


"Standing United"



Or. Octillan began his teaching career at Bishop, Texas, where he taught for six years. After Bishop, he moved on to Brazosport,



There are eight students in the Life Skills class. These exceptional students learn the basics of everyday life inside the classroom and then, they take those skills out into the community in order to learn to live independently. The Life Skills students have daily activities that consist of health and hygiene, daily living, housekeeping chores, cooking, math, physical education, reading and writing skills, and recreation and leisure time. Some of the daily housekeeping chores include washing, drying and storing dishes, sweeping and mopping the classroom floors, dusting the furniture and vacuuming the

carpet. The students also get experience with washing, drying and folding towels, dishcloths, and aprons for both the High School and the Intermediate

cafeterias. This is done on a daily basis also. The revenue that the students earn from doing this laundry is used to fund their field trips.

Class members have taken

several field trips. Some places they have toured are the Victoria Zoo, the Palacios Marine Center and the Bay City Post Office. Students have also been to Sam's, Target, and WalMart in Victoria and H.E.B. in Bay City. On these trips, the students buy supplies for their class projects. To earn extra spending money, class members sell homemade cookies, breakfast tacos, chips and pickles to the other students at Tidehaven.

In construction systems and technology systems, the class learned the proper uses of tools and the principles of tool safety. Students learn how to use their hands to make wooden projects, while at the same time they grow more responsible and independent in their use of the machinery. Going into the course, students start out creating small objects like name plaques but later on become experienced enough with the machinery to create shelves, chairs, and tables.

Construction systems students are also taught mass production. This year, that came in the form of producing picnic tables for the Matagorda County Birding Center. The students had to work as a team and had a different job for each day. At the end of the project, students

had to promote two people on the job and fire two people that were not working towards the goal. Along with the firing and hiring, students had to justify their reasons for the promotions and releases from the job.

Engineering graphics, commonly known as drafting, is a hands-on course dealing with the basic uses of drafting instruments and tools, mechanical drawing, and even architectural designs. A student taking the course can draw anything from a floor plan to blueprints, all using complicated measurements and designs. One element of this course is having to mentally transform a 3-D object into 2-D that can be placed on paper. This requires tremendous visualization, interpretation and application on the part of the student.

At Tidehaven, Spanish is a language that can be used every day. Many students live in homes where Spanish is the main language spoken. So, for this reason alone, Spanish is a course many students should choose to take.

With a new Spanish instructor this year, students were exposed to many different aspects of Mexican culture and customs. One of the customs that students learned about are pinatas. First, they learned the history of pinatas and then, each student was able to make an individual pinata. This was two weeks of mess, but in the end, there were many beautiful

pinatas. Then, in May, the students learned the history behind El Cinco de Mayo and to celebrate this significant date, broke a pinata filled with candy.

For Christmas, students learned about the Posadas. They also learned about the most common foods in the Mexican household during this holiday season and celebrated

The class members were able to try two different recipes with specific instructions on how to make the tortillas. The first day was a little rough with some smoke and some burned tortillas as the outcome. However, the second day was great, with the students enjoying making the dough, rolling out the tortillas, cooking and, of course, eating them with their favorite dishes.



There is more to Family and Consumer Sciences than just cooking and sewing. But, as one can seefrom the pictures son these two pages, that is what the students most enjoy. In Personal and Family Development, a one year course, students get to cook and sew and also cover other topics, such as personal development, family relationships and consumerism. For the cooking portion of the class, students were able to prepare dishes that included fruits. vegetables, meats, milk and cheese. They were also able to choose recipes, to their tastes, to prepare in class.

In the sewing section,

students were able to choose their own construction projects. Projects ranged from pillows and stuffed animals to duffle bags, shirts and shorts. The

With a wide range of courses to choose from, Agriculture Science students have many different opportunities for learning. For this school year, the Plant and Soil Science students, along with the Landscaping students, planted and maintained a garden located behind the Agriculture Sciences building. Students were responsible for rows in the garden. The rows of plants had to be kept clean, watered and fertilized. If there were any insect problems, it was the responsibility of the students to identify the insects and come up with the remedy for the problem. Some of the vegetable items planted in the

garden included sweet com, tomatoes, cucumbers, squash, green beans and peppers. Fruits planted included cantaloupe and watermelon.


Another course offered to the students is Introduction to Agriculture Mechanics. In this course, students are exposed to carpentry work and welding. Members of the class have the

opportunity to make individual projects, using the skills they learn in the course. Projects ranged from bookcases and hanging baskets for plants to ammunition boxes. Welding round hay bale rings was the project undertaken by the entire class. The students had to bend the pipes used for the bale rings before welding them together and finishing with paint. Working on small engines was also part of the class instruction. Students were given small engines such as irrigation pumps and tillers to work on. They first had to figure out the problem and then repair the engine. Through these activities, students gain valuable knowledge.





Students in the Art classes were offered a variety of projects to experiment with during the school year. After learning the basic techniques of drawing, such as sketching and shadowing, class members were given ample time to experiment with many types of paints, including acrylics and oils. Surfaces the students painted on included paper, canvas, wood, and the bricks in the hallway of the Art room.

Craft projects were another part of the Art classes this year. One of the first items to be made were pillows. The students had to handsew the front and back of the pillow together,

stuff the pillow and then, sew the pillow closed. For many students, this was the first time for using a needle and sewing. Another item that used sewing



techniques was making a woven potholder. Students used a loom to produce a potholder out of yam loops.

Using socks, seed and dirt, students made 'sock heads.'

The socks were filled with dirt and seed, then watered and were hung by the windows in the room. After several days, the seed would sprout, the sock would be trimmed and the student could then paint a picture on the sock to resemble a face.

Using lightbulbs, students were taught how to make maracas. The lightbulbs were covered with plaster of Paris, allowed to dry and then painted with oil paints in a design of the student's liking. After completely drying, the student would hit the lightbulb against the wall several time to break the glass inside, cause the noise associated with maracas.




Graduation















Power Lifting... Pushing for Power

names, and putting everything together in an interesting and representable manner.











Reaching Goals





Club members have become well known for their drama presentations and


the annual Spook House held at the Blessing Fire Department each November. This years' Spook House, which had the theme of 'Horror Movies', was a huge success.









With the passage of Texas Education Code 28.0251, a school district may now issue a high school diploma to veterans who were honorably discharged members of the armed forces of the United States, scheduled to graduate from high school after 1940 and before 1951, and left high school before graduation to serve in World War II.

While attending Blessing High School, A.C. Herreth, Jr. volunteered for service and was inducted on the second of January, 1945. He served in the Asiatic-Pacific Campaign during World War II and received his honorable discharge from the army on November 15, 1946. Because of his service, A.C. was not able to graduate with his classmates in 1945 but was able to finally receive his diploma at this year's graduation exercises. This was a special moment for A.C., his family and friends, the class of 2002 and everyone attending.

Colophon: a note in a book giving facts about its production

The Tiger yearbook staff members who include Stephanie Bigelow, Hannah Brown, Kaci McGuire, and Veronica Picon are proud to present the 2002 Tiger. The press run was 150 copies, consisting of 160 pages with one four page color tip-in. The book was printed on 80# enamel paper. The book sold for \$27 presale in November, \$30 presale in March, with an addition \$3 for cover name. At distribution time in August, the books were available for \$36 on a first come basis.

Body copy for the book was Nouveau, with Memento Italic used for the captions. Traditional headlines were printed using Nouveau, with subheads printed in Jefferson Script. Panel names were printed using Vanguard. The book, trimmed to 7 3/4" x 10 1/2", had a standard cover design from Taylor Publishing Company and was printed using silver mylar for the cover. Names on the covers were printed in super blue foil.

The yearbooks were printed by Taylor Publishing Company of Dallas, at the El Paso plant location. The staff was assisted by two customer service representatives, Tammy Hollier and Ryan Almon.

Portraits and group pictures were taken by Neil's Photography of Needville and Life Touch studios. Candid photos were taken primarily by staff photographers, with some photos provided as a courtesy by others. The yearbook was produced using the UltraVision yearbook computer design program from Taylor Publishing Company.

The Tiger is produced using only monies raised by staff members. Fundraisers include selling ads for the yearbook and providing supplies for football concession stands, in addition to yearbook sales.

The yearbook is advised by Renee Huff.
