
























THE MENTAL GAME



to state competition was Sophomore Amber Garcia. After final competitions, Amber found herself in sixth place in her weight category. ...with soft hearts.







Making Our Memories, volume 57 of The Tiger is proudly presented to the students and faculty of Tidehaven I.S.D. from the 2006-2007 yearbook staff members: Lora Blanton, Maria Garcia and Tiffany Parks. This volume was originally priced at \$30 until the end of November and \$35 until the end of March, with a cover name included in the cost. In April, the cost of the book was \$40 and did not include a cover name. Any unsold books were available on a first come basis in August with a price of \$45.

This 57th volume was printed by Taylor Publishing Company of Dallas at the El Paso plant. Our Taylor representative, Ryan Almon, was a tremendous help to the staff by supplying us with his endless design ideas and wonderful support. Thanks, Ryan!

The press run was 150 copies consisting of 168 pages, including 16 pages of color. The book was printed on 80# enamel paper. Staff members used the Elitevision yearbook computer program on four PCs to produce the yearbook. Individual portraits for all four school and the majority of group pictures were taken by LifeTouch Studios of Stafford, Texas. Candid photographs were primarily taken by staff photographers with some photos provided as a courtesy by others.

The Tiger is produced using only monies raised by staff members. Fundraisers include selling ads for the book and providing supplies for football concession stands, in addition to yearbook sales.
