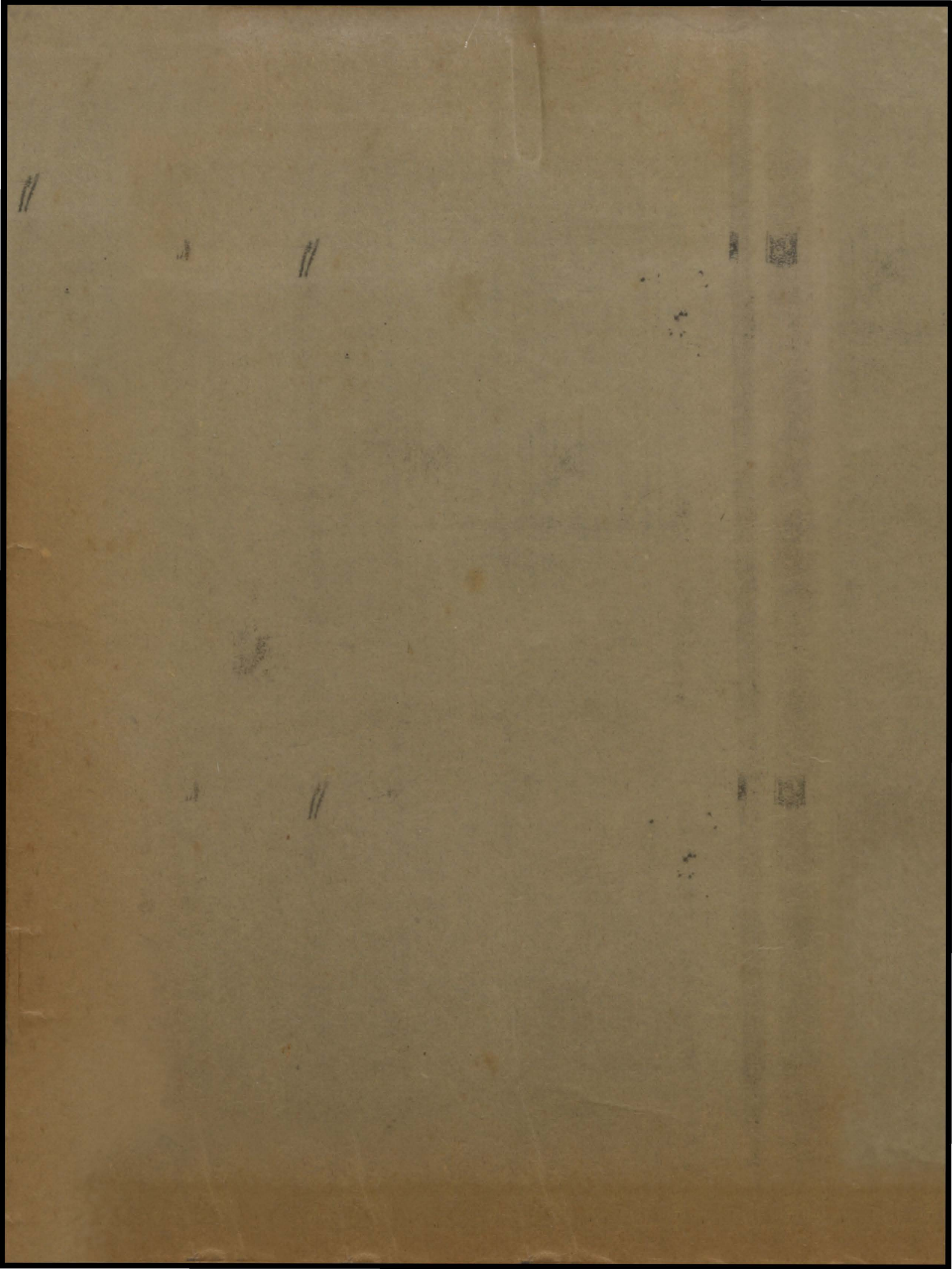

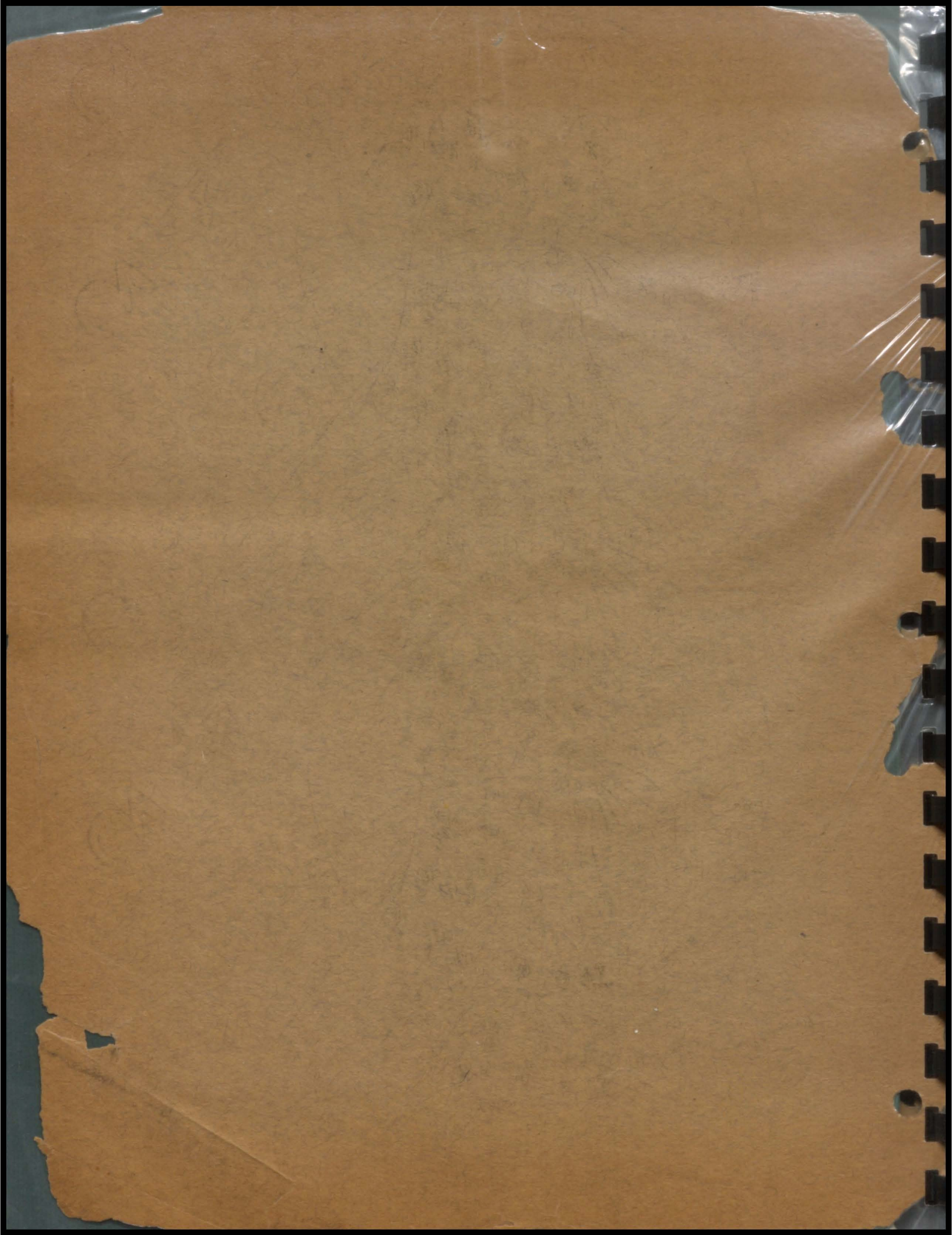

It is his Christian life that leads him always to be doing for others.

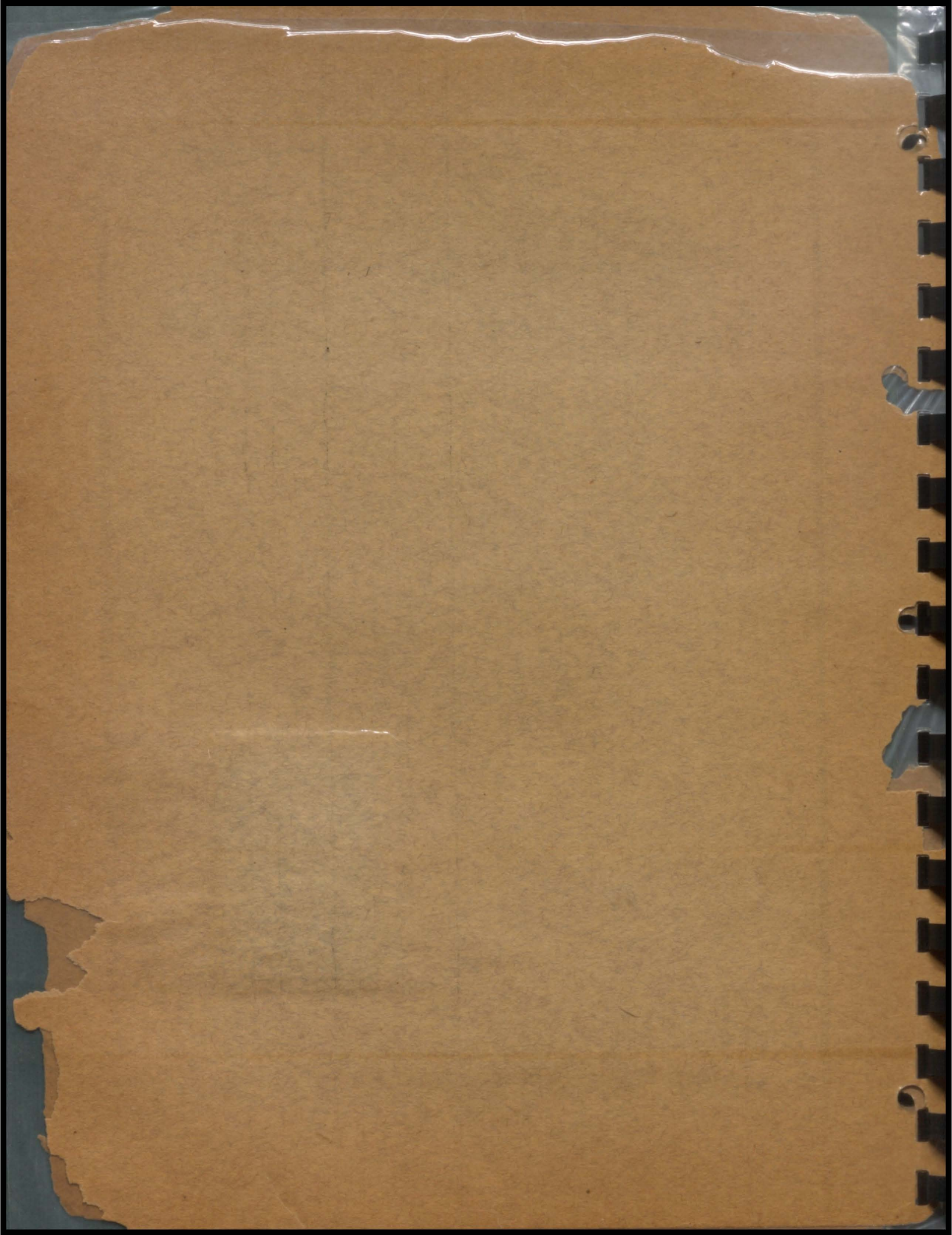

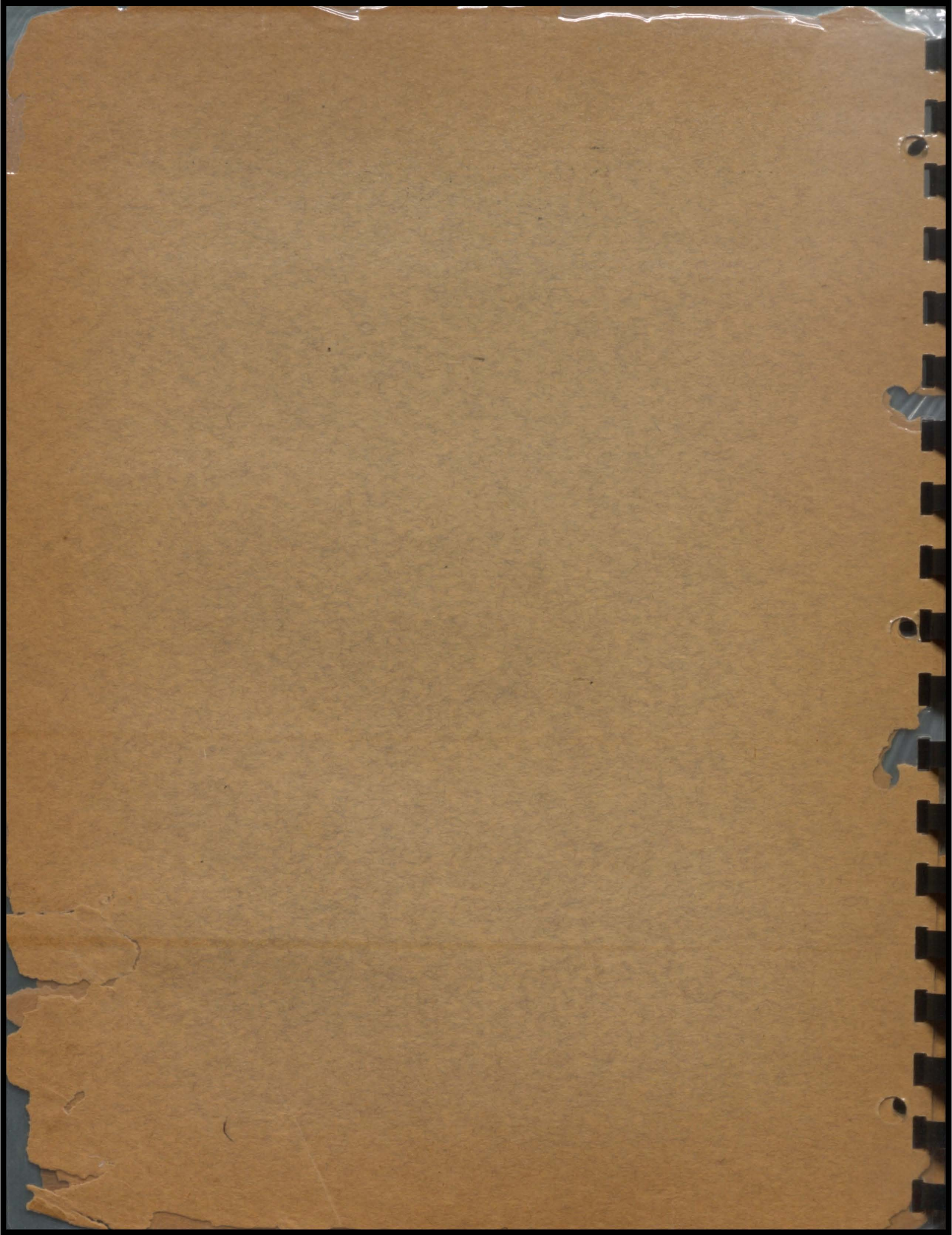


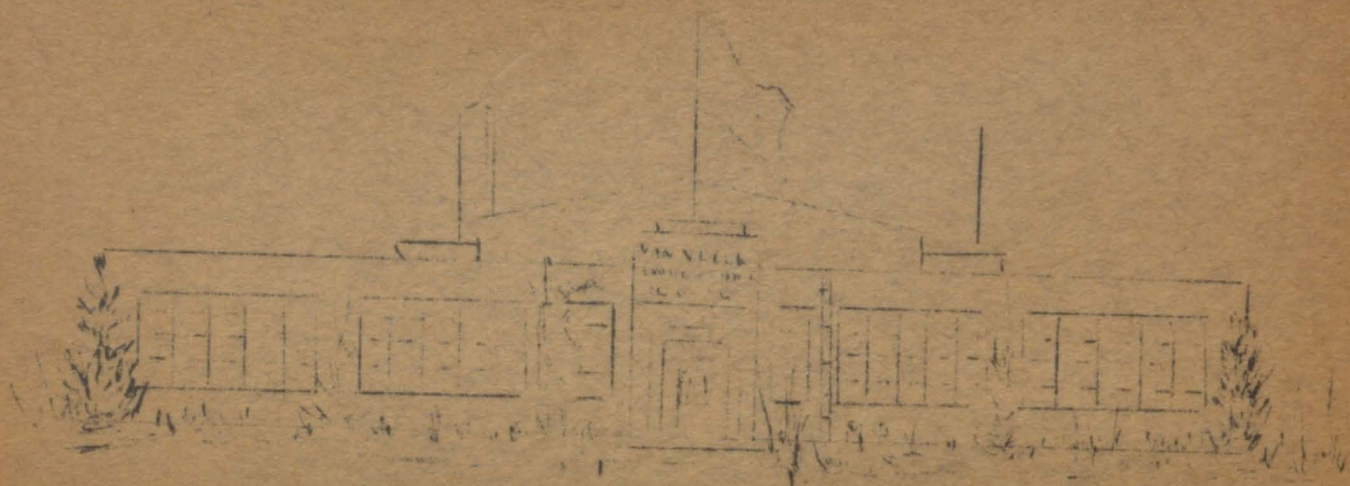


LEOPARDS

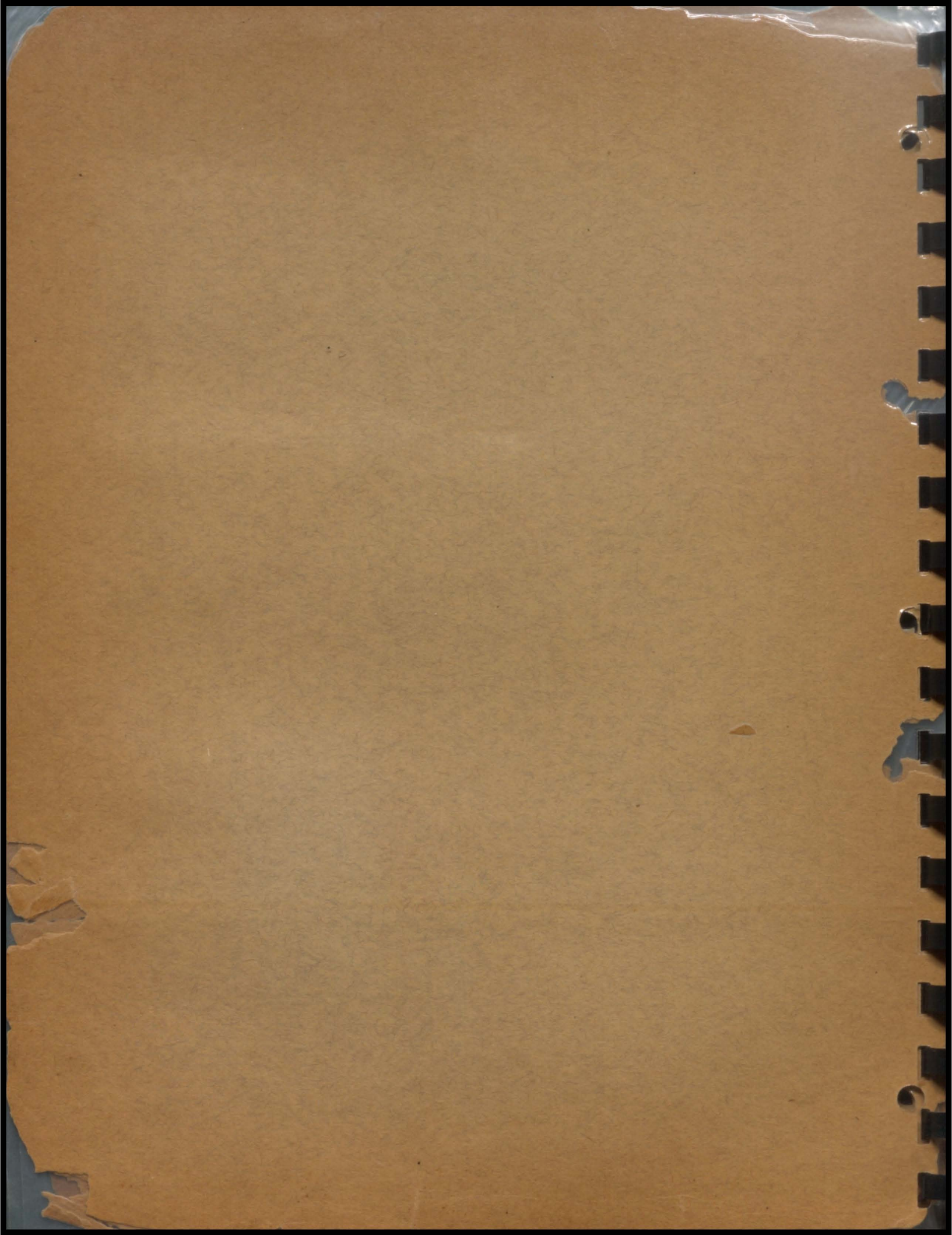

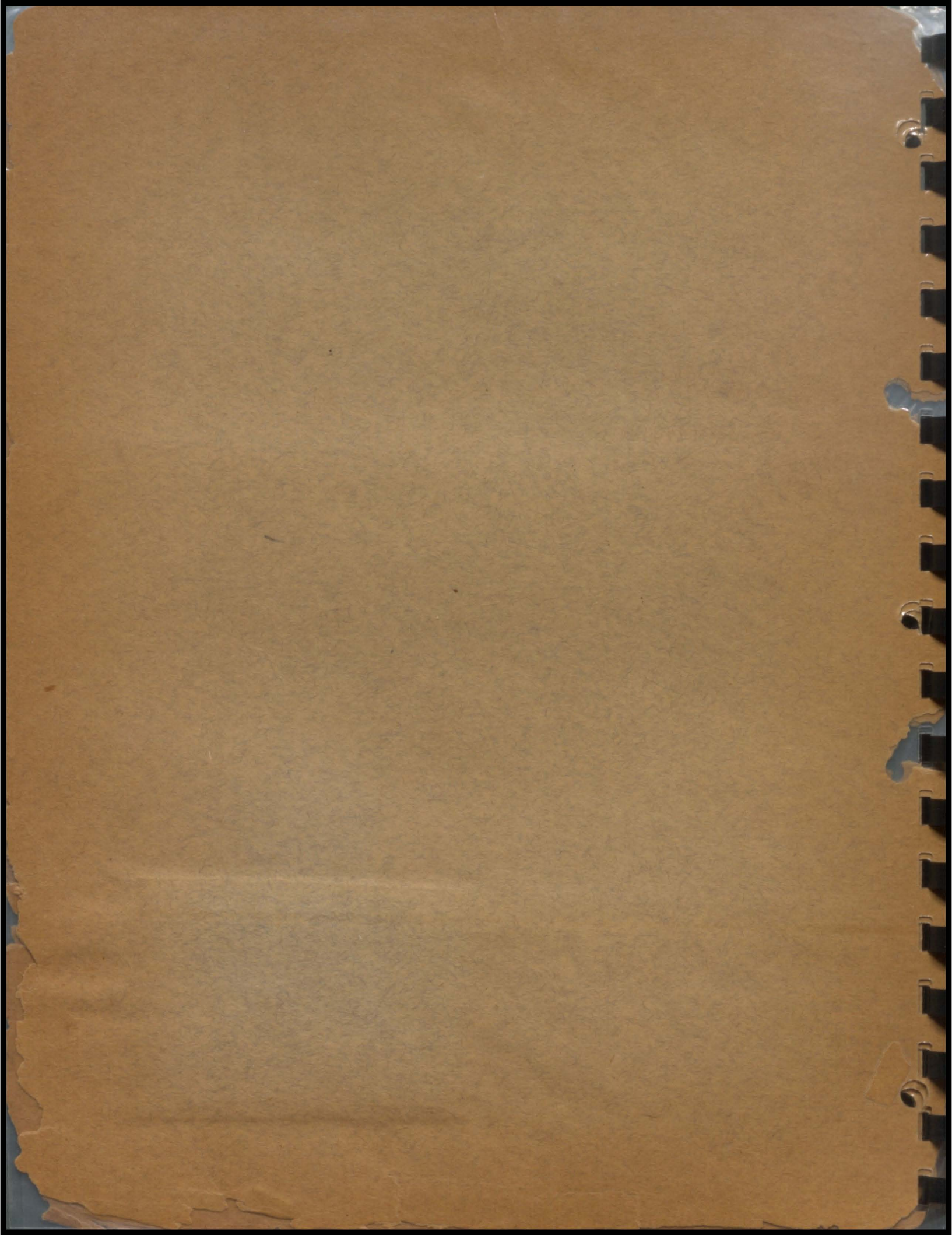

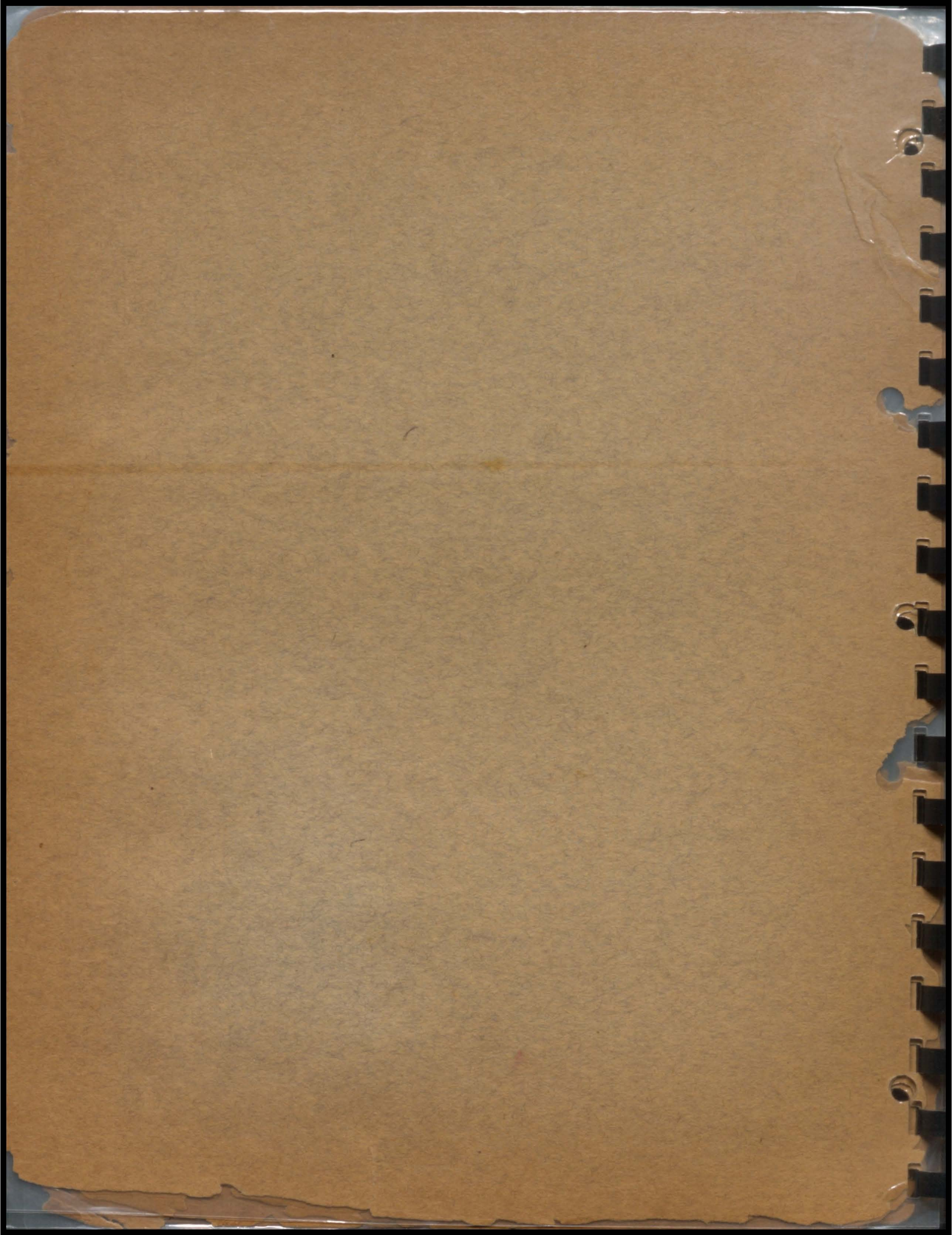




STUDENT COUNCIL

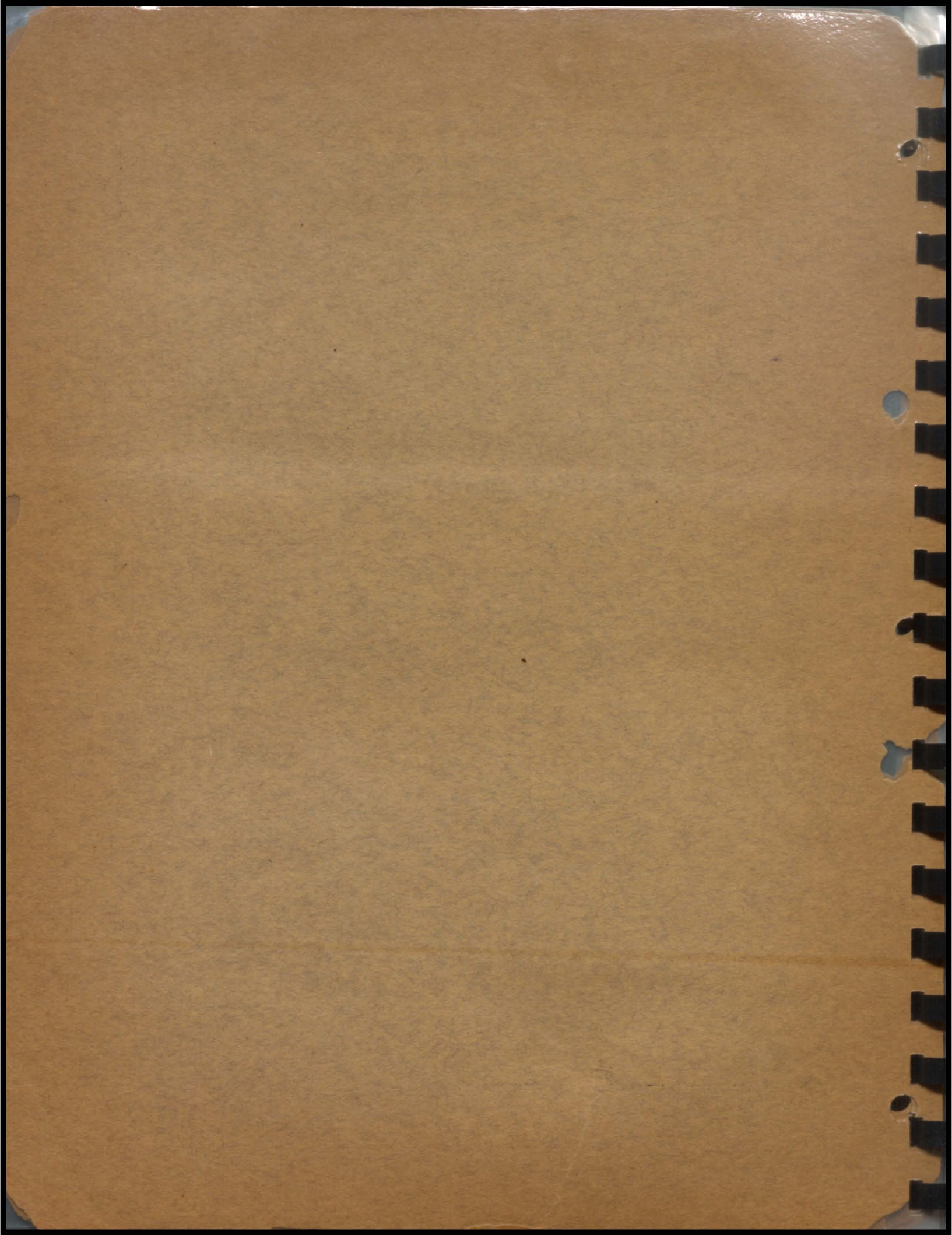
FINALE

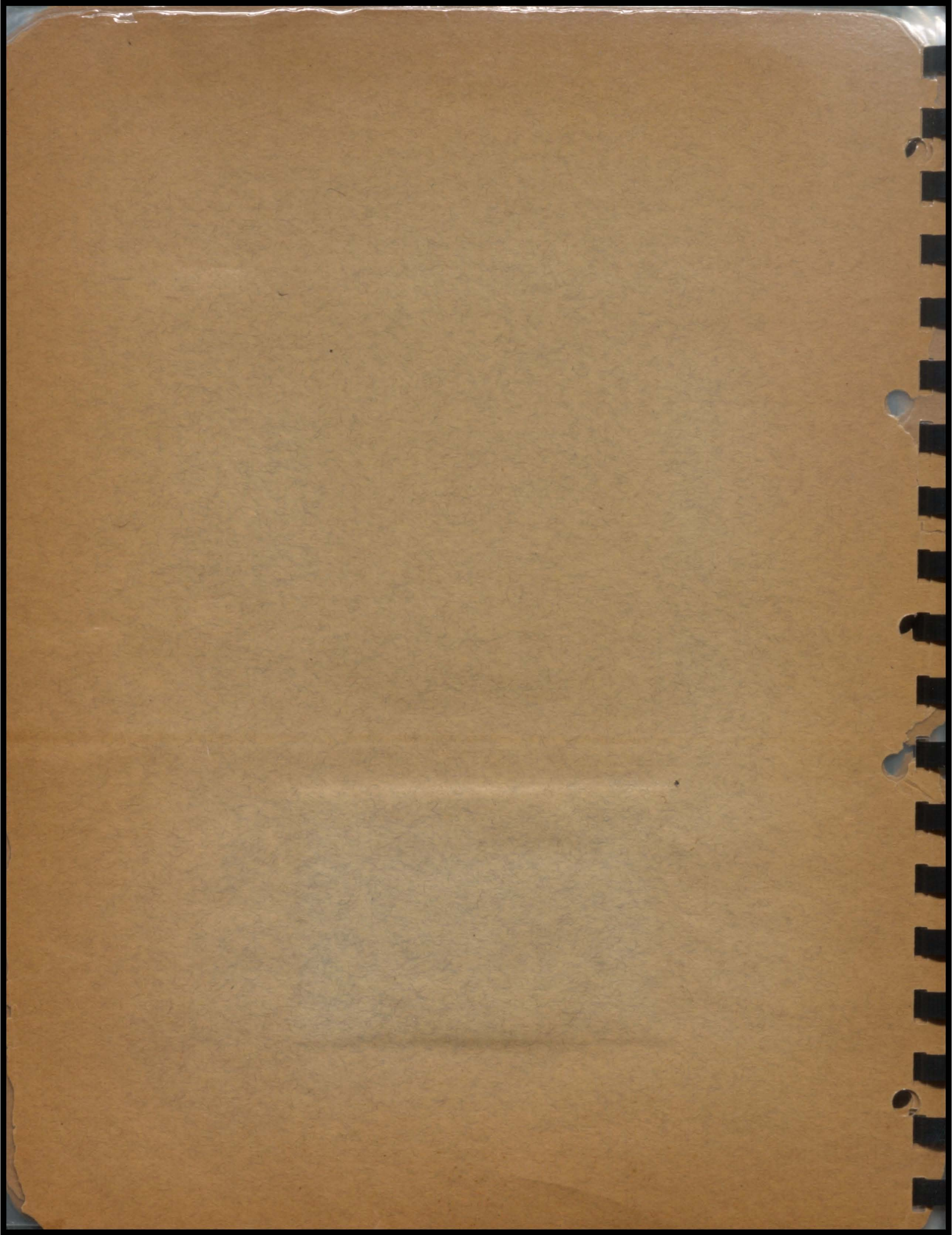
