

A. 38%-no; 35%-yes; 27%-maybe;


Q. Do you think a cure will be found for cancer, Aides, diabetes, heart disease or Alzheimer's?





Q. Do you think the quality of television shows will decrease within the next 10 yrs?






# Rippin' into Foreign Affairs:



This year's Math Club includes some of the most intelligent and talented students at Bay City High School. They competed in some very challenging competitions in the categories of Number Sense and Calculator. Number Sense is a competition in which you do as many problems in your head as possible in a certain time frame. Number Sense competitors meet every Tuesday during tutorials and after school to review tests and to learn new techniques of doing problems faster and more efficiently in your head. Calculator competitions are half-hour tests with 100 complex problems that are performed on your calculator. 


## CAREER DAY


All four enjoyed the conference because they were able to meet political personal and allowed them to feel like they were a part of Congress.


Anyone who knew Mark felt nothing but love and respect for him. It was hard not to smile at his pranks and jokes. A true friend, Mark was always around when a shoulder was








### BLACKCAT VARSITY FOOTBALL


#### Freshman Football

#### PRINCIPALS

Bobby Kimball — As Bay City High School principal I am to supervise and administer the instructional program and support operations at the campus level. My principle duties and responsibilities are to communicate with faculty, students, and parents, to distribute district information and promote positive staff and community rela-



tions. I work with the local media such as the radio, newspaper and television. For the students, I provide Open House, Meet The Teacher Night, Ninth Grade Orientation, Eighth Grade Registration, and College Night. I also provide individual conferences for all of the students. I am responsible for the expenditure of all activity funds in such a manner that is in the best interest of all the students and/or the organization. I maintain a budget for student travel and student activities. I keep accurate records showing scholastic, social, and health history of all pupils, with each individual student attendance records. I'm involved in U.I.L. activities and maintain all eligibility reports for students in school activities. I plan and moderate Awards Night, Baccalaurate, and Commencement.

Rick Bowles — I'm assistant Principal for grades 9-10 and I also deal with the special education administration (A.R.D., discipline, etc..) I supervise enrollment and withdrawal of students, assist in scheduling and registration, and perform classroom observation. I deal with Freshmen and Sophomore activities such as monitoring elections and the Sophomore Sweetheart Dance. I help orient teachers to SAC and coordinate SAC and Saturday detention program. I schedule and coordinate fire and disaster drills, which also entails coordination of the drug-free day program. I put together the Student Handbook and help the Student Council. Over all, I deal with all responsibilities that go with the duty of being an Assistant Principal to the Freshman and Sophomore classes.



Donna Harrington — As assistant principal for grades 11-12, I supervise the cheerleaders, drill team, the Junior/Senior activities (prom and favorites elections), and all other clubs. I help develop the football programs, U.I.L. Literary Events and TEAMS Exit Level Test. I also supervise the enrollment and withdrawal of students and assist in their scheduling and registration. On the first day enrollment, I'm in charge of making sure each student gets a homeroom packet. I also supervise and coordinate tutorial programs during and after school, the student aide program (students help with different sections of the faculty), and coodinate the monitoring of senior exams.



Robert Matthews — My role and purpose is to coordinate all areas of the Vocational Instructional Programs of the District, to direct and make recommendations in the instructional areas, work in an administrative capacity with vocational instructors and students, and to maintain the school's philosophy's of education that all programs will have an atmosphere conducive to good learning and teaching. The duties and responsibilities of the Director of Vocational Education are that I provide for proper supervision of students in all curricular and co-curricular activities (concession stand, stadium.) I coordinate with special educators the placement of special needs students. I establish and maintain articulation with post-secondary institutions and coordinate vocational programs with area schools.





#### **COUNSELORS**



Nanciruth Cox — Mrs. Cox's outlook on being a counselor: School counselors are specially trained to help students individually. They help students to learn decision-making skills. Students learn about their capabilities and interests, explore possible choices, and learn to take responsibility for their decisions.

Counselors assist students in moving from junior high school through high school and form goals for their future. Registration of new students and checking progress and credits for graduation is

a continuous process.

Counselors maintain current information about high school educational choices as well as college and career information. Coping skills and dealing with personal and social problems are a part of the counseling program.

Other responsibilities include staff consultations, parent conferences, referrals, maintaining records, and tests administration

and interpretation.



Joseph "Buzz" Murphy — I'm responsible for directing and guiding the educational program for all juniors, providing counseling and guidance to 1/3 of the freshman students and assisting with eighth grade orientation and registration for incoming ninth grade students. In providing information for college and careers to the students, I explain the importance of entrance requirements, transcripts, scholarships, financial aid, and vocational career information. At the end of each school year, I send out letters to parents of each junior including credits needed for graduation and other future senior information. I play a role in summer school as for reclassifying students and adjusting student schedules. I organize junior and senior T.E.A.M.S. Exit Level Tests, Baccalaurate, and Commencement exercises, and assist with College Night, Career Day, P.S.A.T. and S.A.T.



Judy Siptak — As Sophomore counselor, I perform the regular duties such as scheduling, four-year plans, testing, and giving academic advice. However, I consider myself a "people person" so my favorite part of counseling is working with students concerning their personal problems. Doing SAC counseling and working with at-risk students is another part of my job that I especially enjoy. Each student is so unique and special and that is what makes my job challenging and very rewarding.

#### COLOPHON

Six hundred twenty copies of the 1990 Blackcat Annual, Volume 77, were printed by Taylor Publishing Company at the plant in Dallas, TX. Our local representative was Kathi Cook and account executive Patti Rollins guided production of the book at the plant.

This 7 3/4 x 10 1/2 inch book has 230 pages printed on 80 lb. enamel paper. The cover design, created by Johnny Mutschler, was mylar lamenated in the Lithocote cover process. Gold foil stamp was used to emphasize the design.

Twenty-four pages are printed in full color and one page is printed with spot color, process yellow.

All body copy is set in 10 pt. opus; headlines are in either opus bold or opus bold italic.

Provine Studios was responsible for individual student portraits in black and white. Senior photos were taken by Castillo's Photography, Curtis Photography, Rita Kocurek and Photography by Norma. The band and senior group shots were taken by Panoramic Pictures. Favorite shots were handled by Castillo's Photography. Special thanks go to Doug Anderson, John Beresford and Nancy Rawlins for providing some of the pictures needed for a book like this.

Over 550 feet of black and white film and 24 rolls of color film, providing 1200 frames went into

covering the 1989-90 yearbook.

The 21 member staff sold individual copies at an advance price of \$25 and for \$35 in January. They raised over \$300 in a fall fundraiser.
