




Spirit Fever






Juniors — Class of 1982



He is vice president of the FCA, a member of the FHA, and the Key Club.






Despite a continuous hardpaced offense and defense led by veteran squad members, the Black Cat Varsity roundballers lost their chance to repeat as state contenders.










