



The Rivercats represent a group of students at BCHS who are, for the most part, currently taking upper level science courses and are interested in the ecosystems of the Colorado River Watershed. These students, about 60 in number each year, take part of their weekends and after school time to monitor and report the water quality of our end of the river. They are working in conjunction with the LCRA to establish a network of 13 schools up and down the river, from Lampasas to Selkirk Island.

Mrs. Cornman, Mr. Hudson, or Mr. Simko accompanies a group of the students to Dr. Ely's pier at Selkirk each weekend for on-site testing. These students test for air & water temperature, pH, clarity, dissolved and suspended solids, dissolved oxygen, orthophosphates, nitrates, chlorides, and fecal coliform bacteria. The program has been going on for five years in Bay City, one of the pilot schools for the Austin-based Riverwatch Network. It has been giving the students practical applications for the skills they learn in science class; as well as keeping an eye on the current conditions of the river.





Twice a year, Mrs. Frankson's Marine Science class goes to Matagorda Beach to receive "hands on" learning about the marine environment. They test the water for salinity, oxygen and carbon dioxide levels, pollutants, pH, temperature, turbidity, and density. They gather sediment samples to analyze the beach for mineral content, particle size and shape. They plot the profile of the beach to compare with past years. A survey of the litter and debris on the beach is taken; and finally, the students collect organisms by seining, digging, and snooping on the jetties. Following the trip, more labs are conducted and a field trip report is written by the students.

I love to learn different languages, play the piano, and play all kinds of sports. I also love Reggae music.


















