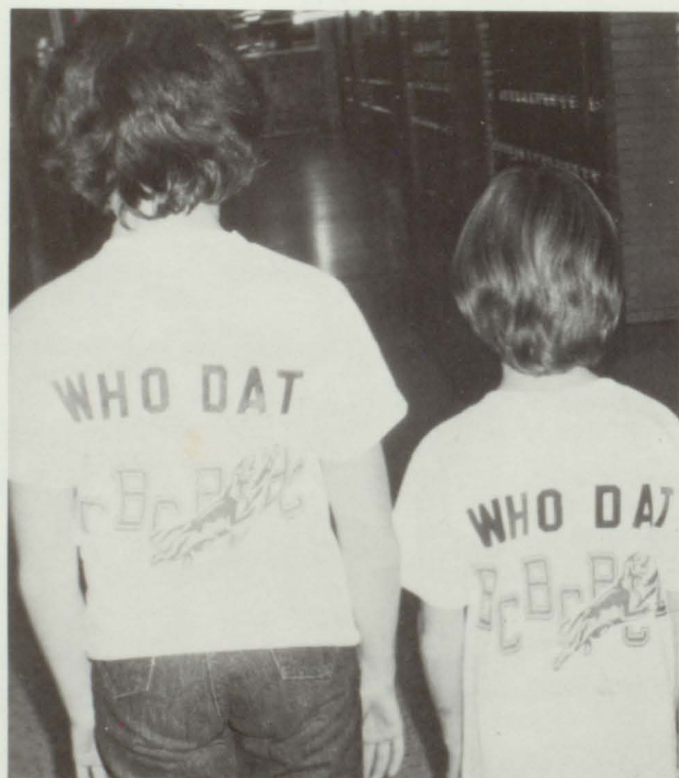

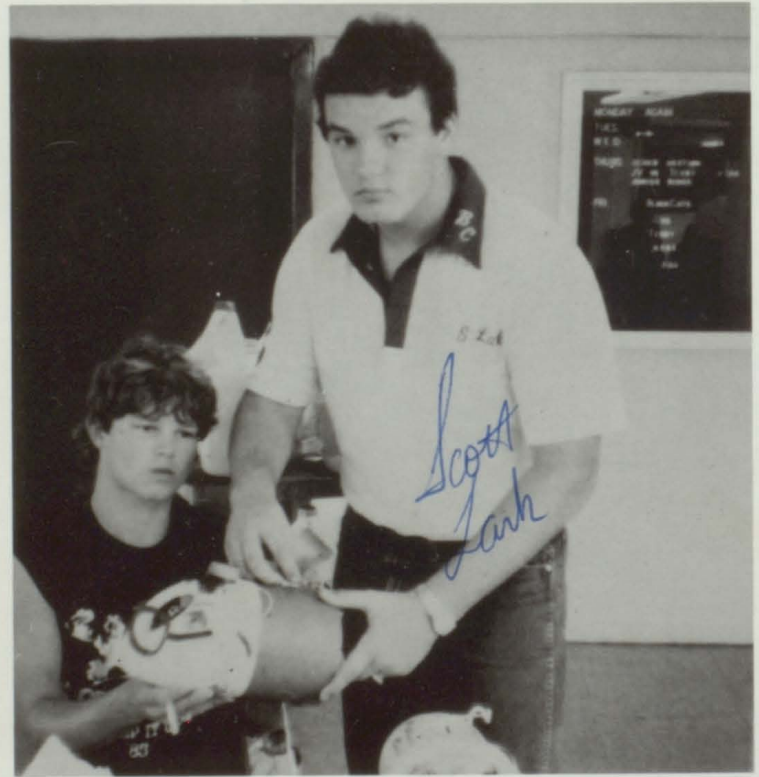




Super Clubs

Most clubs throughout the year do various activities. But the ones who really went through grime and grit for an outstanding organization were noticed.

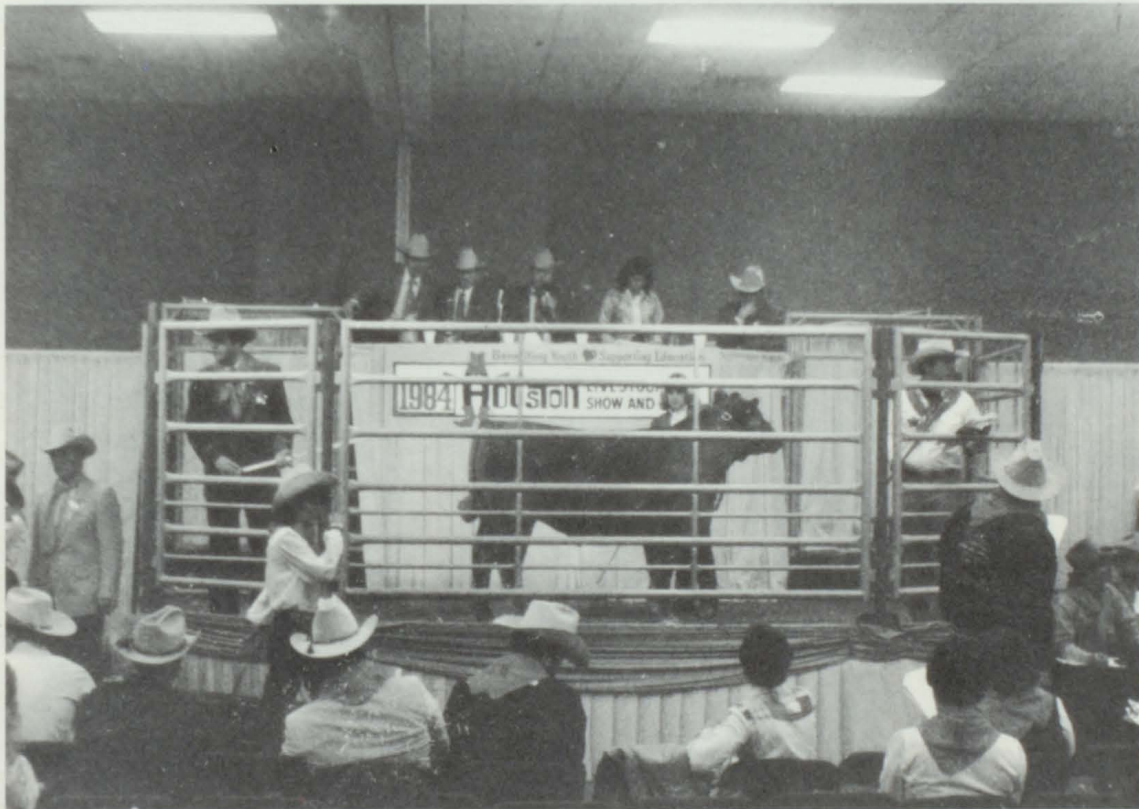
- a. Krista Torgeson a member of NHS, spent hours filling the balloons with helium for the big "let go" at a Friday night football game.

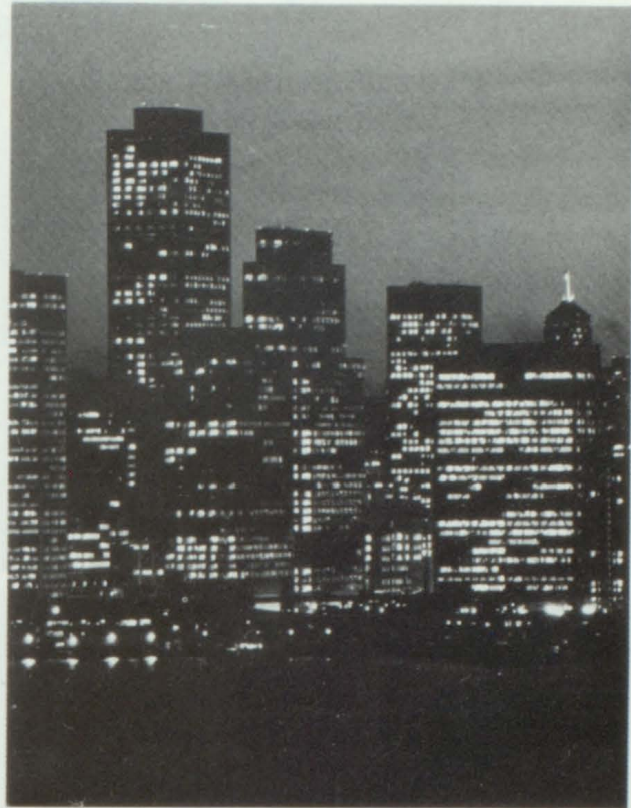


City Lights

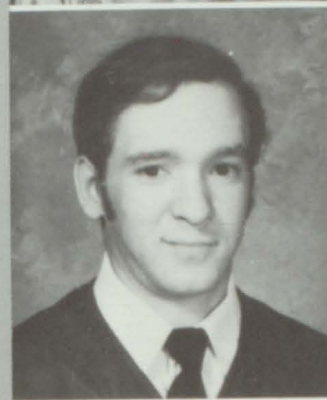
It's over and we're glad. Perhaps a little overwhelmed at the path ahead but eager to get on with other aspects of our lives.

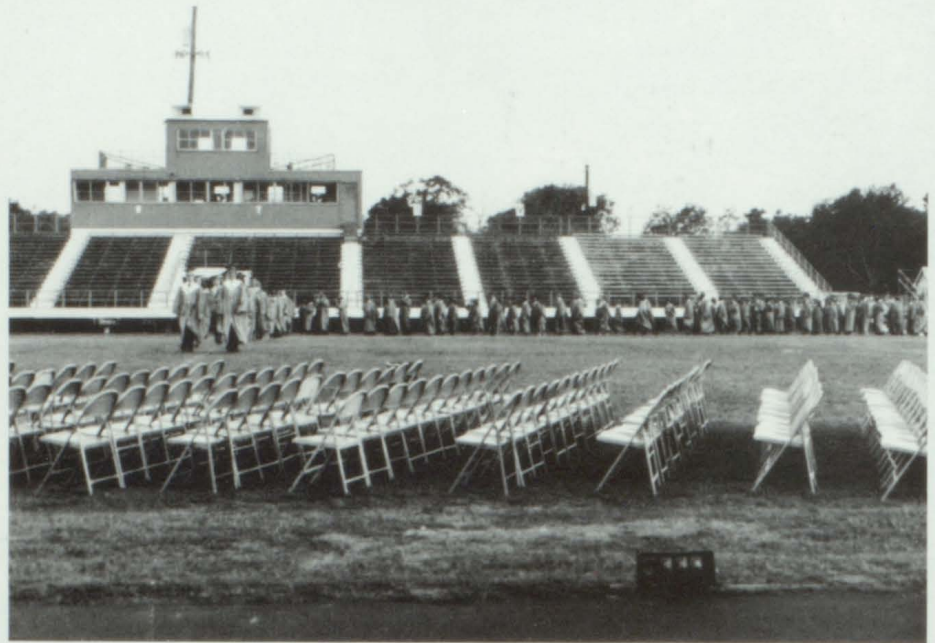


234 BCHS Seniors Awarded Diplomas

The best teams from across the state rise to the top as survival of the fittest prevails, so it was hard to understand the scenario that unfolded in Austin on December 17, 1983. Bay City fans sat in 41 degree weather on that Saturday afternoon and watched an amazing game as Bay City mauled Estacado 30-0. Bay City fans could have fallen asleep in the last half as the Cats "drove the Maradors to the wall." Estacado came close to scoring once; however, they stalled on Bay City's 20 yard line. The Black Cats took the 1983 AAAA State High School Championship with a fair degree of ease.

The climb for the title began with the first game against Lamar Consolidated. Black Cat fans saw then that they should make reservations in Austin for the State game. The Black Cats won 26-0 over the Mustangs.

The following week, Bay City looked as if it might lose its first game of the year. Dickenson had Bay City down 7-3 going into the fourth quarter, but the Black Cats drove 91 yards to beat the Gators 9-7 in the final minutes of the game.

During the 3rd game of the year, Bay City had little trouble with Calhoun. The Black Cats picked up 444 yards on offense and defeated the Sandcrabs with a final score of 42-7.

Bay City, in its opening district game, clobbered the Exporters 26-0. Bay City used running and passing to beat Brazosport.

The next district game was against West Columbia. They, too, went down in defeat to the Cats with a final score of 42-13.

In the Cats Homecoming game, they showed their versatile offense by passing for 200 yards and rushing for 78 in route to a 44-0 win over Santa Fe.

Bay City went to Friendswood looking for a good game. At half-time, it looked as if the Mustangs were going to do what Bay City had expected. The score was 19-7. When the Cats got back on the field, they ran up 30 points to beat the opponent soundly.

Wharton came to Bay City looking for an upset. They couldn't handle the Cats defense or offense and Bay City won 34-0.

This proved to be the clincher for Bay City as they won 13-7.

The Terry Rangers came to Cat Country and found out that Bay City is the #1 team in the state. The Cats wasted no time getting rid of the opponent and going undefeated in the district game. They beat the Rangers 35-0.

In a grudge match against Huntsville in bi-district competition, the Cats came out on top 33-9. Bay City's offense exploded for 416 yards, while the hard hitting defense only allowed 167 yards of the hornets offense.

In the quarter final game against the Georgetown Eagles, Bay City fans were shaken at half-time because of the freezing weather at Kyle Field in College Station, but not by the fact that the Black Cats were behind 0-6. When the Cats moved back on the field, it was a different ball game as the Cats ran up 20 points to give them a 20-6 win over the Eagles.

After freezing at Kyle Field, the coaches decided to move the team inside.

Awesome Willowridge (1st in state and 2nd in the nation with a 27 game winning streak) hosted the Cats at the dome. The Cats whipped'em good!!! The final score was 42-0. There wasn't any competition between the two schools. The Cat's defense gave up only 147 yards of offense and held Thurman Thomas, their best back, to an 87 yard total.

After the big upset with Willowridge, Bay City fans thought New Braunfels was going to be tough. But their trip to Victoria proved to be a practice game. Every time the Cats got the ball they scored beating the Unicorns 49-6. Brent Centilli

Honor Status Is No Surprise to Top 10

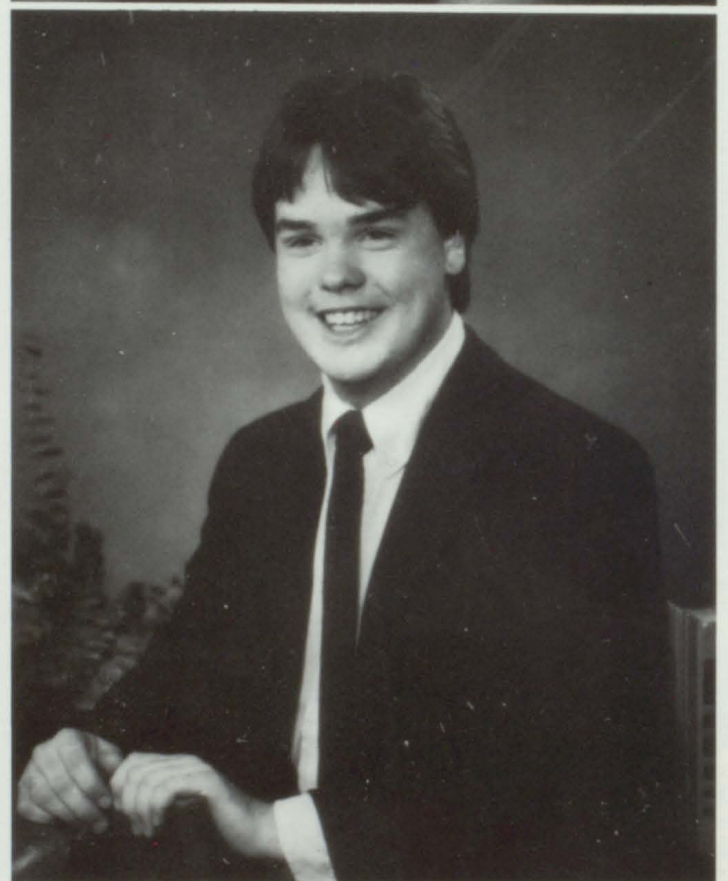
Principal Bobby Kimball certified 10 BCHS seniors at the Awards Assembly held May 7, as the honor graduates of the class of 1984.

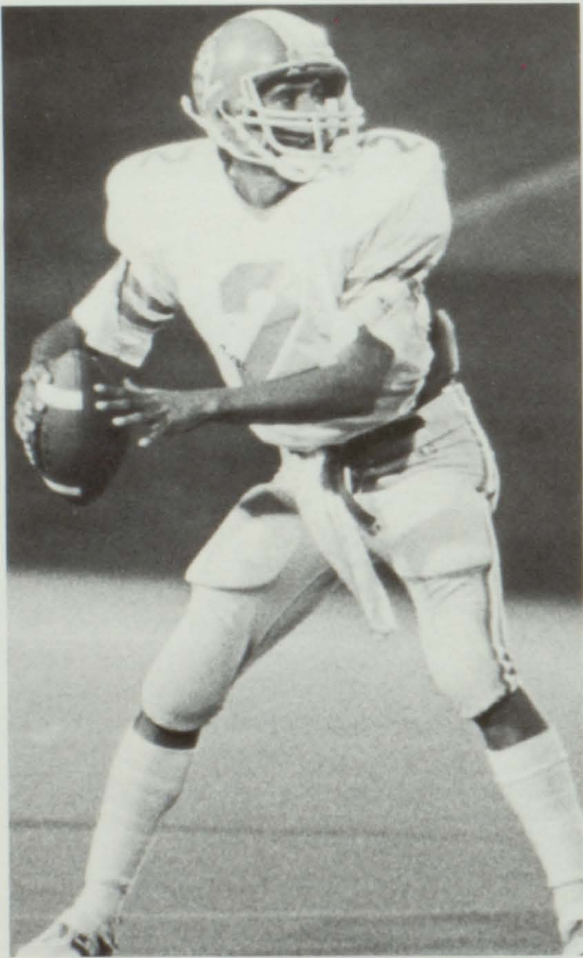
Black Cats stalked nationally ranked teams to claim State AAAA Football Championship

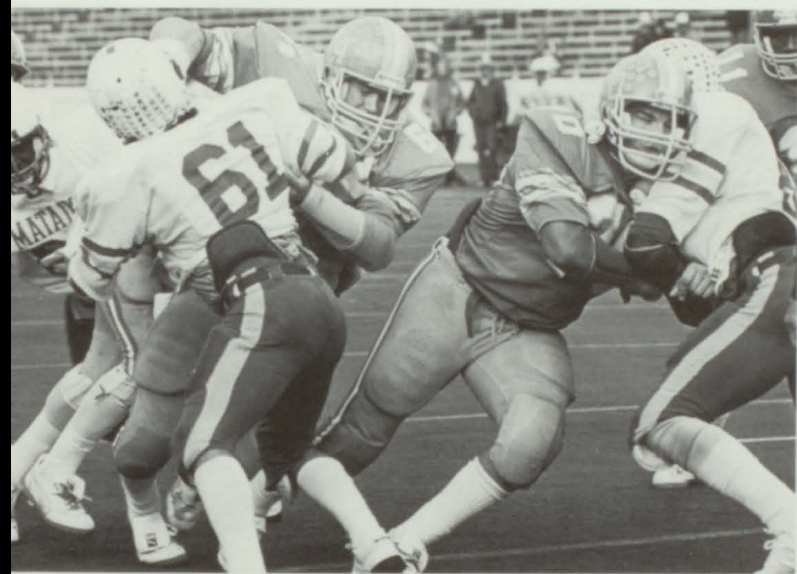

And now there were only two games to get through.

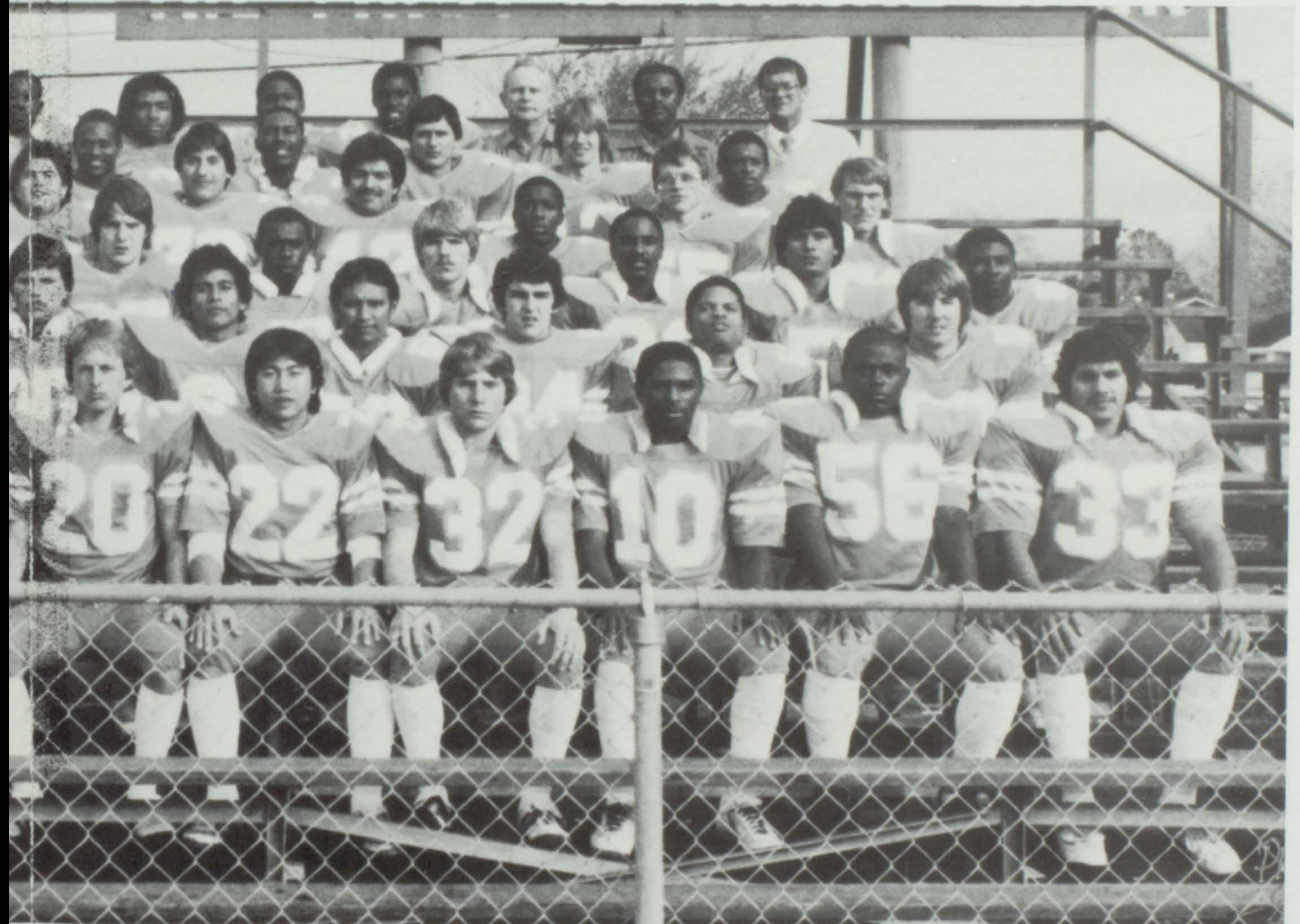
The Unicorns next by the Cats were defeated,

Following competition came tryouts for next year's Aristocats, 24 members and 5 officers were chosen.

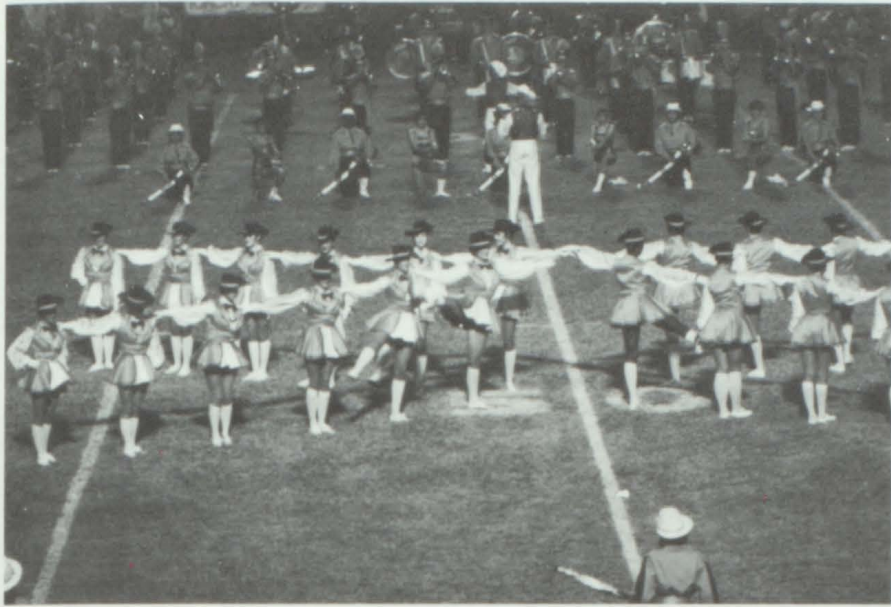

Athletes Honored at Picnic; Sportsmanship Honors Go to Basketball Squad

Tom Catchings drove three hours to present an award that took less than a minute to hand over. But it took a season to earn.

Catchings, District VIII director of the Southwest Officials' Association, presented Bay City High School head basketball coach Eddie Nelson and athletic director Ron Mills the Harlin-Neely Sportsman's Award, which honors a basketball program's conduct on the court and in the stands.

"You can win a state championship with good coaches and a good team," Catchings said, "but this award can only be won on good character."

The award — named after two basketball officials who died while traveling to a game — is not given every year. The last one was presented three years ago. Catchings said Bay City was judged at two games, including the last one, against Port Arthur Lincoln.

Catchings officiated that game. He contacted other officials to judge the attitude and character displayed by the starting five players, the reserves on the bench, the coaches, cheerleaders and fans.

Bay City won and the award was presented Monday at a sports awards picnic to honor varsity athletes in five sports. (Football coaches honored their players earlier this year; baseball coaches will recognize their players after the state tournament.)

University Interscholastic League officials honored Bay City athletes during the season. Now it was the coaches' turns.

Hart Lee Dykes and LaBradford Smith were honored as most outstanding basketball players, while teammate Carl Jackson received the most valuable player award for

their performances during a 25-2 season in which Bay City came within five points of the state championship.

Sonja Smith and Rebecca "Peaches" Alexander, who played on Bay City's sixth consecutive district champion girls' basketball team, won the most dependable player and most valuable player awards, respectively. Alexander also made the all-regional second team.

In track and field, Joe DeLoach was named most outstanding boys' performer.

DeLoach, a junior who has qualified for the Junior National Olympics, set a Class 4A record with a wind-aided 10.0 finish in the 100-meter dash that broke a school record and tied the state and national records.

Angela Ellis received an award as the most outstanding girls' track performer.

Other award winners included Tim Nelson, who took the most outstanding boys' tennis player award for the second straight year. Christina Baumgardt was presented with the most outstanding girls' tennis player award.

Michelle Rutledge and Vance Hamilton were named the most outstanding golfers.

Charles Ryan received the most outstanding off-season athlete award and Scott Lark took the most outstanding all-season award.

Ken Watkins and Kathy Cerny won the most outstanding academic athlete. In swimming, Tiffany Tietz and Stephen Grein were named outstanding performers for the past season; Eric Eaton and Kacey Hatchett received the Laurie Bell award, named after a Bay City swimmer who died after she was hit by a car while crossing the street after swim practice.

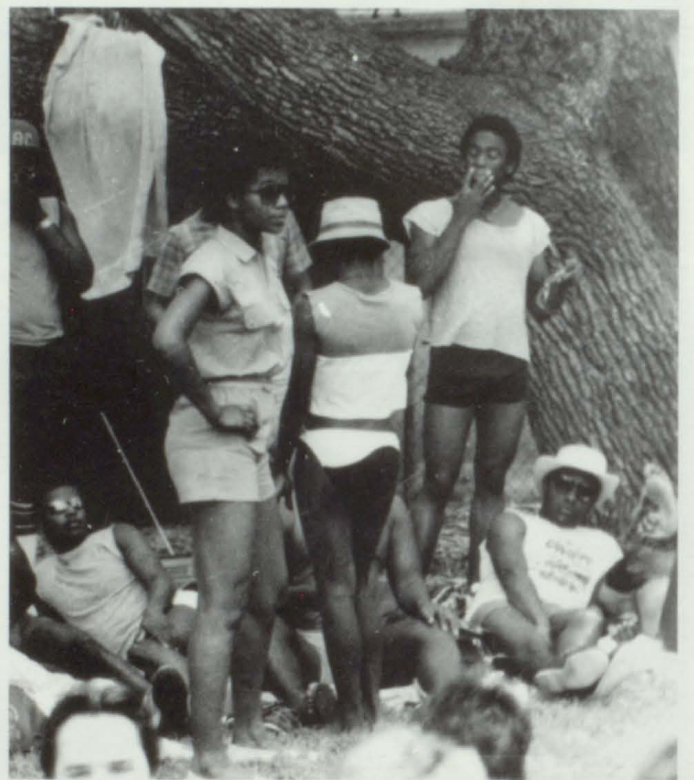

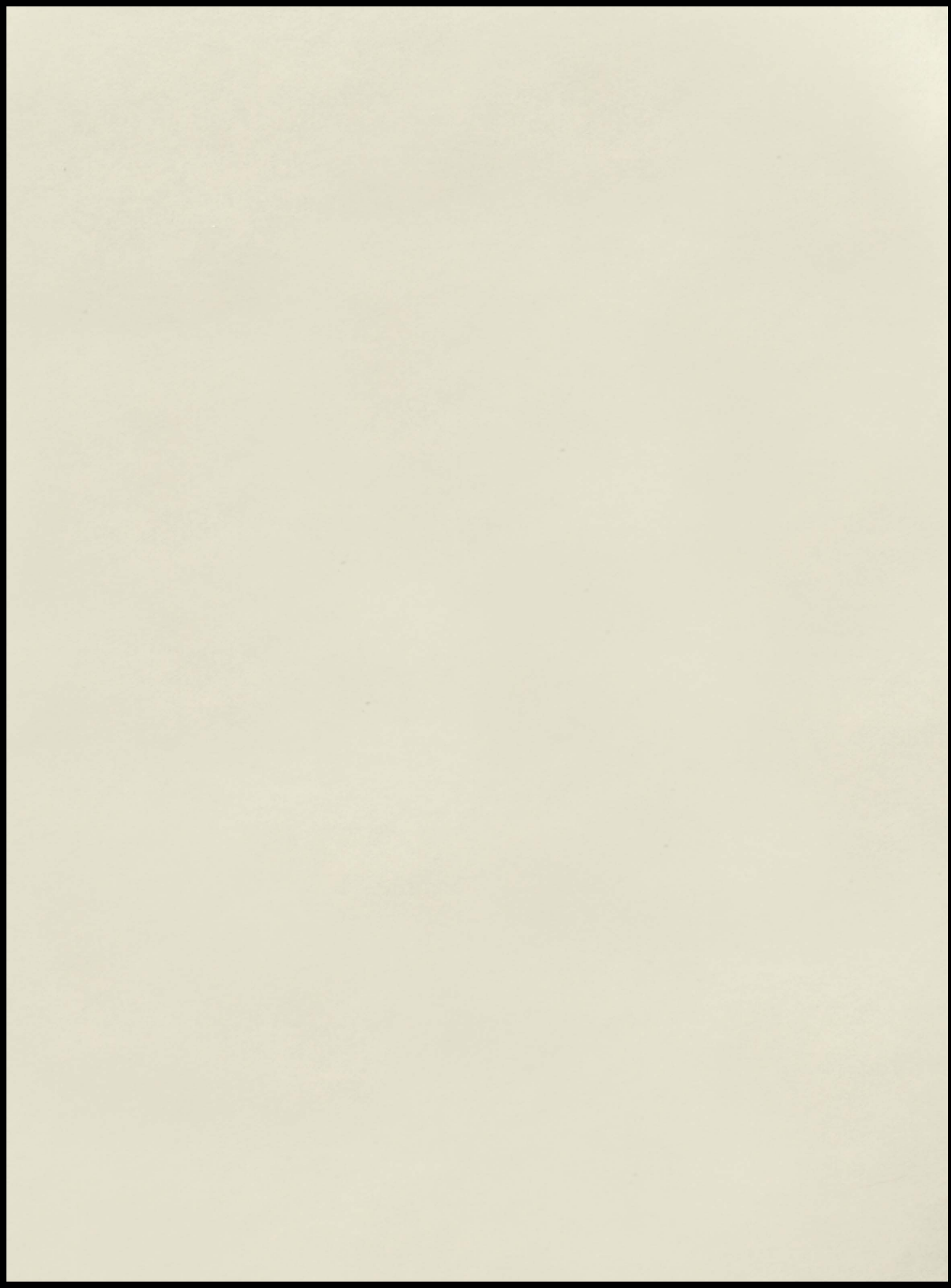
