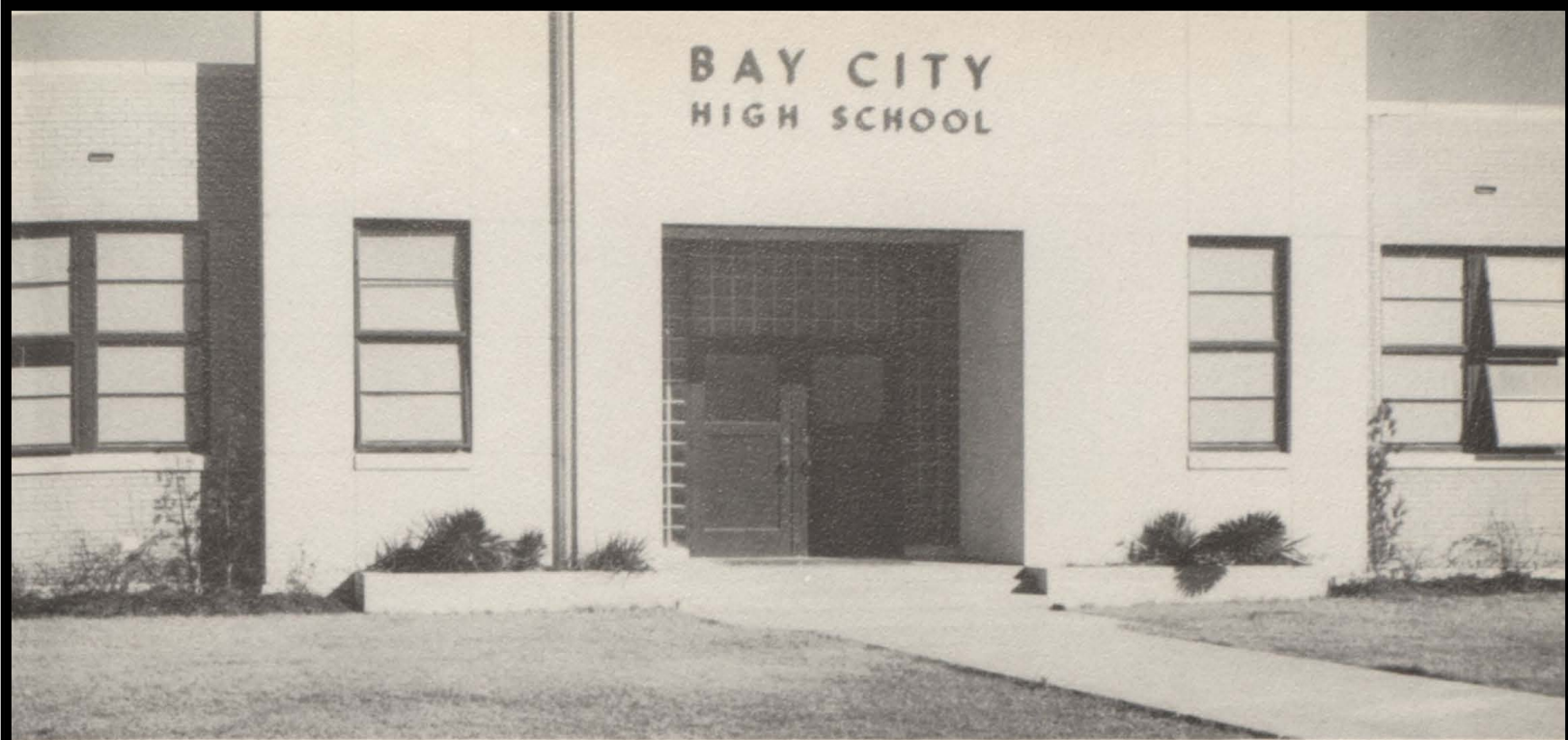

THE MAIN BUILDING OF BAY CITY HIGH SCHOOL

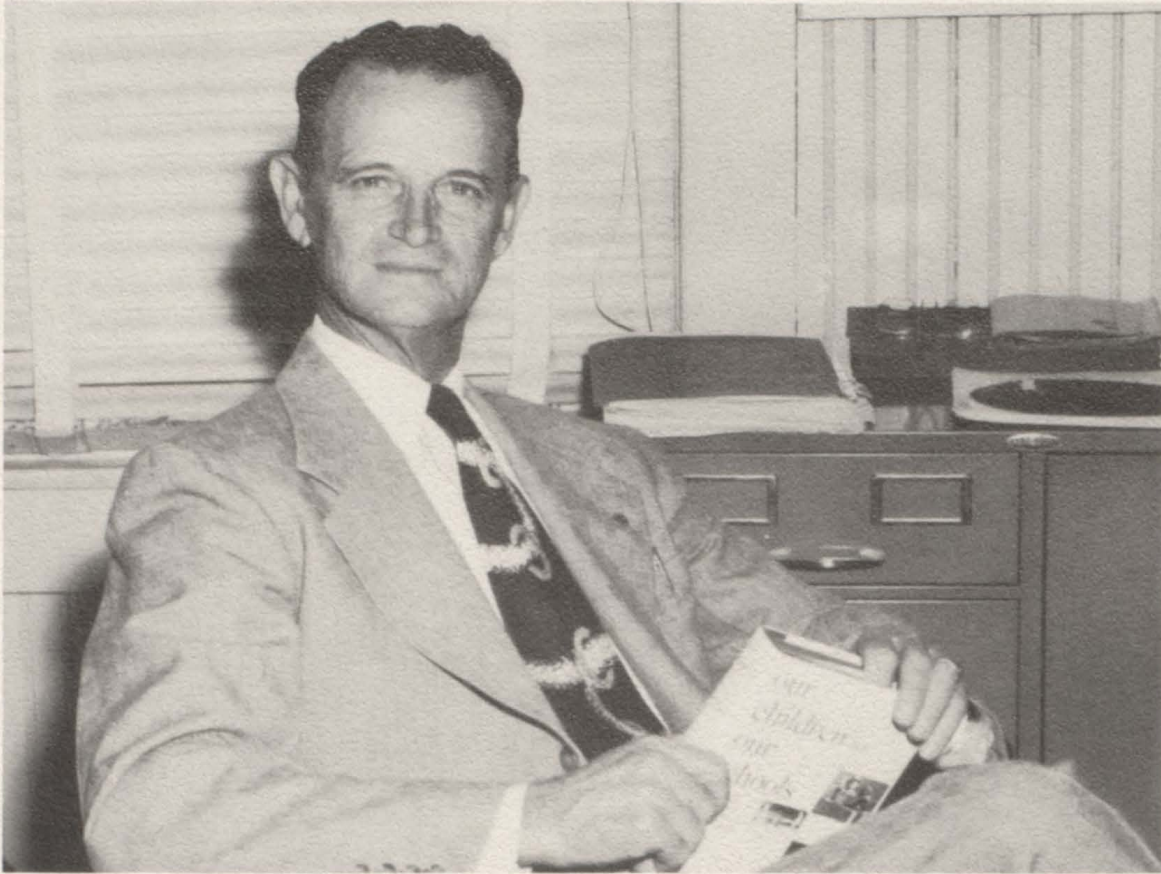
