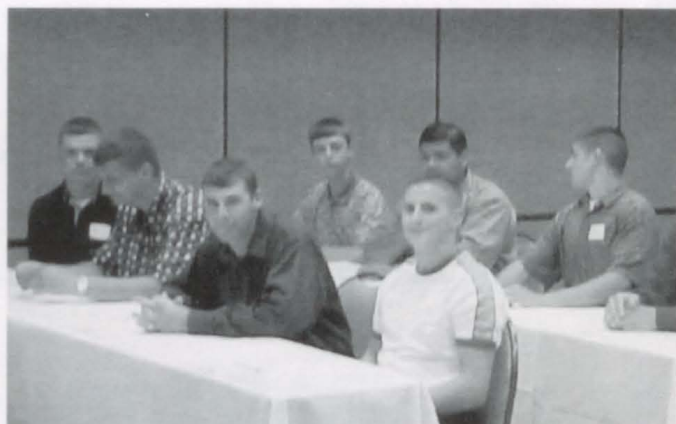


Etiquette 101

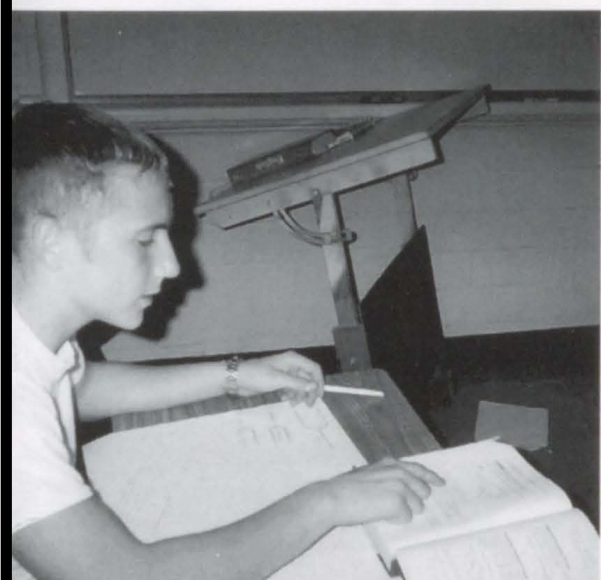
In Freshman English, students read Romeo and Juliet as their novel and as part of the class participation, class members had to recite Romeo's famous balcony scene speech.

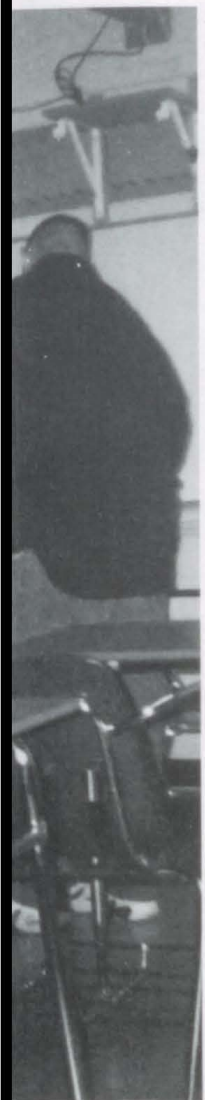

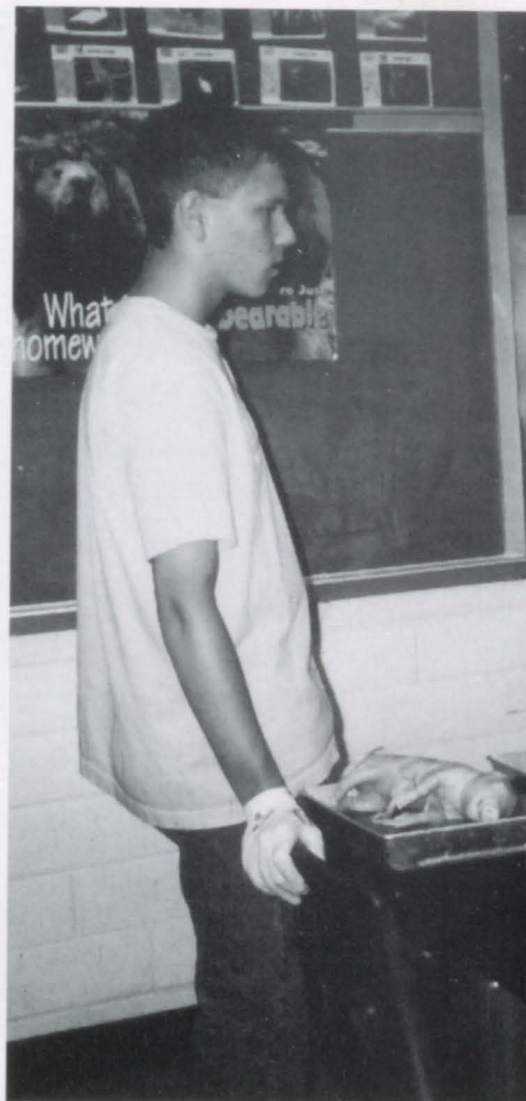

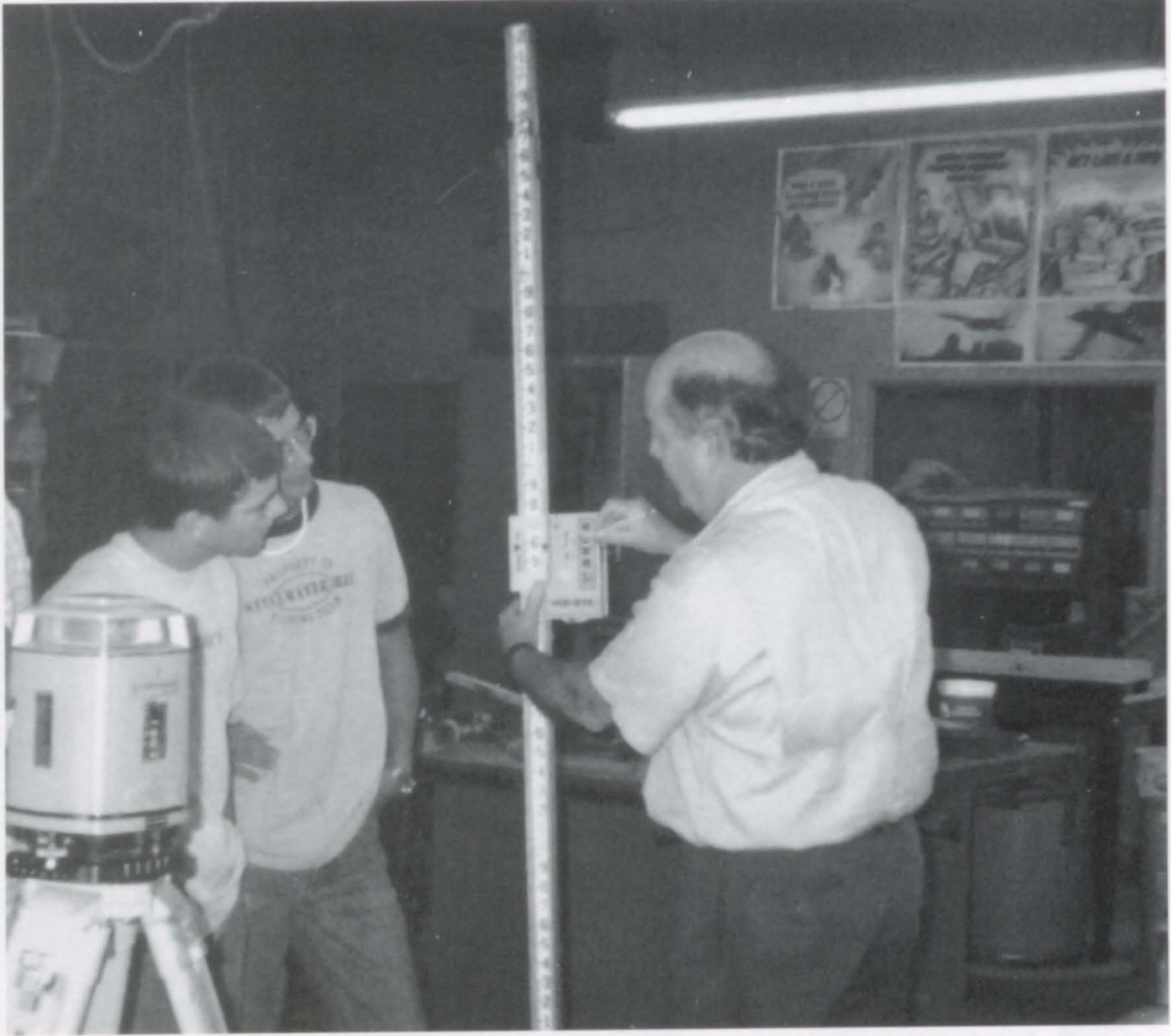
Construction Systems is an interesting and educational class. Each student learns safety around the shop and experiences hands on training dealing with shop machinery and computers. Students choose a project and spend the year learning how to measure, cut and piece together the different parts. This class gives the students the opportunity to take home their knowledge not only mentally but in a finished product that they will always remember. Some individual projects

ranged from picnic tables to gun cabinets to dining room tables. Students also participated in a project to benefit the county. One hundred picnic benches were constructed for the Matagorda County Nature and Birding Center. This project was undertaken by 24 students in Mr. McMillan's classes. Each student contributed approximately twenty hours to the project and the benches were completed in four weeks.

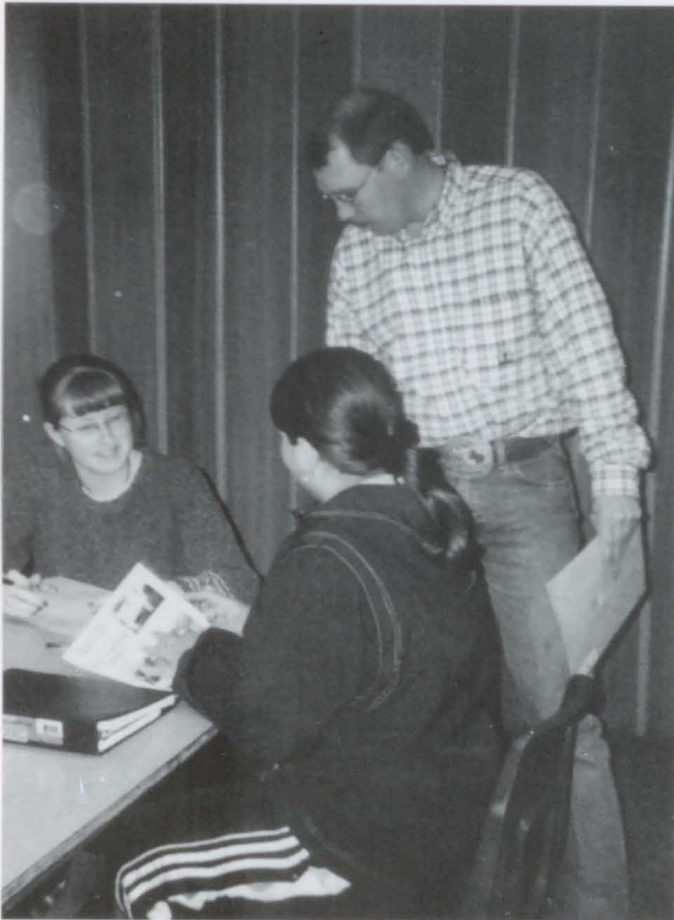

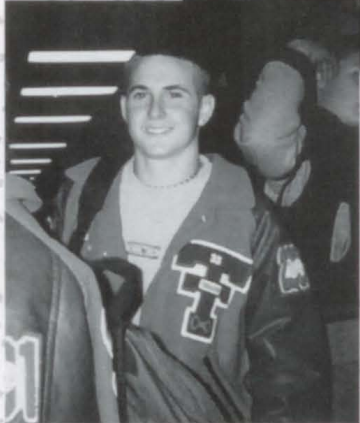

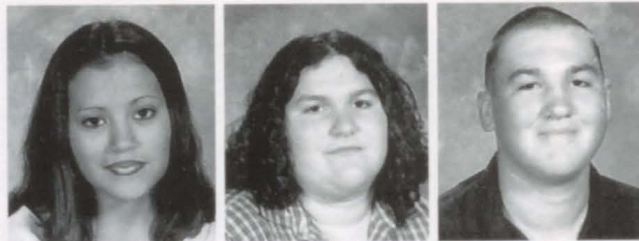

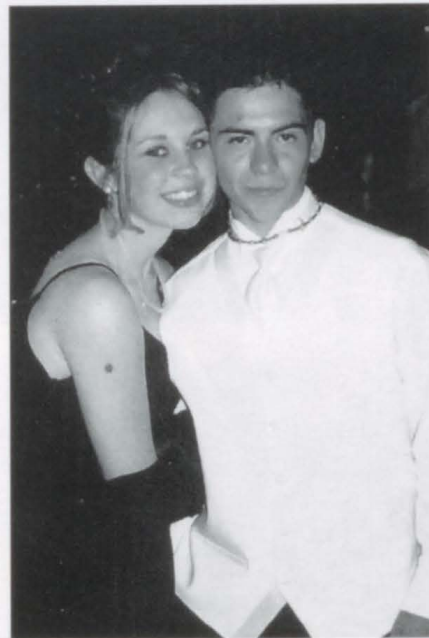

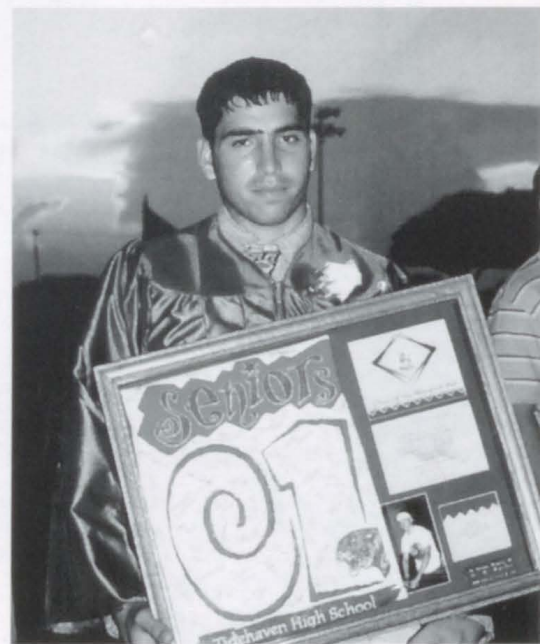

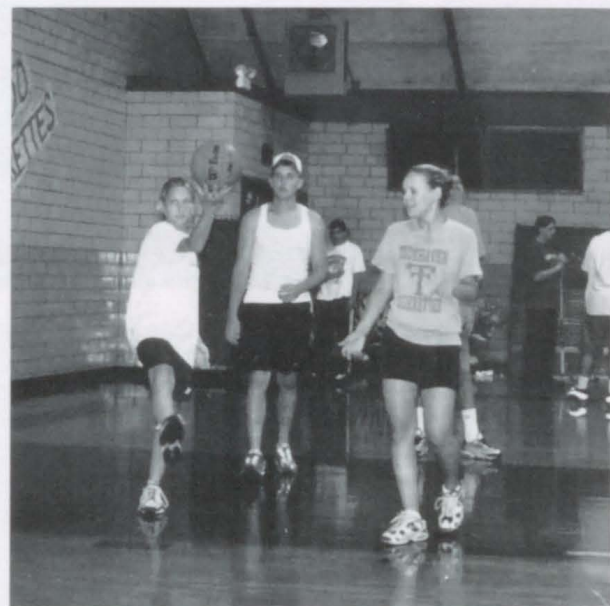

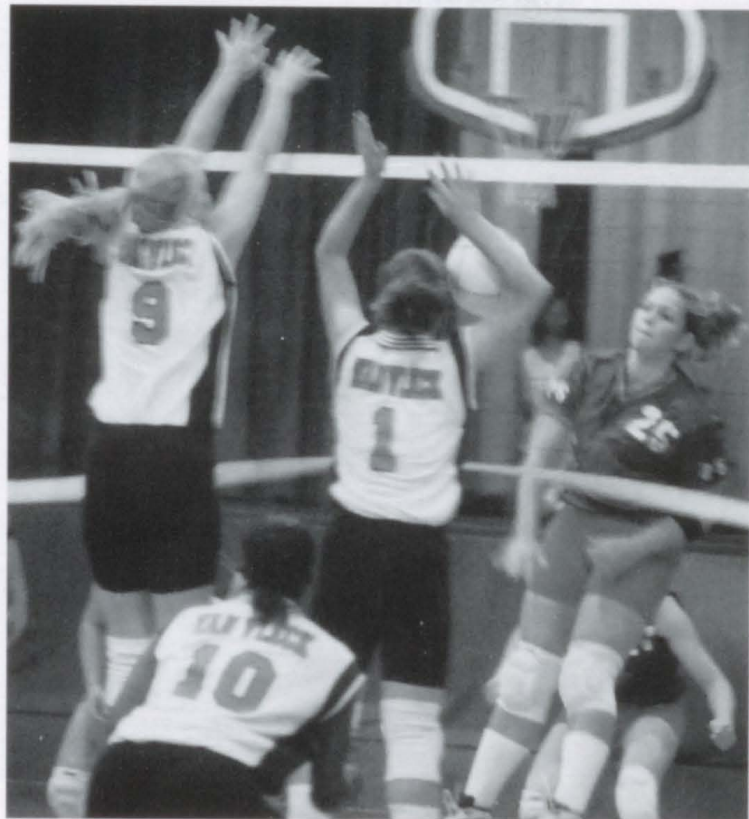

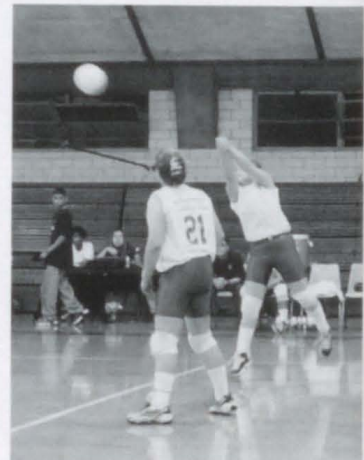


Lacey Shindler thinks to herself, "IN YOUR FACE," when she spikes the ball to the Van Vleck opponent.

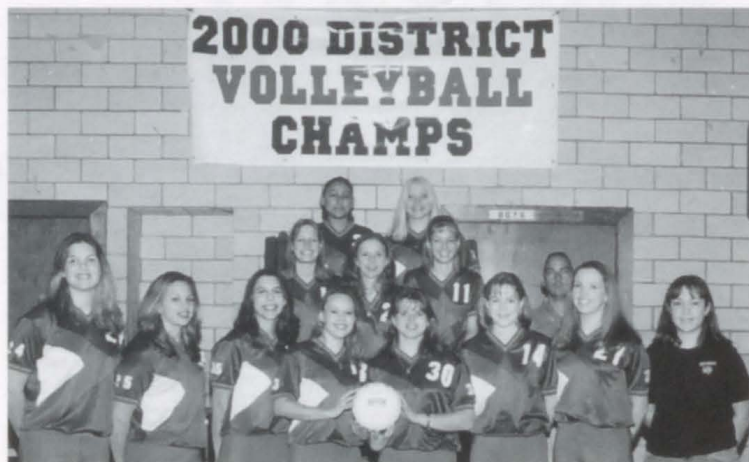

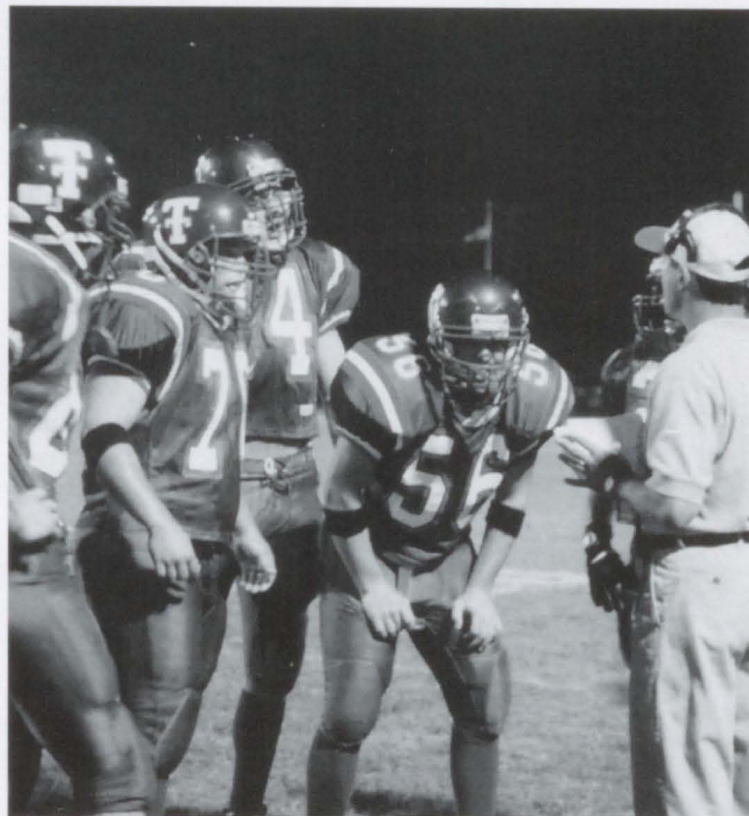

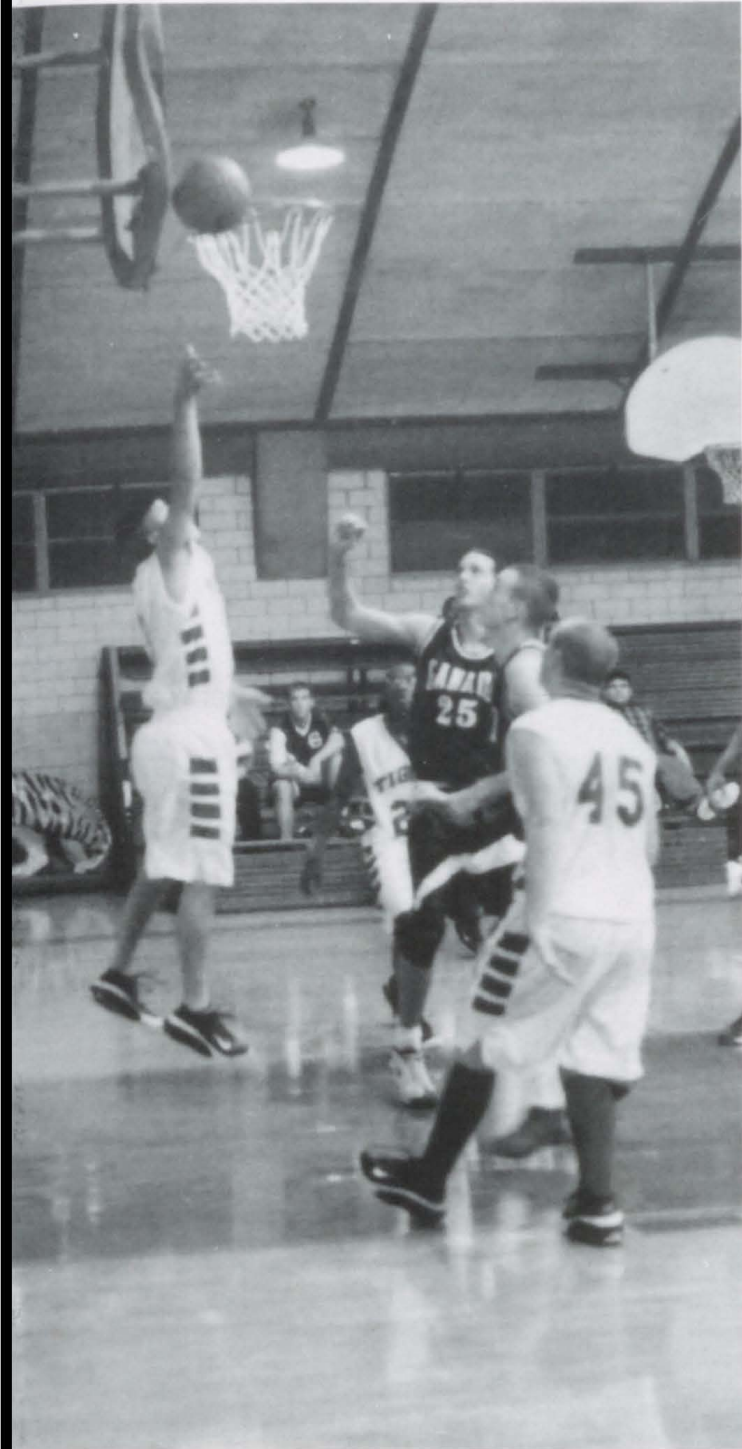

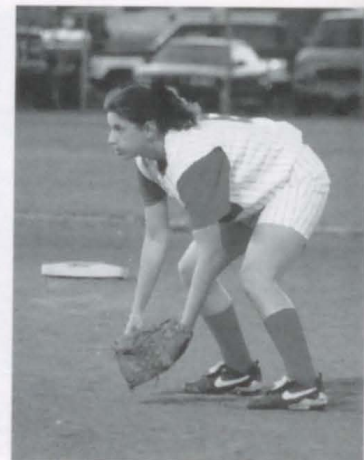

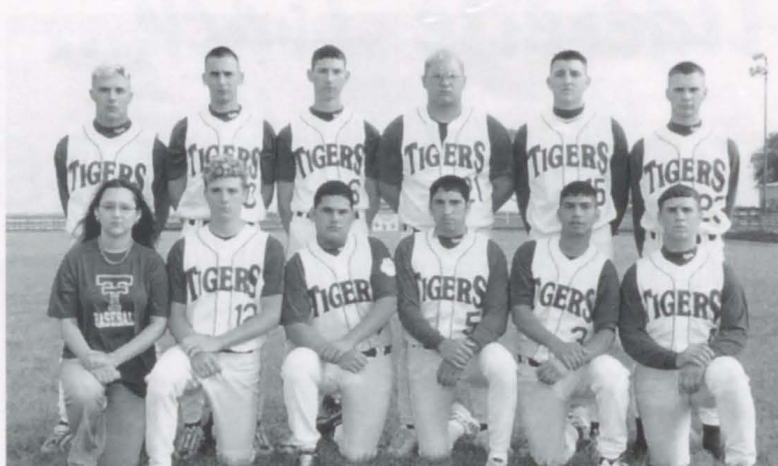

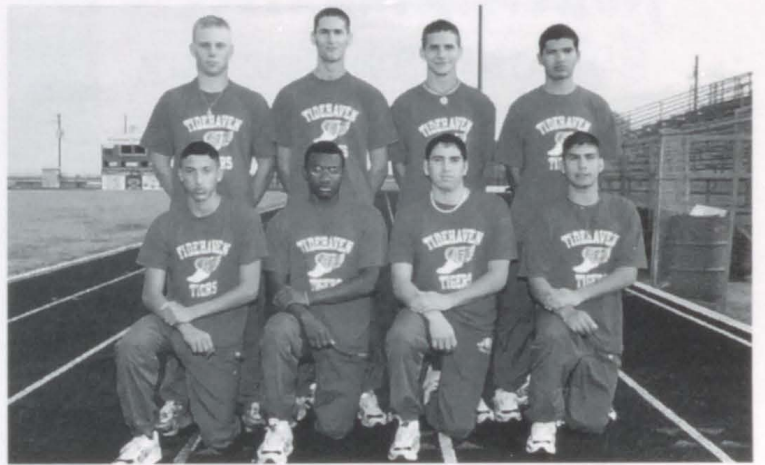

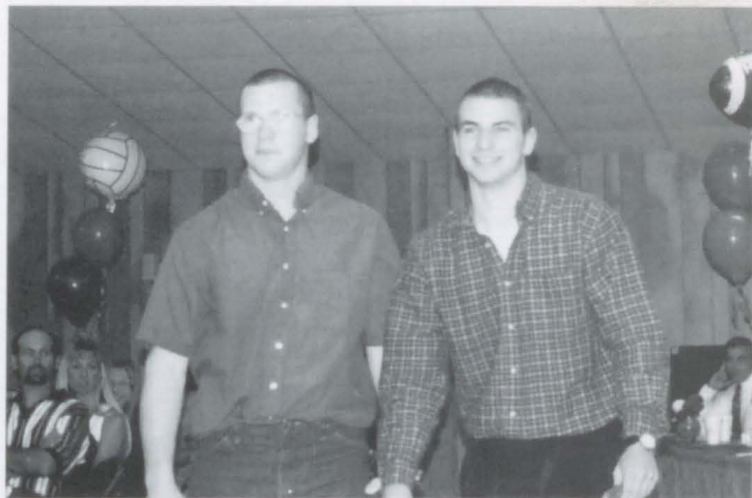

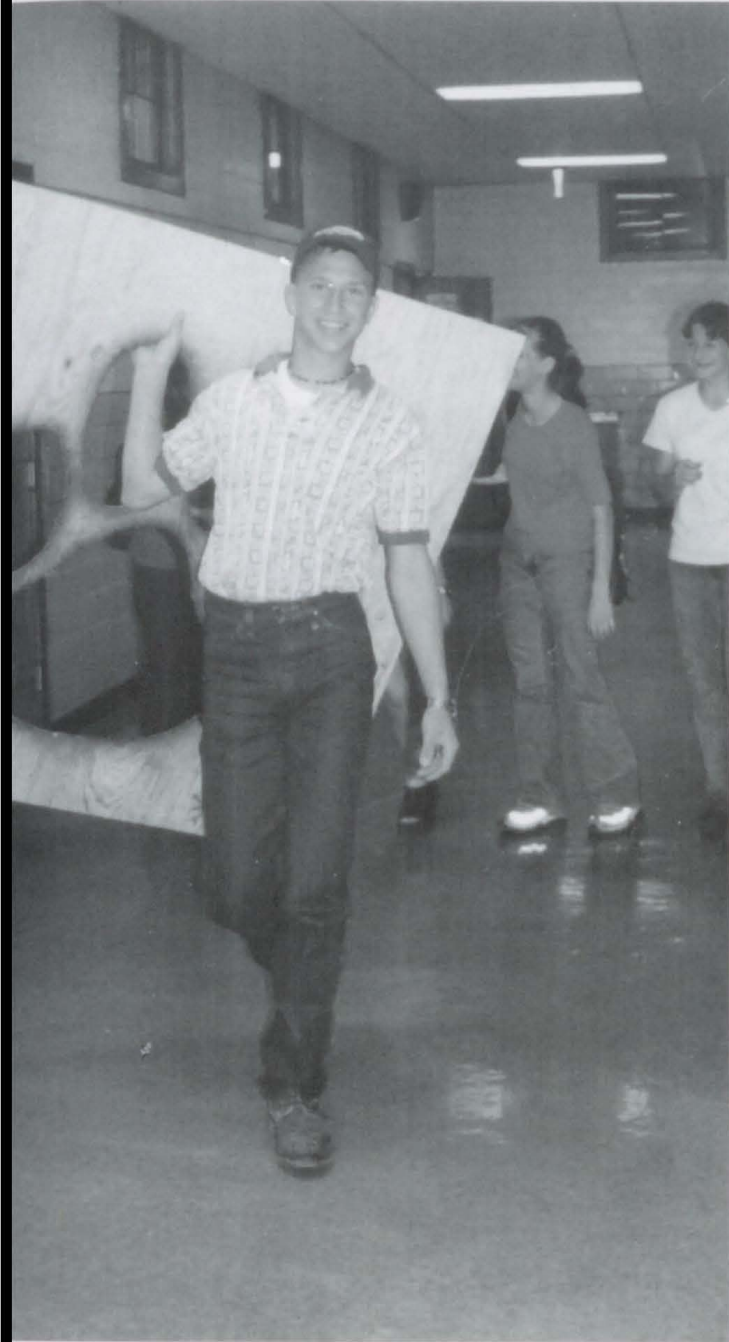

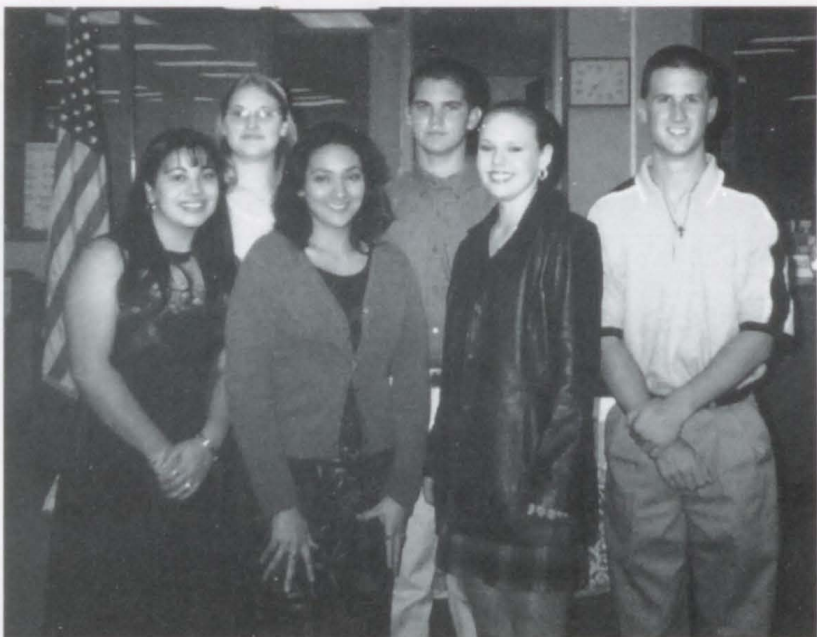
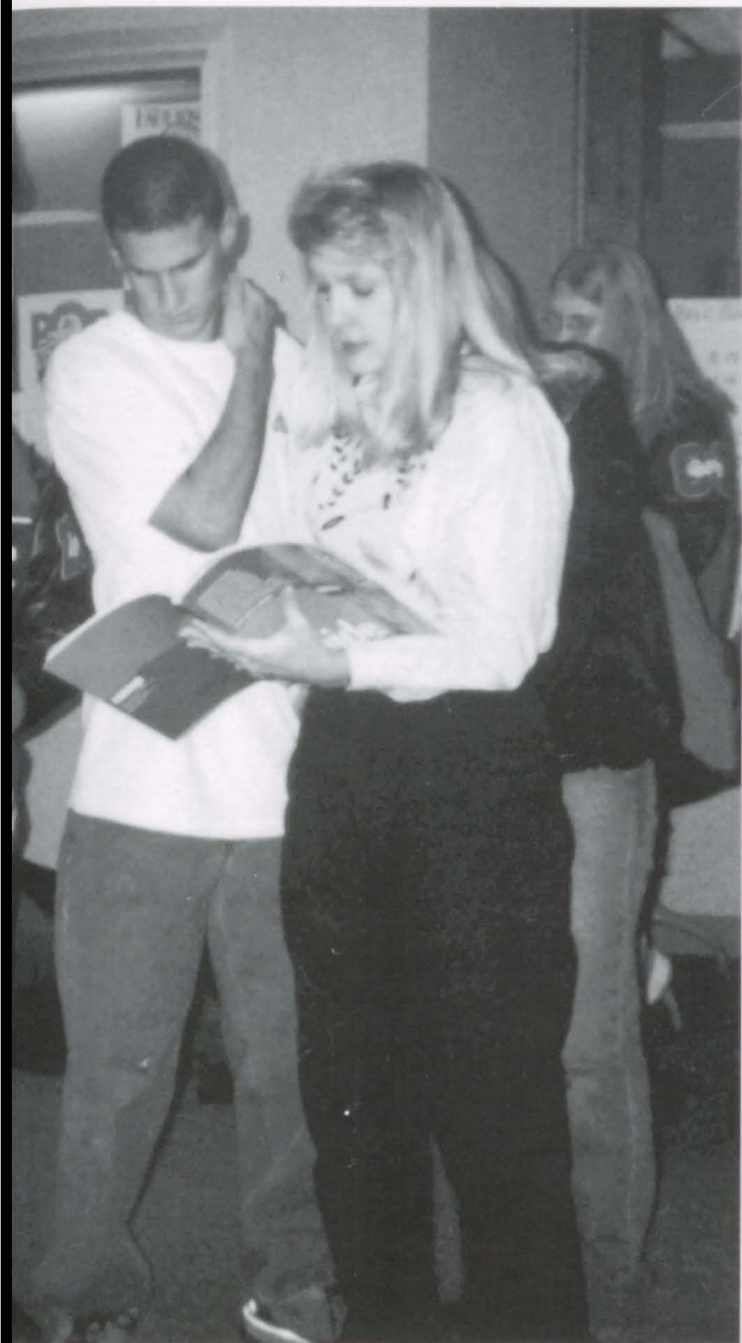

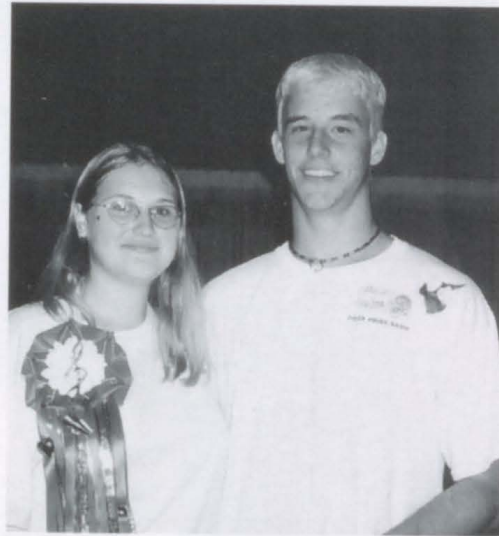

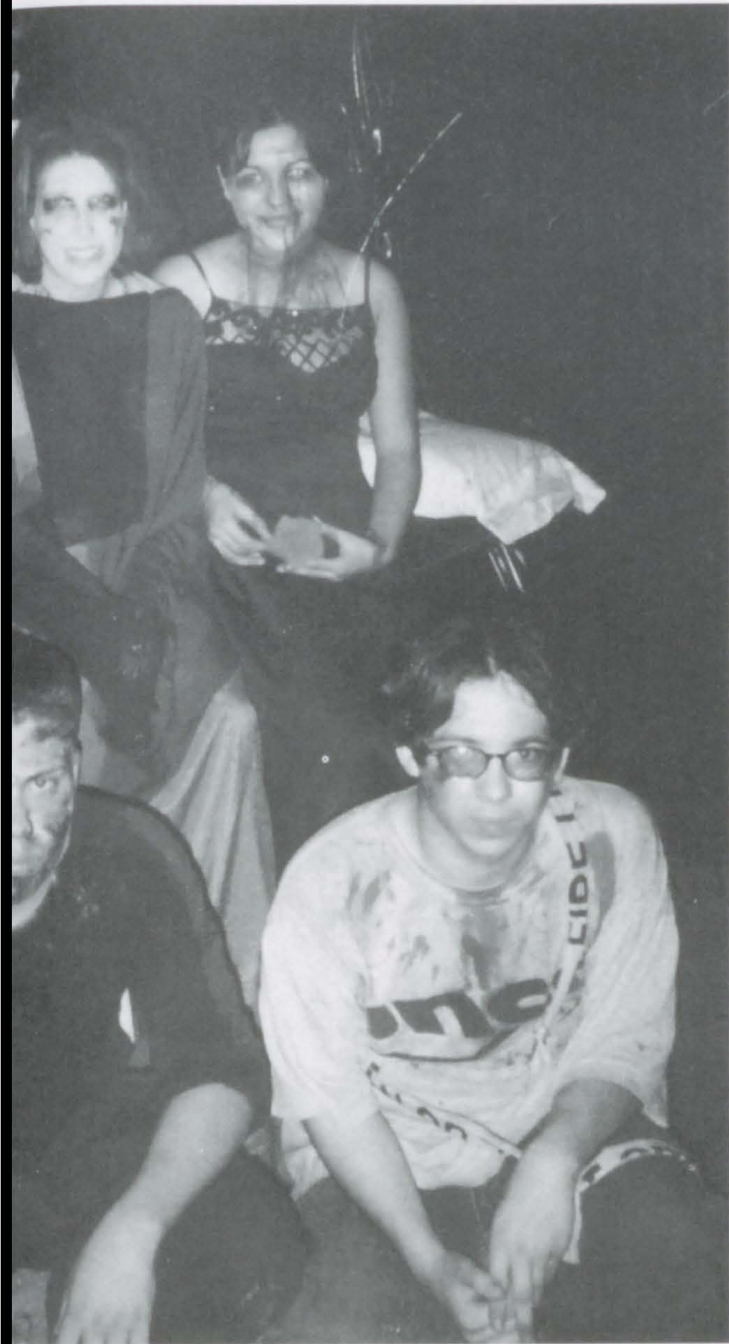

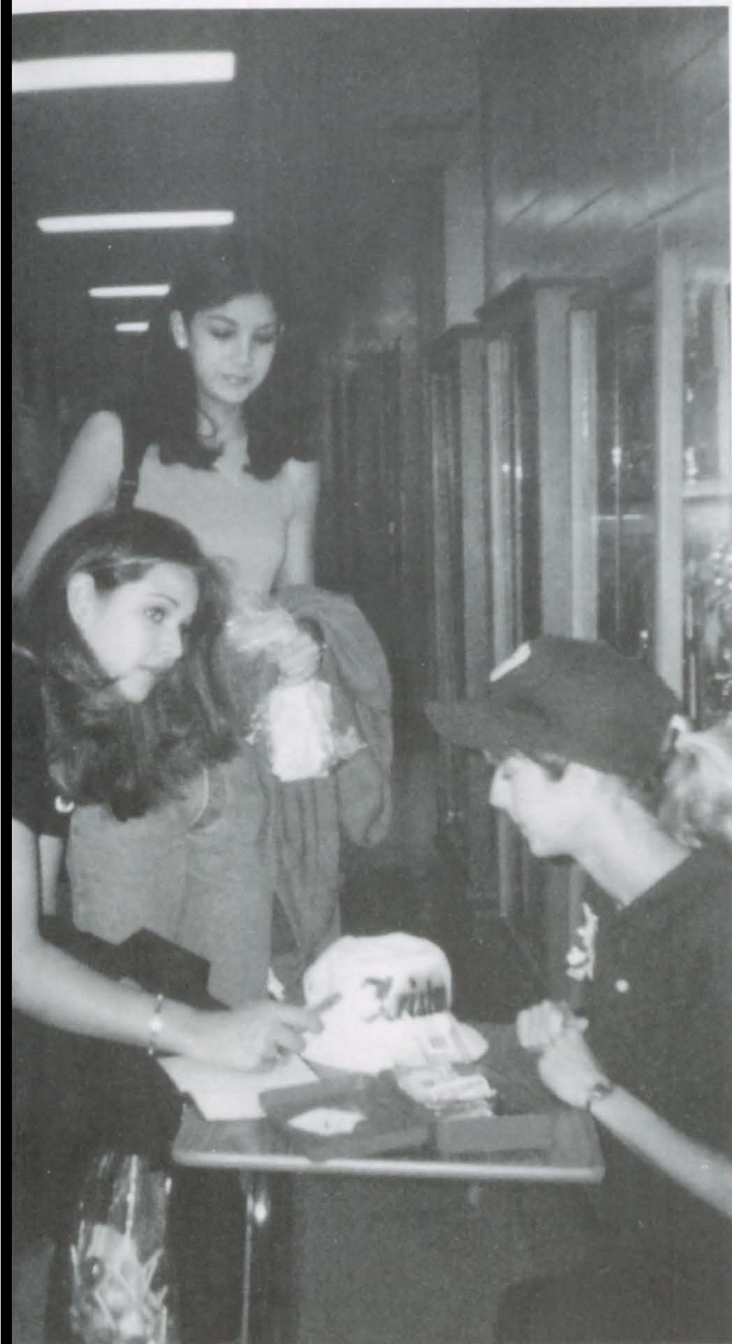

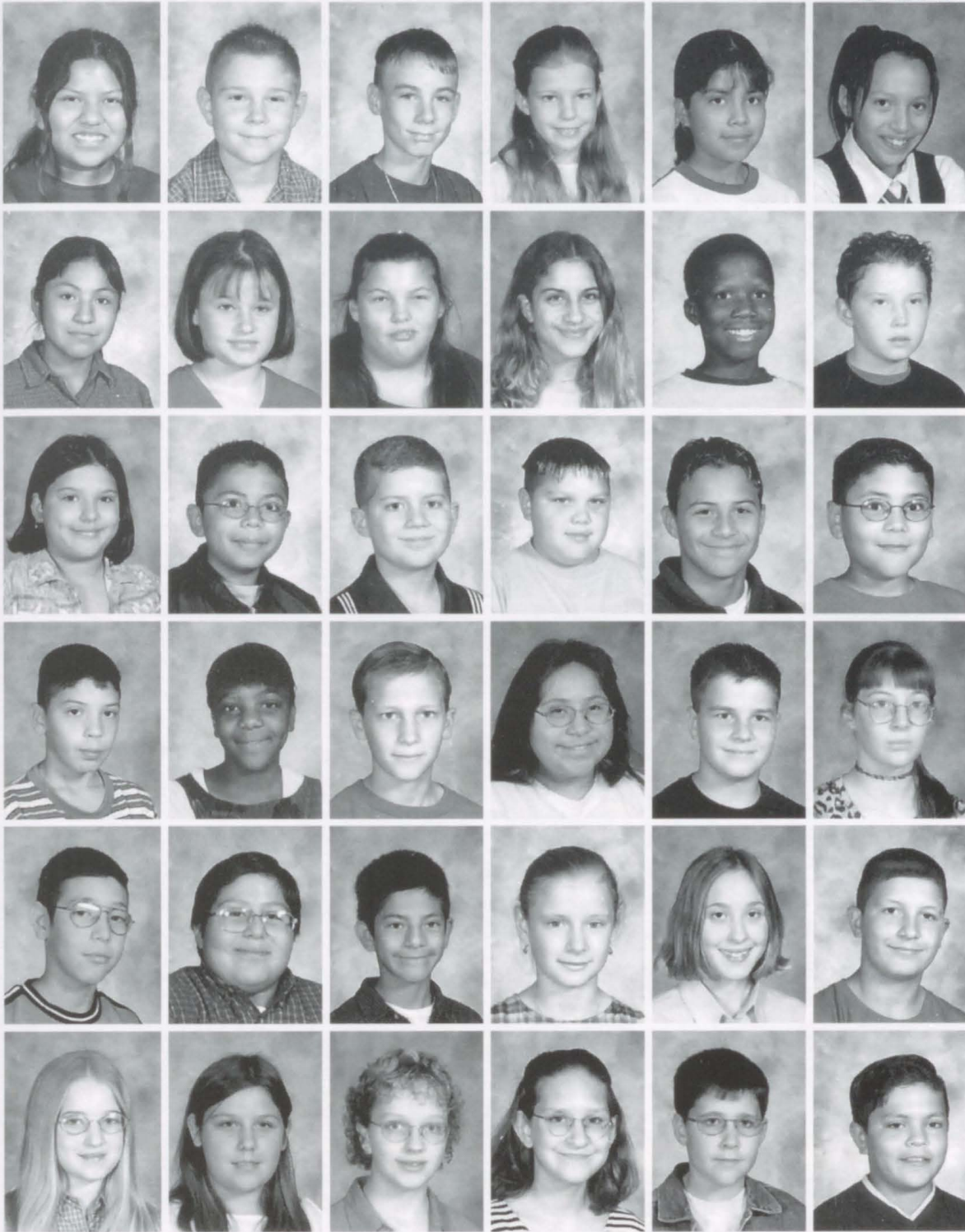

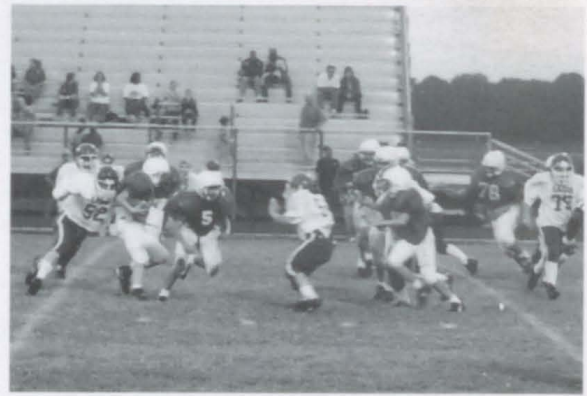

The Student Council and GT Students also made Beta Vases and distributed them to the area nursing homes.

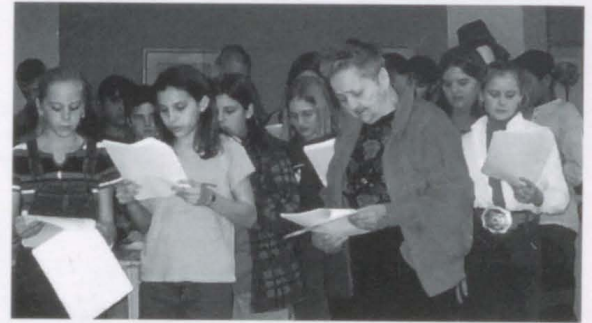

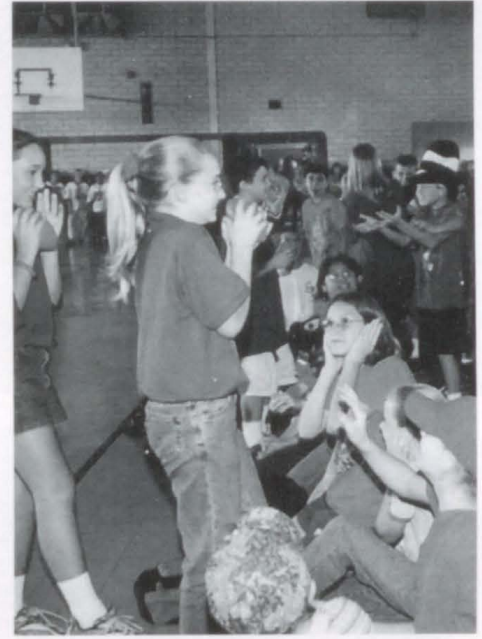

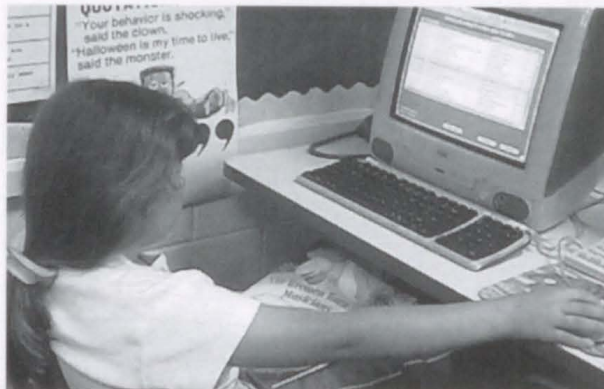

Colophon

The 9 staff members are proud to present the 2001 Tiger. The press run was 200 copies, consisting of 160 pages with one four page color tip-in. The book was printed on 80# enamel paper. The book sold for \$27 presale in November, \$30 presale in March, with an additional \$3 for cover name. At distribution time in August, the books were available for \$36 on a first come basis.

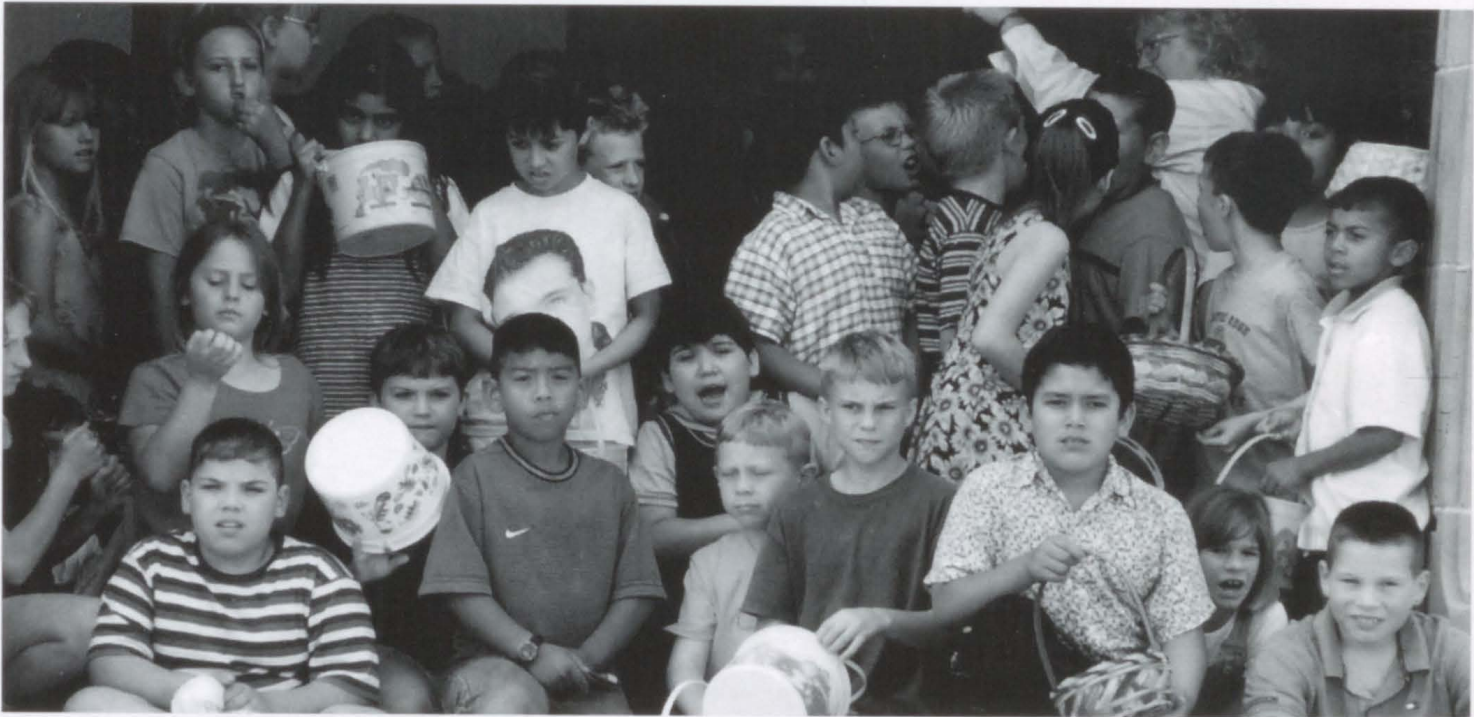
Body copy for the book was Genesis Weidemann, with Genesis Italic used for the captions. Traditional headlines were printed using Cabal Bold, with subheads printed in Muse Script. Panel names were printed using Memento. American Typewriter and Reporter were also used in various point sizes. The book, trimmed to 7 3/4" x 10 1/2", had a standard cover design from Taylor Publishing Company and was printed using Ruby Cut premium foil. Names on the covers were printed in silver foil.

The yearbooks were printed by Taylor Publishing Company of Dallas, at the El Paso plant location. The staff was assisted by customer service representative, Tammy Hollier.

Portraits and group pictures were taken by Inter-State Studios, Neil's Photography, Life Touch and Provine Studios. Candid photos were taken primarily by staff photographers, with some photos provided as a courtesy by others. The yearbook was produced using the Ultravision yearbook computer design program on a PC.

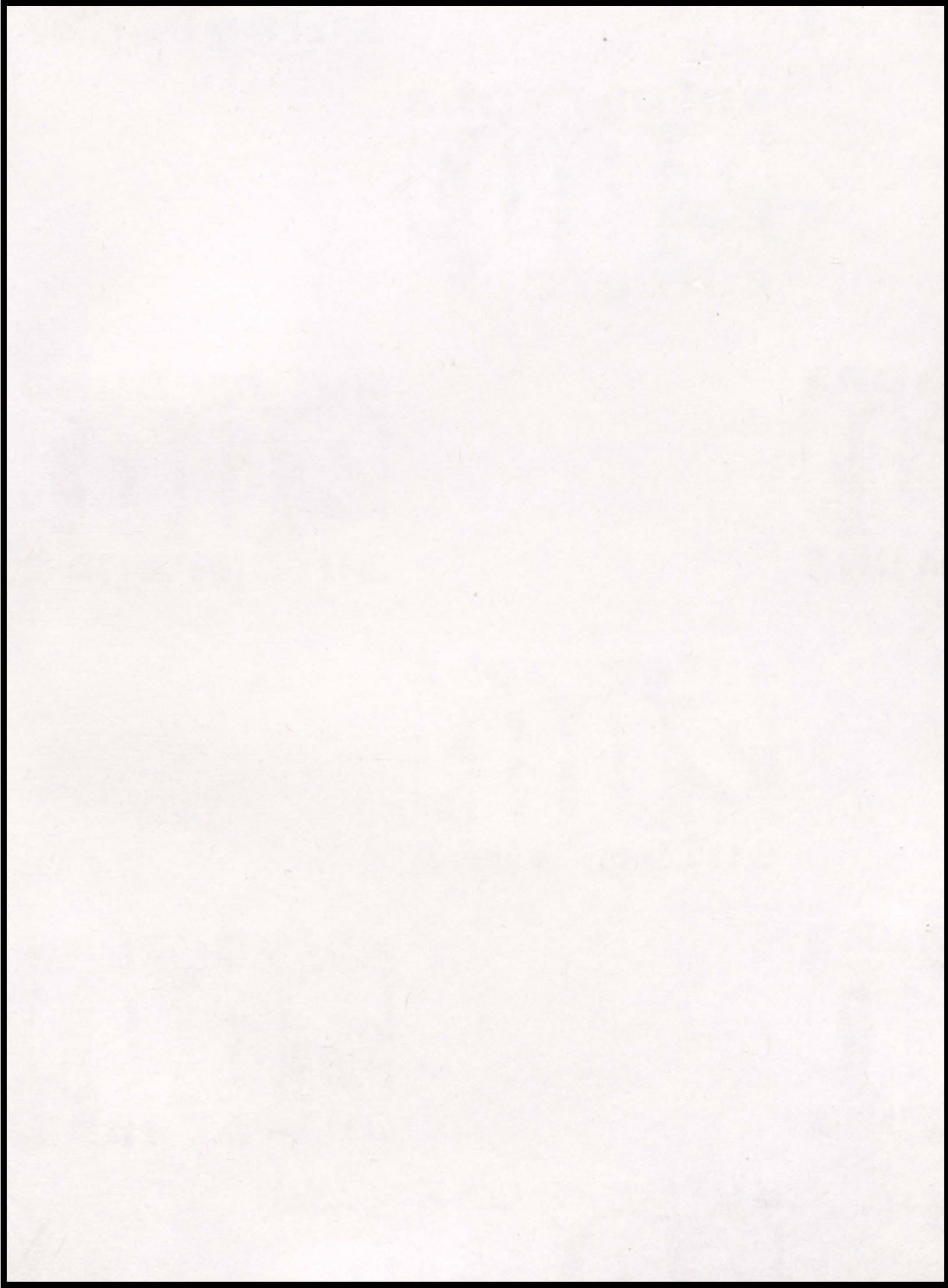
