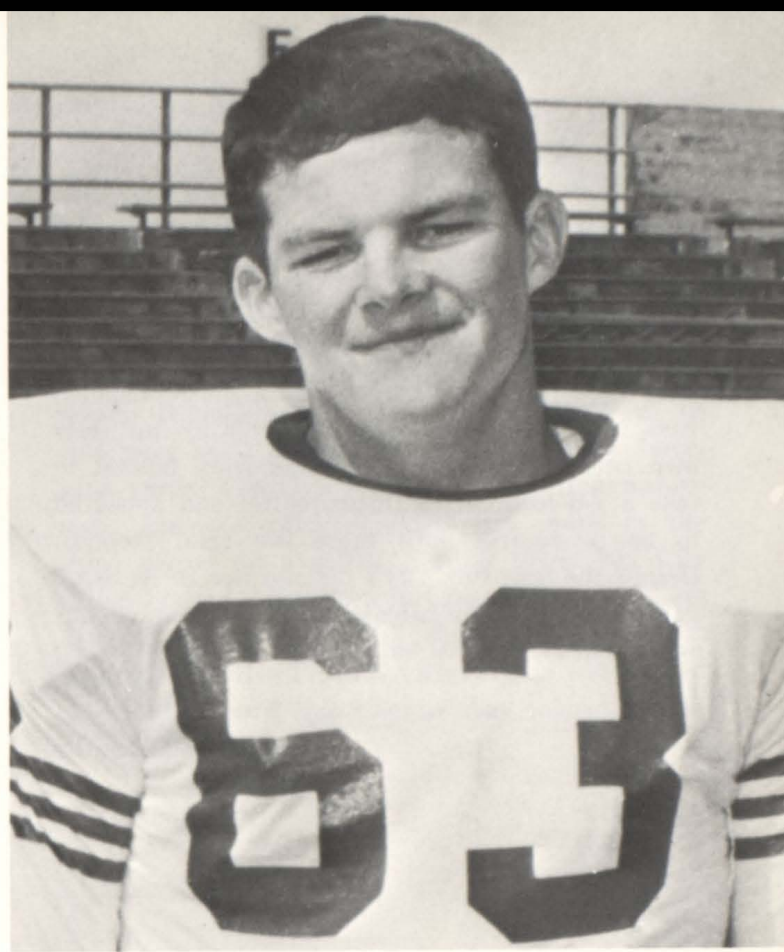
Cats Shutout in Season Opener, 14-0

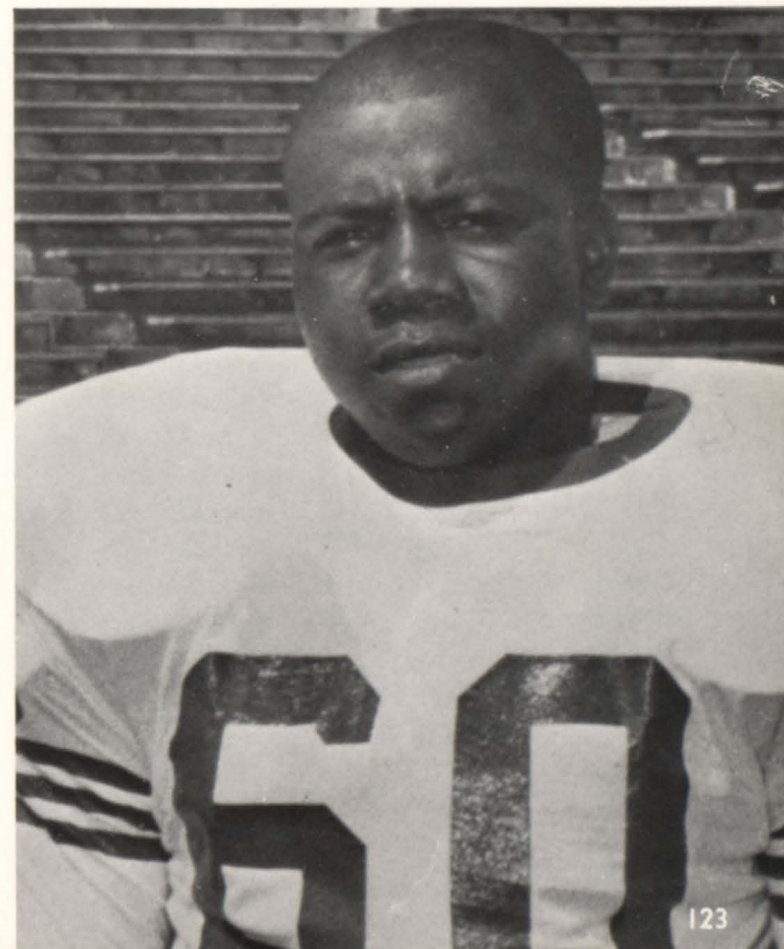
Bay City Untracks—Whips Bulldogs, 15-0

Crusaders Fall to Cats, 8-0

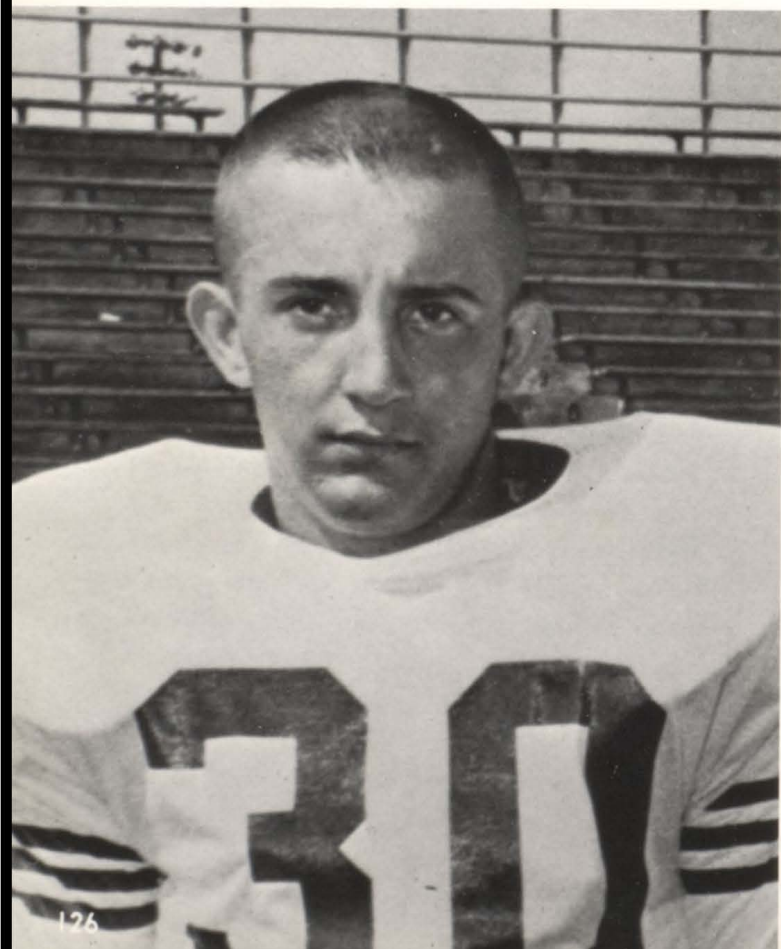

Cats Take Wharton in District Opener, 16-7

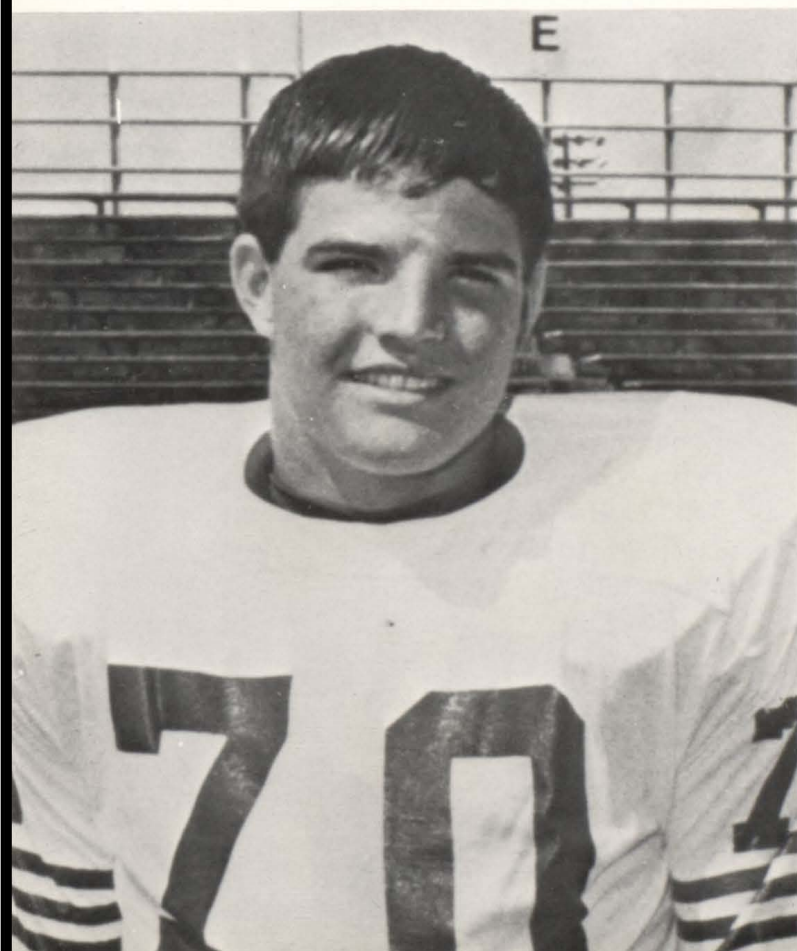

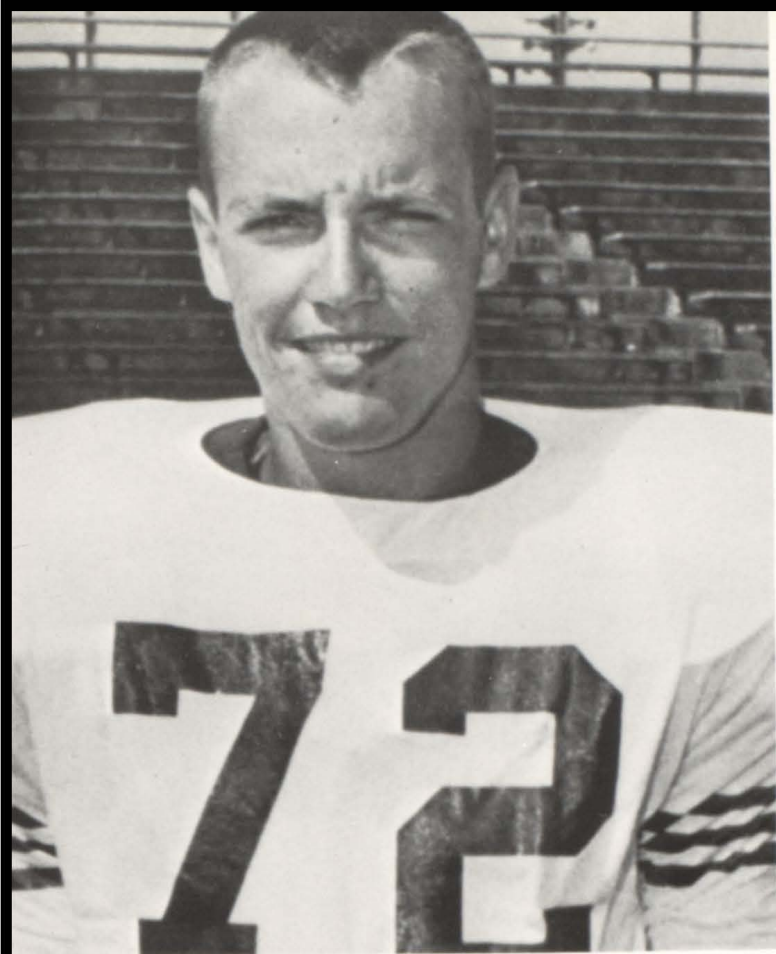

Lamar Edges Bay City, 6-0, in Defensive Battle

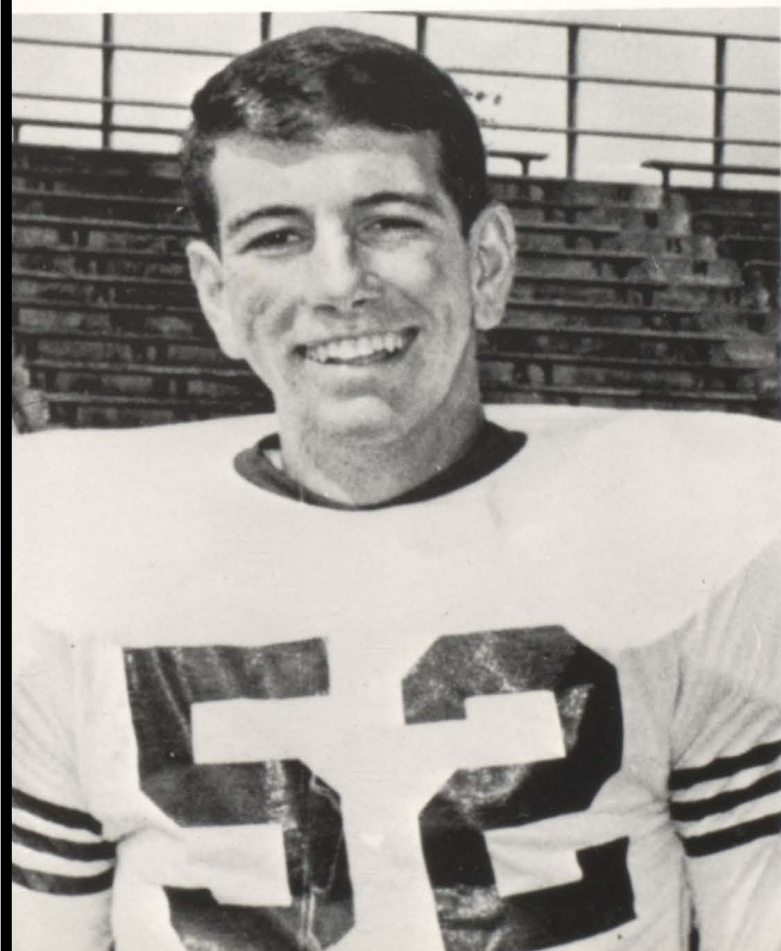

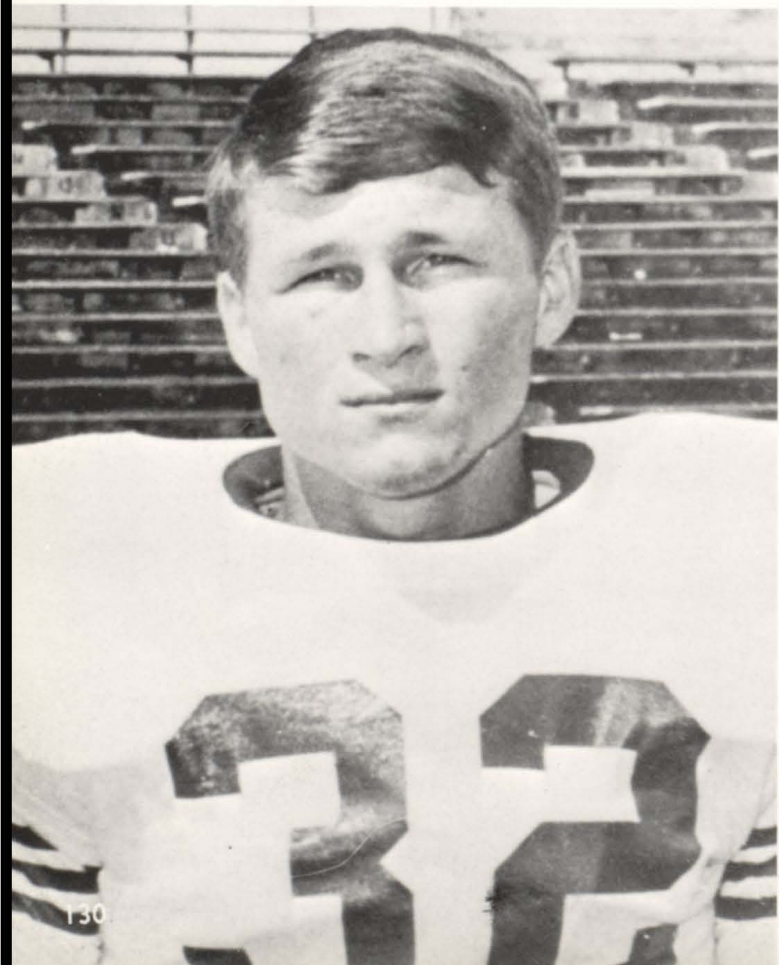
Cats Wreck Roughneck Homecoming, 20-13
