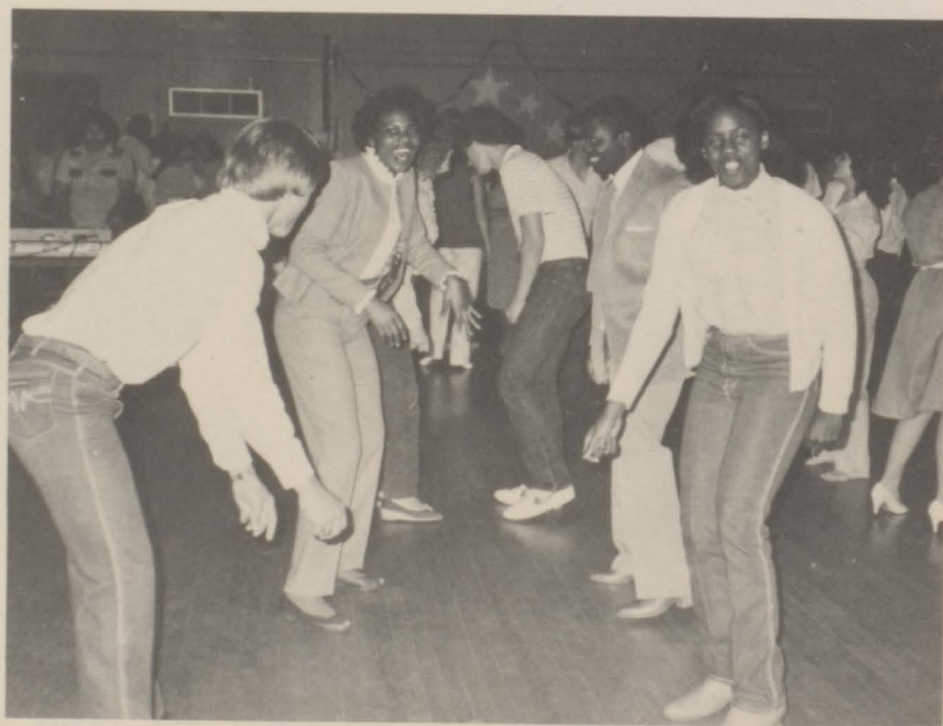
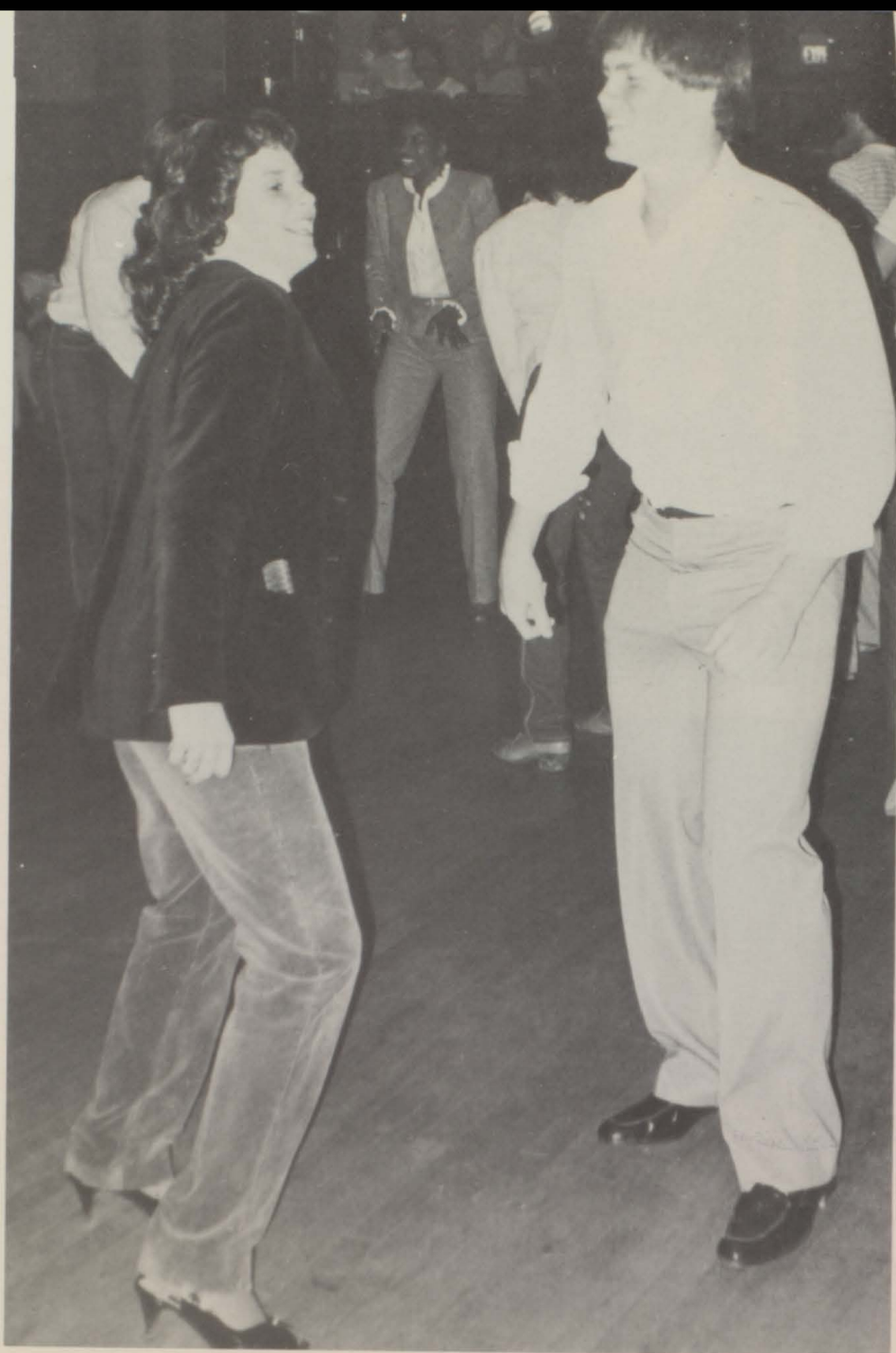
# Sixteen Honored at Favorites Dance

# Vocational and Technical Education Programs

Bay City Independent School District is home for the Area Vocational School for Bay City Independent School District and Tidehaven Independent School District. Under the agreement, students from the other districts may come to Bay City and take part in Vocational and Technical education programs.

The Area Vocational School is designed to provide a comprehensive program of education that will meet the needs of students to become productive citizens, to develop in students saleable skills, appropriate work attitudes and habits, and to provide an opportunity for the individual to acquire the necessary technical knowledge and information to perform satisfactorily in his/her chosen field.

The Bay City Vocational program is more than skill training, or training for a job. It is concerned with educating the whole person in preparing students to become happy and well adjusted members of society.

The Area Vocational School offers eighteen different vocational programs from the seventh grade through graduation. There are six industrial programs, two vocational agriculture programs, seven vocational homemaking programs, two marketing and Distributive programs, and one vocational office education program. The vocational school also provides a full time vocational counselor. The counselor's main objective is to aid students with career choices, schedules, pre-vocational testing, and to help each student fulfill their vocational objectives.

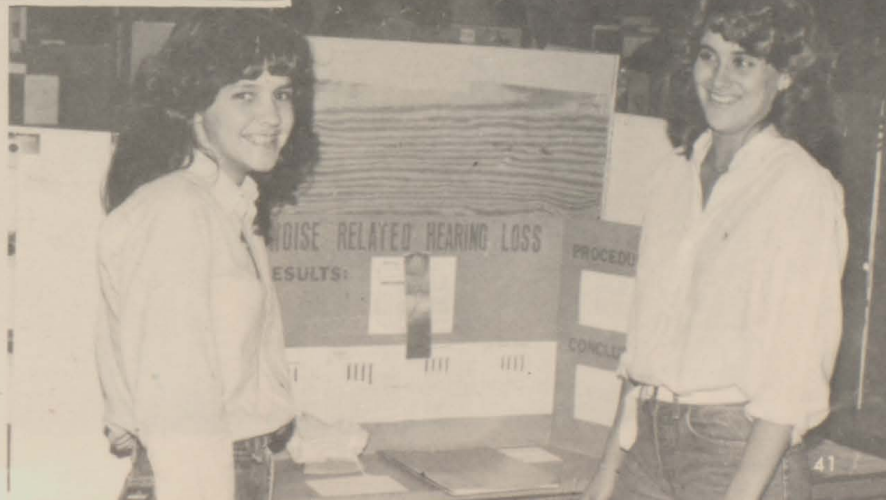

The 1982 Blackcat Football season was one that will long be remembered by the faithful fans of Bay City. The '82 team of Cats were truly fighters with a lot of determination. Although they were one of the smallest teams in the district, the Blackcats were chosen to win the district title hands down because of their speed and quickness. The team suffered only one loss during the first half of the season (which was in pre-district play) and began to show the fans what they wanted to see. The terrifying Dooms Day Defense of the Cats held opponents scoreless in four consecutive contests and the offense quickly capitalized on good field position. The Cats then suffered two heartbreaking losses, one of which was Homecoming and the other a 3 to 2 loss to arch rivals Wharton seemingly ending chances for a district title. The Cats fought back strongly in the next game determined not to go out losers and toppled the district leading El Campo Ricebirds. The team rolled over Terry and emerged at the top of the district. The Cats then faced Port Arthur-Lincoln in a bi-district contest. Even though they were definitely underdogs, the Blackcat Spirit was not dampened. In a mild down pour, the Cats prolonged their season a little longer. After another week of tough practicing, the team journeyed to College Station to battle for the Regional title. Under very poor conditions, the Cats swam away with another victory. The next week the Cats would face the top ranked Eagles of Willowridge. On this night, the Cats saw their season draw to an unpleasant close.

Looking back on the season, Coach Ron Mills said, "Of all the teams I have coached, this team has earned the title of 'The Fighting Hard Group' ... their attitudes, determination, and leadership abilities will make them successful in the future."

In girls track the most outstanding award went to Romona Williams.

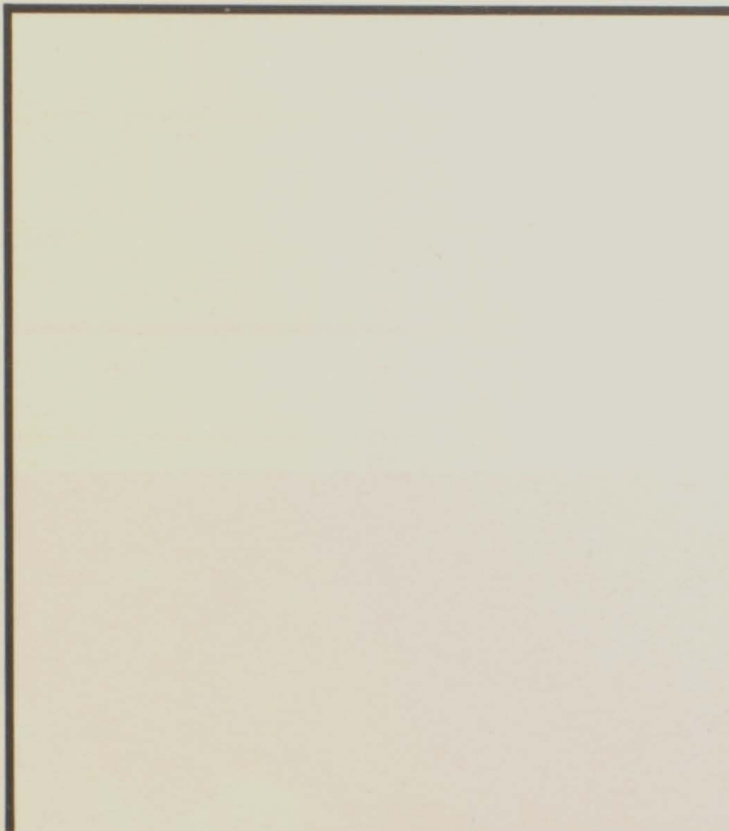

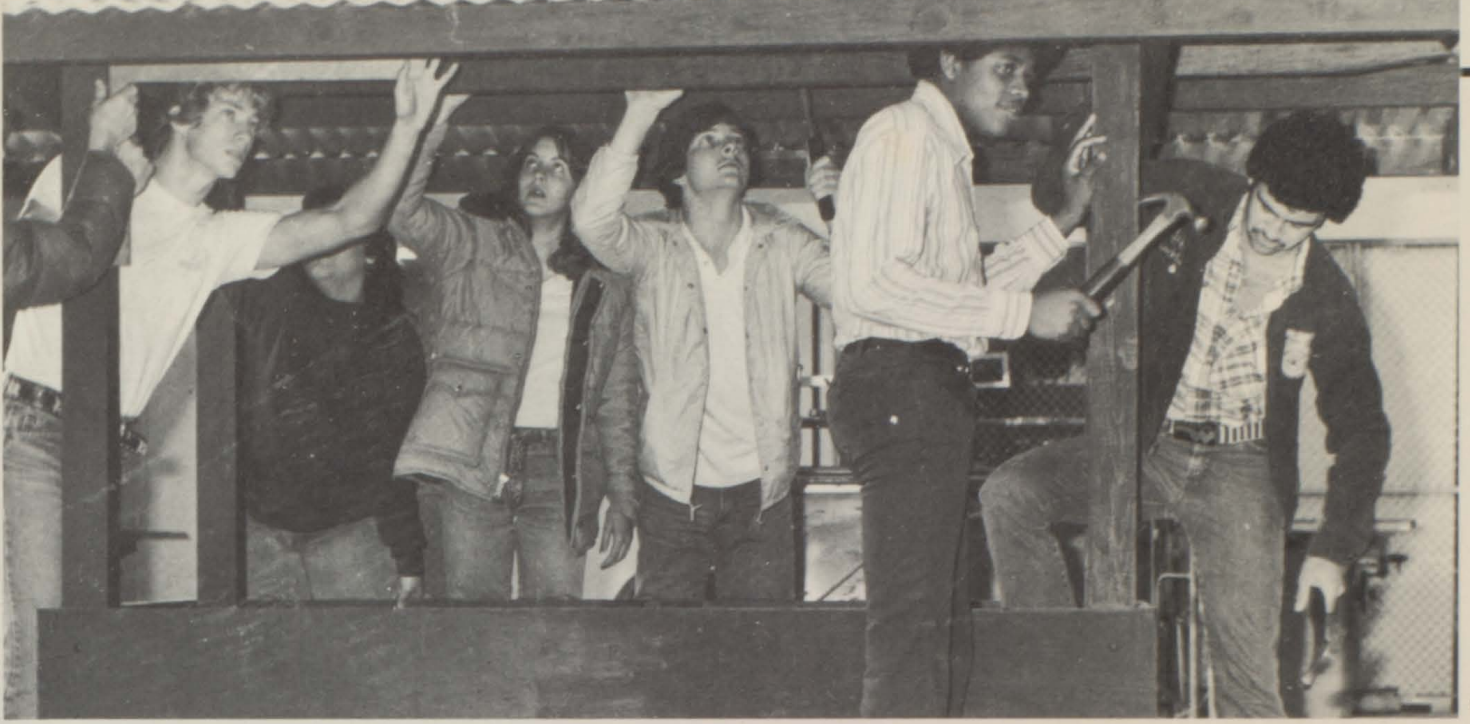
