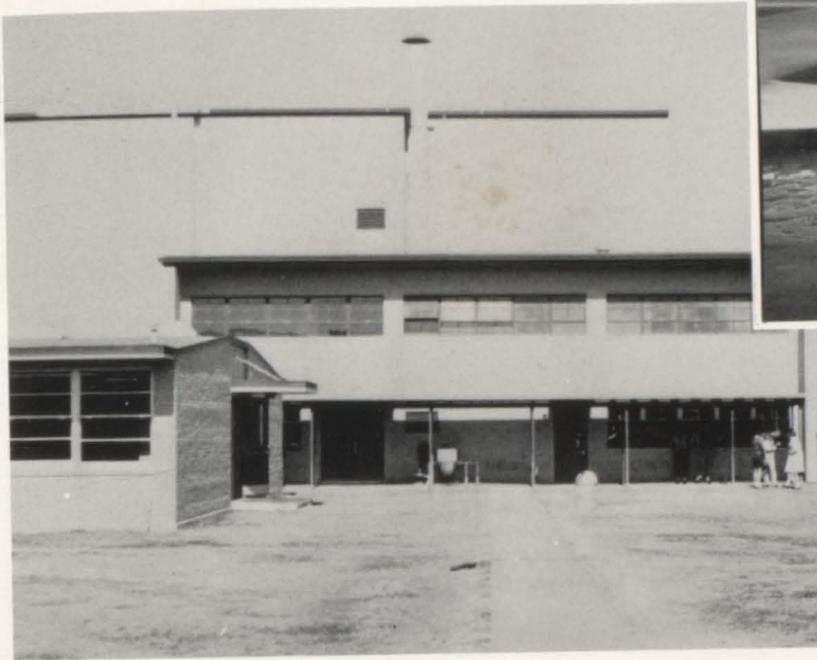
Bay City Yesterday

Valedictorian

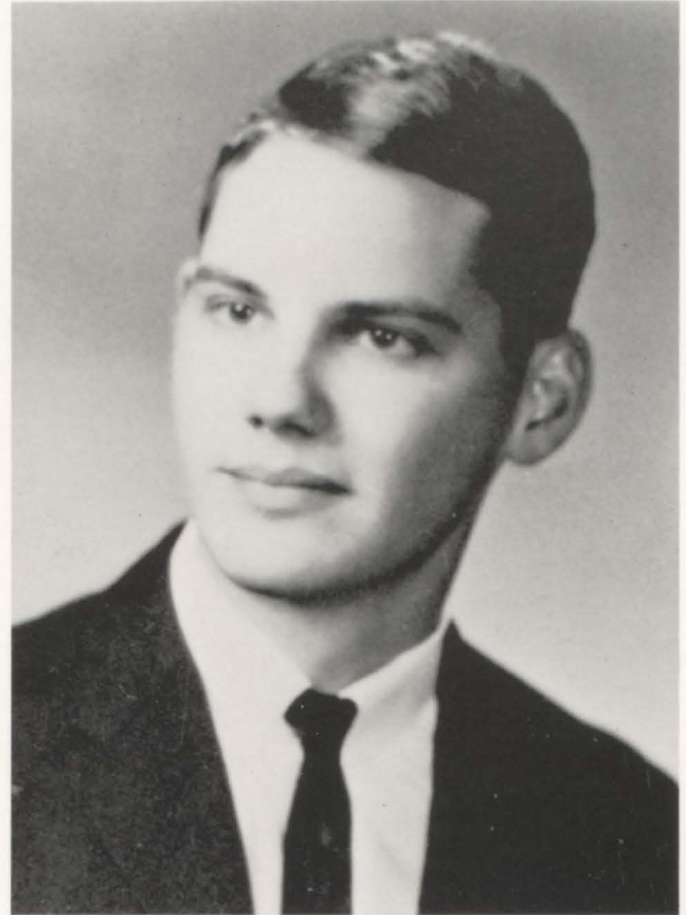
IRA CHASNOFF

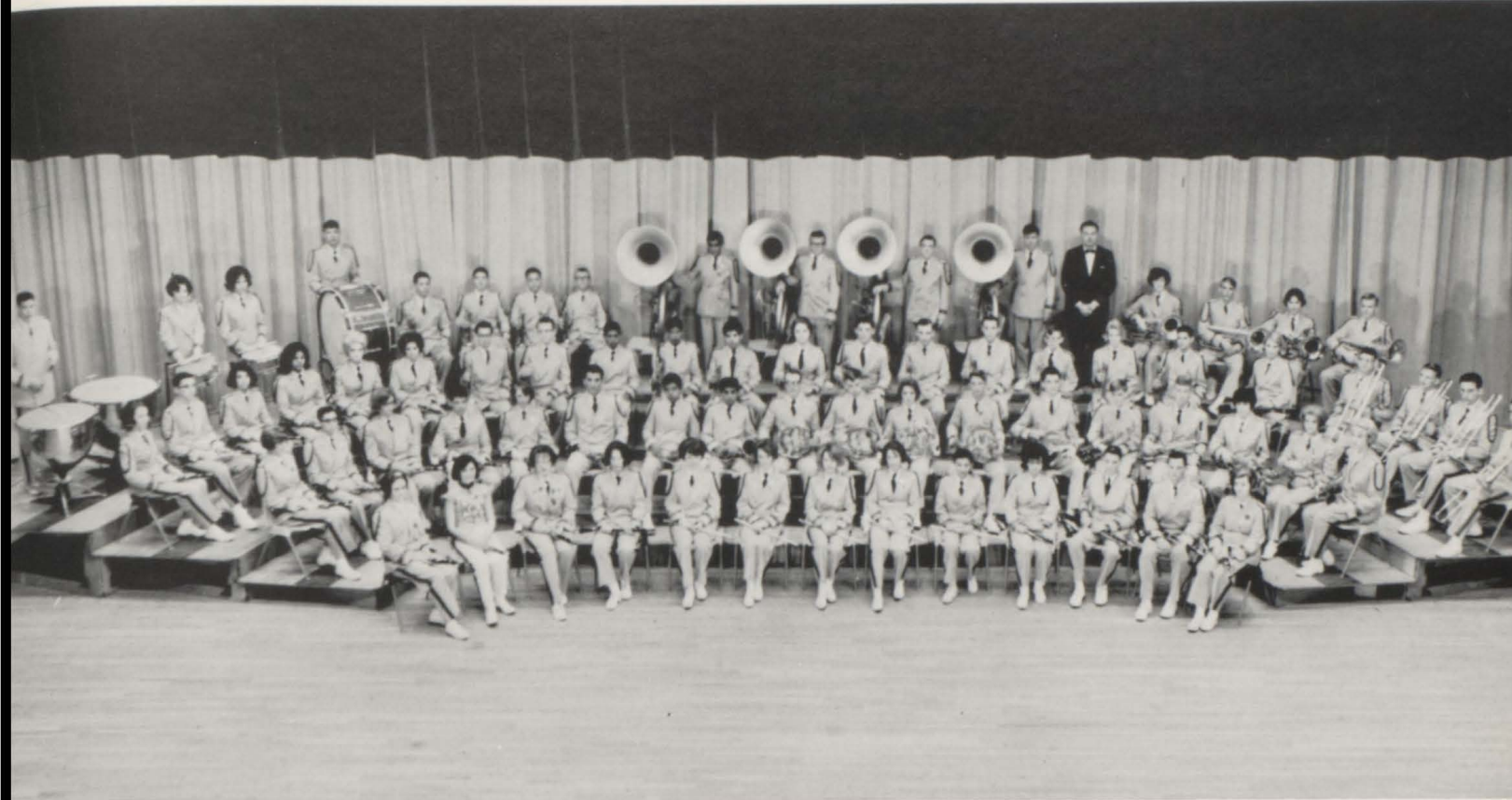
The Blue Band brought distinction to B.C.H.S. by receiving the top AAA Regional Band Award.

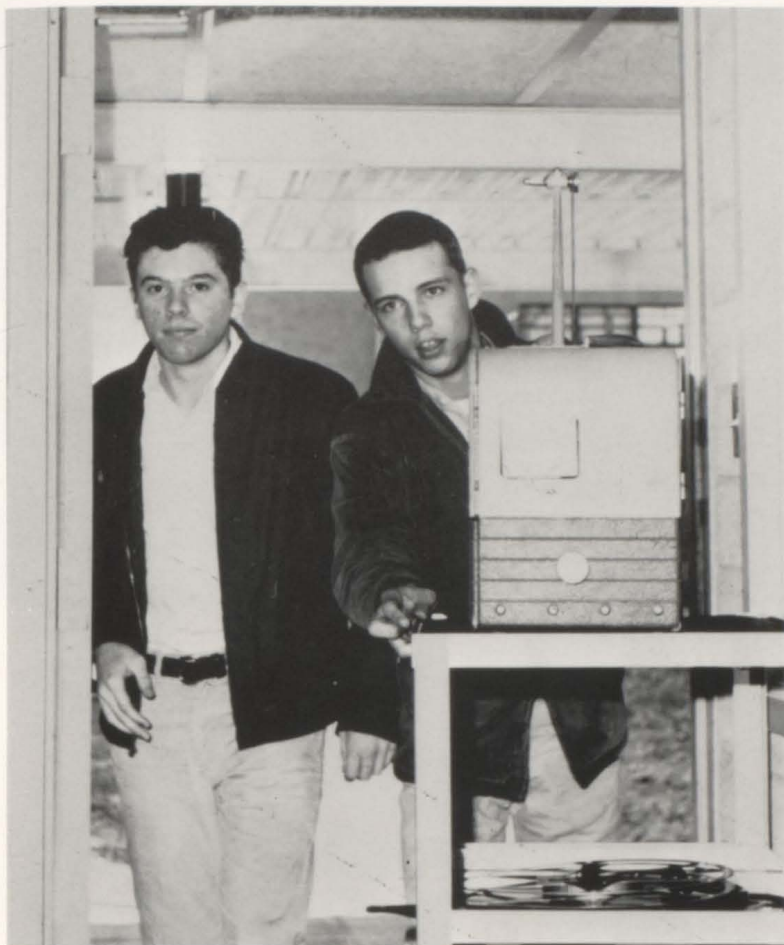
Club Keeps Up-to-Date With Science
