Choir director was Richard Tinker. Music accompaniment was provided by Maestro John Reinke and his select musicians.












The six-year-old swimming program reached a milestone with the sending of sophomore Steve Grein to the UIL State Swim Meet in Austin.




Climaxing a year of fund raising, the Junior Class honored the graduating seniors with a Southern Plantation prom.
