Black Cats Bop El Campo; Lead District Race

El Campo - The Bay City Black Cats put it all together in the final period here Friday night to turn back a stubborn Ricebird team, 14-0. This ruined the debut into Class AAAA for the Birds and gave the Cats some revenge for a 21-0 licking at the hands of El Campo last year.

This win puts Bay City in first place in District 24-AAAA. This was the only game in district play and the Cats should lead the district for the next three weeks.

For three quarters it looked like it was going to be a long season for the Cats and their fans, but they jelled in the final stanza despite fumblyitis. This win should be a big morale booster for Bay City. El Campo isn't expected to do much in district play this year but they fought Bay City every inch of the way and they weren't a push over.

One bright spot on the Cat team was the running of Curtis Thomas. He is a fine broken field runner and was

the leading ground gainer of the night, picking up 77 yards in 16 carries and he tallied both touchdowns. If the defensive line can spring him up the middle he will score lots of touchdowns this season.

Bay City took the opening kickoff and put it in play on their own 32. Thomas broke for 12 yards on the first carry and they worked the ball down to the El Campo 37 before having to punt. The teams traded the ball back and forth for the rest of the quarter with neither of them making a scoring bid.

The same story held true for the second period, each team would run a few plays and have to punt the ball away. Jackie Heard brought the partisan El Campo crowd to their feet in the closing seconds when he hit Ray Gerla with a 34 yard pass to the Cat 30.

Bay City got their big break in the game late in the third period when Jesse Olivo picked off a Heard pass at the Bay

City 45 and ran it back to the El Campo 30. Bay City got a

clipping penalty called on them and this set them back to the 45.

On the opening play of the final period, Bay City faced a third down and seven situation. Andrew Smith eluded a tackler behind the line and hit Thomas with a desperation pass to give BC a first down on the enemy 21 yard line. Thomas was shaken up on the play but made a dazzling catch. Thomas ran by all the Sandcrabs to race 62 yards for the final TD of the night. Smith added the extra point to make the final margin 23-7.

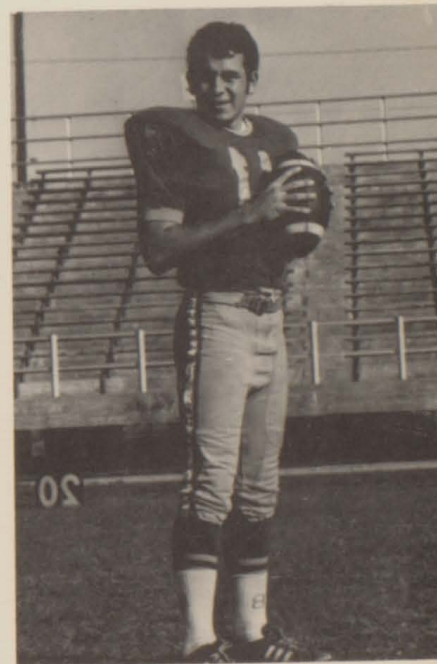
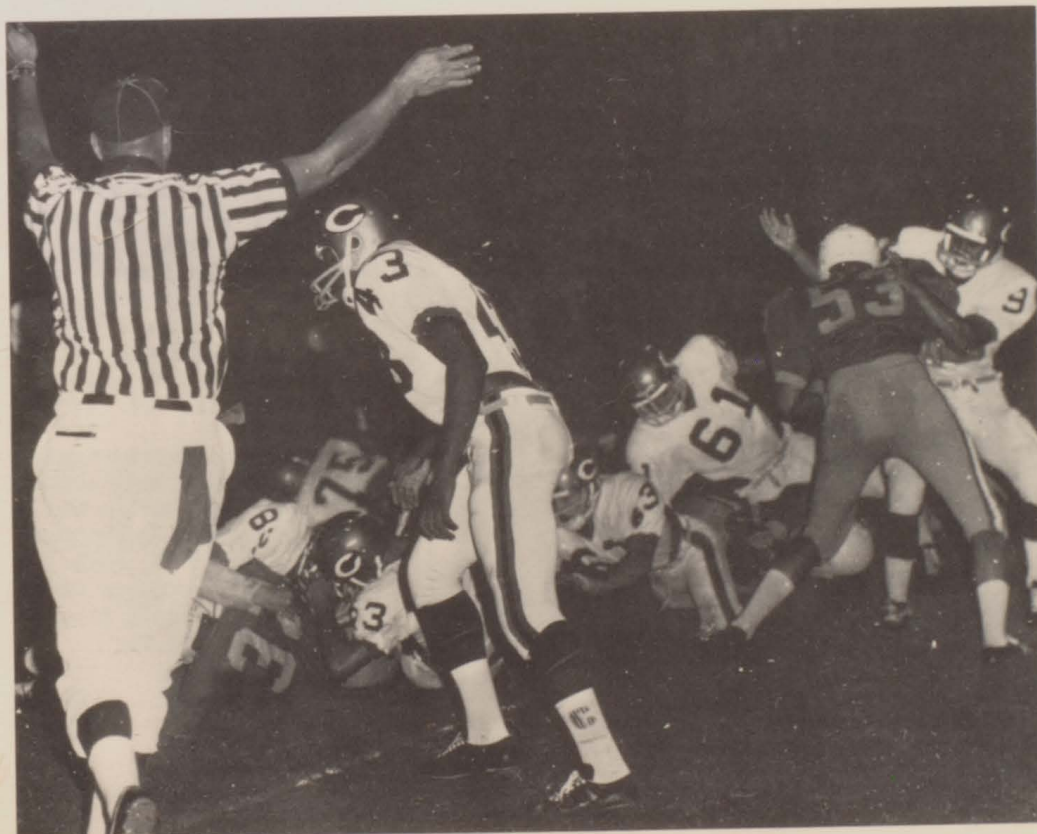
Calhoun was not out of the ball game at this point though, they took the ball and mounted a sustained drive to the one yard line where they coughed the ball up to Olivo on a fumble.

West Columbia—The Bay City Black Cats went down to defeat here Friday night, losing to a good Columbia team, 21-13. It was just a simple case of too much Charles Davis and too little offense for the Cats. We could add that a fierce defense thrown up by the Roughnecks also had something to do with the outcome. Bay City only got into the Roughnecks end of the field two times from scrimmage.

Bay City drew a half the distance penalty and big Charles Johnson powered over for the first score of the game. A good run of 11 yards by Philip McKay set the ball up on the 12, Thomas picked up eight and Cole ran the ball to the one for a first down. The Roughnecks lived up to their name here and held Bay City on downs, stopping them four times.

Bay City did take advantage of the next break. They recovered a Columbia fumble on the five and Cole circled left end for the score. Smith missed the extra point, but the Cats were only down 14-13 with plenty of time left in the game.

Lightning struck back quickly for Columbia. On the second play of the next series, Davis broke one tackle in the backfield and raced 64 yards for the final TD. Ellisor added his third extra point to make the final score 21-13.

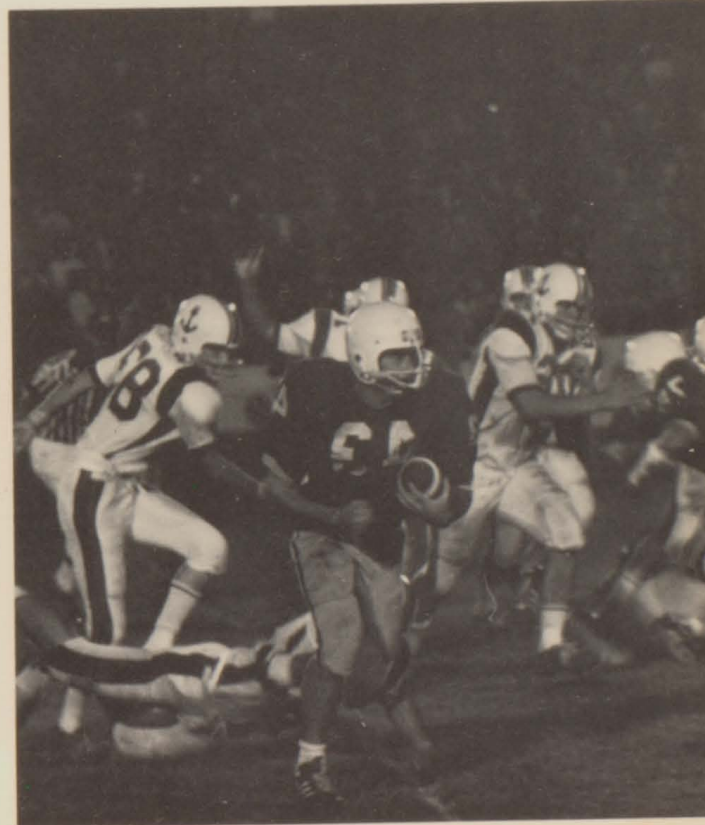
led 27-0 with 4:27 left in the game.

version and failed, leaving the score 19-7 with 3:54 left in the game.

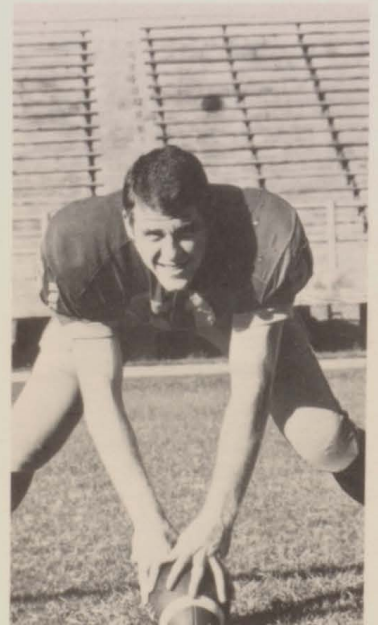
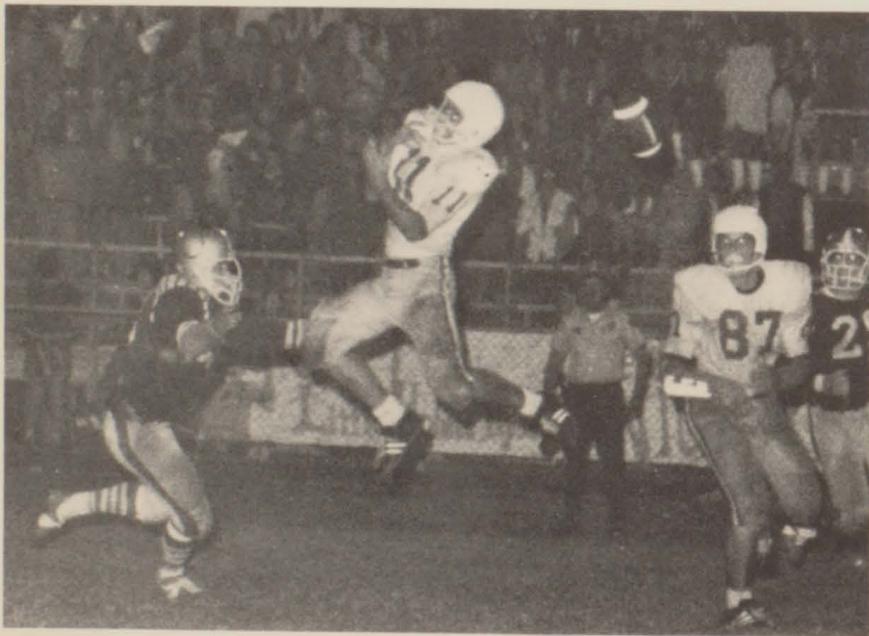

Rozanne Krumholz was crowned Homecoming Queen at the half and her bright smile was even brighter after the Cats pulled the game out of the fire.

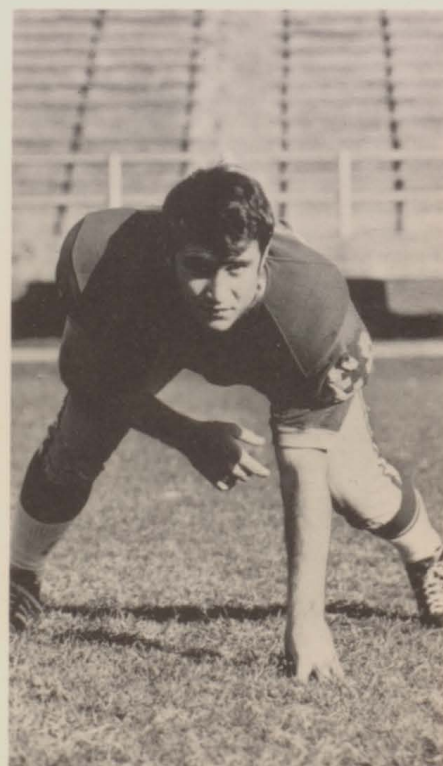

Bay City mounted their best drive of the night in the early minutes of the third period.

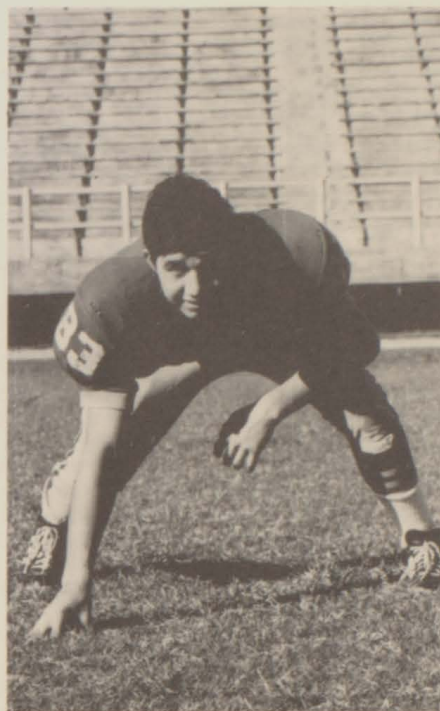

LaMarque put their six points on the scoreboard midway through the final period. They took a Bay City punt at their own 27 yard line and marched 73 yards in 12 plays for the score. Williams set the TD up with a 17 yard run to the BC one yardline. David Touchstone sneaked over left

guard for the score. The PAT attempt was no good, and that ended the scoring for the game.

Bay City had to play catch up after this, and they went to the passing game. The Tigers put a hard rush on the passer, and Smith had to hurry this passes. Several receivers managed to get open, but the passes failed to connect.

Two things have to happen now for Bay City to share in the district championship. First, they must beat Ball next week in Galveston, and second, El Campo would have to win over Texas City. A Black Cat win next Friday and a Texas City victory would give the

title to the Stingarees. A Ball High victory and a win by Texas City would see the district end up in a tie, and Ball would represent the district in the playoffs.

Texas City Hands Black Cats First District Loss, 33-3

Texas City—The Stingarees really stung it to the Bay City Black Cats here Friday night. Bay City went down, 33-3 for their first district loss of the year. The Texas City victory, coupled with the Brazosport win over Ball, puts the District 24-AAAA race in a three way tie between, Bay City, Ball, and Texas City. The Stingarees had fumblyitis early in the game, but Bay City could not turn any of the fumbles into touchdowns. The Stings were knocking on the Bay City goal line most of the game, but the Cats

kept coming up with loose footballs to stop the drives. Once the Stingarees got to where they could hold onto the football, they had things their way for the rest of the game.

The game was marred by several fights on the field and some in the stands. Both teams drew several penalties, and I think the coaches from both schools should be credited with breaking up the fights and keeping the game from getting out of hand.

There was a man in the press box with a radio, and he had the Ball and Brazosport game. When the word got out

that Ball was getting beat, the crowd really went wild. This along with the Stings win over Bay City meant that their team was tied for first, and they seemed happier over this than the touchdowns that were being scored.

Things looked pretty good for Bay City early in the game when they recovered a fumble. The Cats took the kickoff, but had to punt after three downs. Phillip McKay punted and Bob Breeden recovered the fumbled punt at the TC 45 yard line. Andrew Smith hit Jim Penland with a 15 yard pass, Roy Cole picked up eight yards, and Smith ran the

ball to the TC seven. The drive bogged down here and Crayden Dennard kicked a 28 yard field goal. This gave Bay City the lead with 6:01 left in the game.

Bay City made this 3-0 lead standup for nearly all of the first half, but the defense really had their work cut out for them. They stopped one Texas City drive at the 10 yard line when David Polk recovered a fumble. The next TC drive was stopped at the three yard line on a fumble recovery by Bob Breeden. After the Stings intercepted a Bay City pass, they moved it back to the Cats 10 yard line before Joe Garcia came up with another fumble recovery.

Texas City took a Bay City punt late in the second half and scored in seven plays. Quarterback James Varley scored from the three yard line on a keeper. Varley tried to run for two points, but Breeden stopped him short of the goal line. This put the Stings out in front 6-3 with 4:11 left in the first half.

Texas City took the opening kickoff and gave it back to Bay City on the third play when Steve Henson intercepted and ran it back to the TC 20. The Cats managed to pick up nine and a half yard in four tries, and the ball went over on downs. This was the last serious threat made by Bay City in the game.

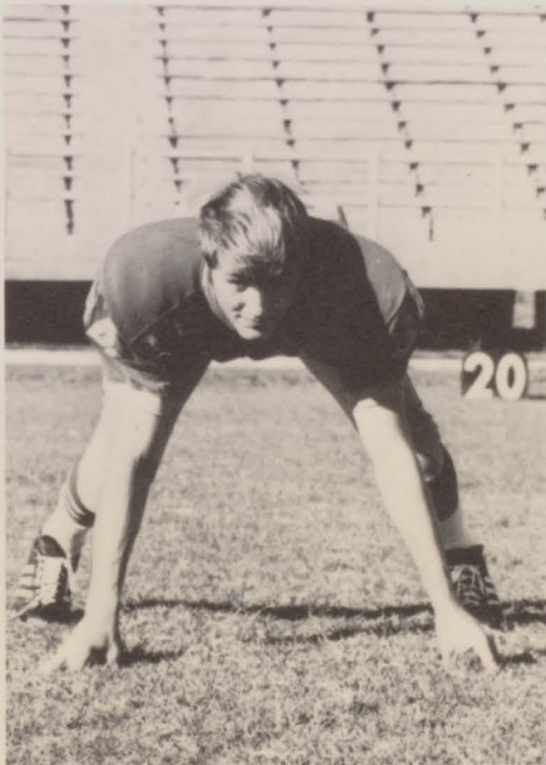

The final TD of the game came as the result of another interception. Smith was intercepted at the Bay City 36. Chouke hit Danny Speer with a 24 yard pass to set up the score. Chouke then ran for the score. Schluens kicked the extra point to make the final score 33-3.
