


Dedication


Each page will give you greater confidence in yourself and in your ability to cope with life.

Curriculum

"Nature has given to us the seeds of knowledge, not knowledge itself."

Under the leadership of Mr. Frank Balusek, Superintendent in charge of curriculum, studies have been made, and recommendations brought about a change in the high school curriculum that gives each student a fuller and more helpful schedule.

Credits required are 17 plus 2 in physical education. English 4 credits, Natural Sciences 2 credits, with General Science required for Freshmen. 1 credit World History; 1 credit American Citizenship, 2 credits in mathematics which includes Algebra and Plane Geometry. Also six electives. There are forty Teachers and Administrators in the high school.

Four credits are required in English. The purpose of Grammar I is to improve communication skills. Particular attention is-given to correct forms of parts of speech used in sentences.

In Grammar II much time is devoted to verbals and dependent clauses. Reading, writing and spelling are continued.

By the time a student reaches his junior year he should have a good foundation of the essentials of sentence structure. So Grammar III is a detailed review of all such elements of sentence analysis. Diagrams and punctuation are stressed in sentence interpretation.

Planning for the Rice Festival and the "dunking" stand began in September and was carried out in October.


Homecoming was a special occasion that required weeks of planning and letter writing for the council.

Then there were the days of planning for the Student Directory. Come May, the Student Council had added its contribution toward a full year at Bay City high school.





THE COUNTY COURTHOUSE

"All roads lead to Rome." This famous saying may also apply to OUR TOWN.

Bay City is located about 89 miles Southwest of Houston and 22 miles inland from the Gulf Coast. It is the County seat of Matagorda County.

OUR TOWN has nearly 15,000 people living within its boundaries. Due to industry moving to the Gulf Coast area and taking advantage of its natural resources "all roads definitely lead to Bay City."

The building of the barge canal from the Intercoastal Canal to a point within a few miles from OUR TOWN and the selecting of a site on the outskirts of town by the Celanese Industry to build a plant has increased the city's population since the last census report.

Bay City is the shipping point for an agricultural, oil producing, and sulphur mining region, and contains rice mills and warehouses, oil refineries, and other industry. It has a mayor-council type of government. The sewer, water, and gas distribution systems are municipally owned.

OUR TOWN is located in a section of Texas that is rich with a colorful history. A little more than a hundred years ago a small village began to grow "out of the Bay Prairie" where not too many years before the Karankawa Indians hunted and pitched their tents on the banks of the Colorado River.

This small village soon became Bay City and the County seat of one of the largest counties in the State of Texas.

OUR TOWN has many paved streets and highways. There are beaten paths across the countryside and along the lakes and streams in the area. There are county roads and private roads and there is also the crossroads. But all who travel these roads find that they lead to OUR TOWN, the "GOLDEN TOWN" of the Gulf Coast.
