
Would you believe our faculty????




In Memory


Cats Shutout in Season Opener, 14-0

Unfortunately for Bay City, football games are won by touchdowns, and not effort alone. The Cats, playing a hostful of newcomers to the varsity level, did their best, but were unable to overcome the experience of Clear Creek's Wildcats. The Wildcats scored twice in the second half for a 14-0 win. One of Clear Creek's touchdowns came from a thirty-eight yard run back of an intercepted pass, while the other touchdown was a result of a Bay City fumble on a fourth down punting attempt: Clear Creek had to march only twelve yards for the score. Arthur Milberger picked up forty yards in eleven carries to become Bay City's leading ground gainer, a position the junior fullback held throughout the season.

Bay City Untracks-Whips Bulldogs, 15-0



Cats Take Wharton in District Opener, 16-7


After a rather shaky first half, the Cats completely dominated play in the last two quarters to hand Coach Haley and his staff of Coach Rogers, Coach Schraub, and Coach Maglitto their one-hundredth win in fourteen years. Their complete record for that time now stands at 100-37-5, a truly remarkable one. The Cats first took possession after a Wharton punt and appeared to be on their way to an easy victory. They marched thirty-three yards in four plays before quarterback Alvin Schultz hit Larry Douglas with a twenty yard touchdown toss. 

El Campo Slips by Bay City, 9-0


