## Black Cats Take Own Relay Meet

BAY CITY — Ignoring a cold wind that swept Memorial Stadium, the Bay City high school track athletes took first place in six events and accounted for three records as they raced to a repeat championship in the Black Cat Relays Saturday afternoon.

Bay City rolled up 66½ points for the championship of the 10th annual relays against only 29 for second place Alvin. Wharton and Angleton were next with 28 points each.

**JIM BOB LOOS** of Bay City, only double winner, was high individual scorer with 12½ points, followed by Walter Hayhurst of Wharton with 11½ and John McMillian, also of Bay City, with 10.

Loos broke one of the two oldest records on the meet's books when he sped the 100-yard dash in 9.9 to shave the previous record of 9.9.5. He also won the broad jump with a leap of 21-6½.

McMillian was credited with a new time in the 200-yard dash when he went the distance in 21.5 in the prelims as against 21.8 and had 21.6 in the afternoon final.

**COACH JOE ROGERS'** Black Cat quartet broke their own record in the 440-yard relay with 43.2 compared to the old mark of 43.2.5.

Jimmy Wilburn of South Houston heaved the discus 153-8 to wipe out the old record of 147-11. Cooper Ford of Brazosport shoved the shot 52-6½ which bettered the old 52.2 mark of Charles Hoppe of Bay City last year.

Hayhurst, who had been a standout for Wharton, came up with a 14.9 in the 120 hurdles to improve on the 15.0 in that event for the Black Cat meet. Wharton also won the mile relay to gain permanent possession of the Etie trophy by taking the event for a third year in a row. John Carroll won the mile to give Wharton three first places.

**CURTIS PAYNE** captured the high jump and **Wernon Sauer** led the field in the 440-yard dash to give Alvin two first places and help them to second place in the team total.

John Jurek topped the pole vaulters and Bay City also set the pace in the 880-yard relay for their other firsts.
