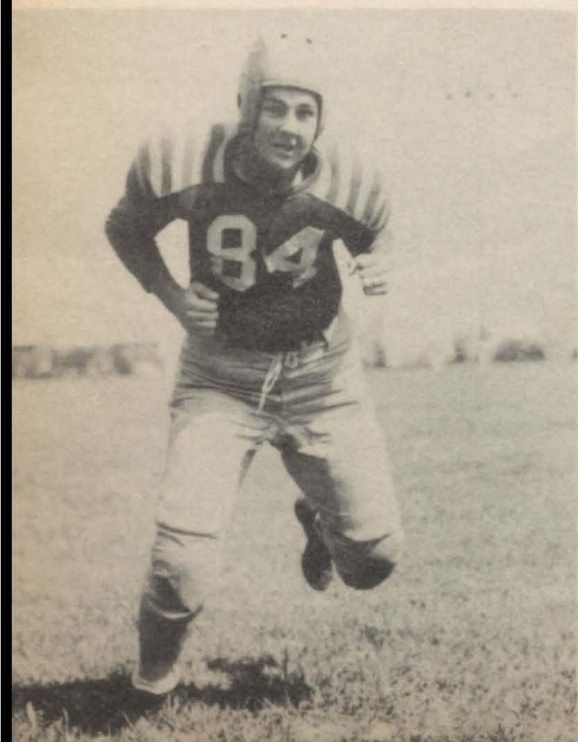
### BAY CITY vs. WHARTON

On the kick-off after the touchdown, Thompson raced 85 yards for the Tiger's only score of the evening.

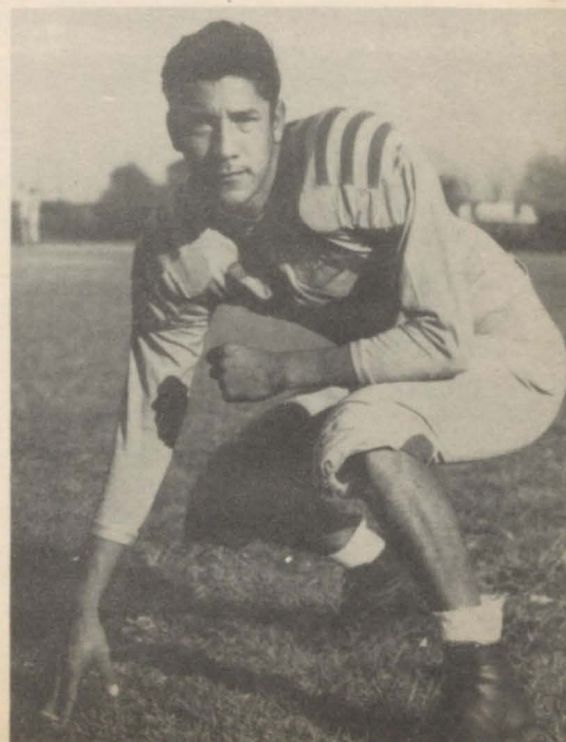
