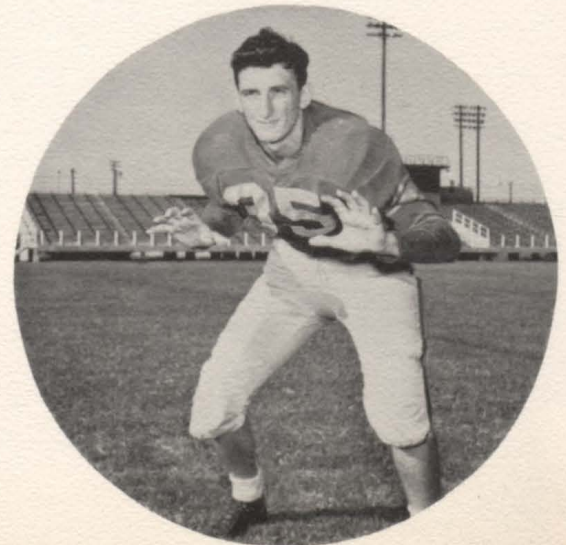
The Black Cats went against the Wharton Tigers as underdogs, just the reciprocal of last year.
