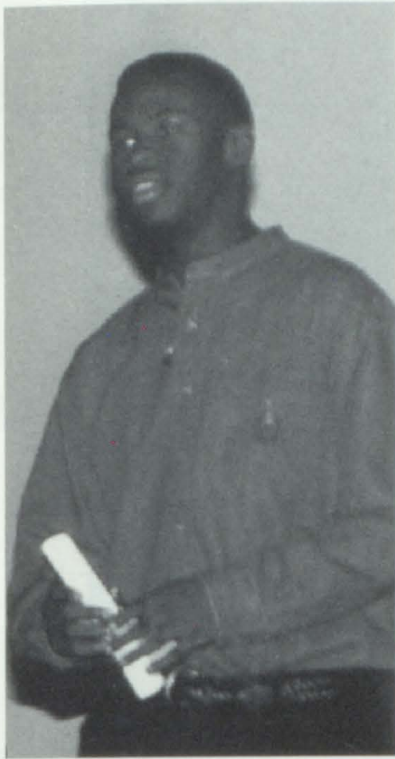

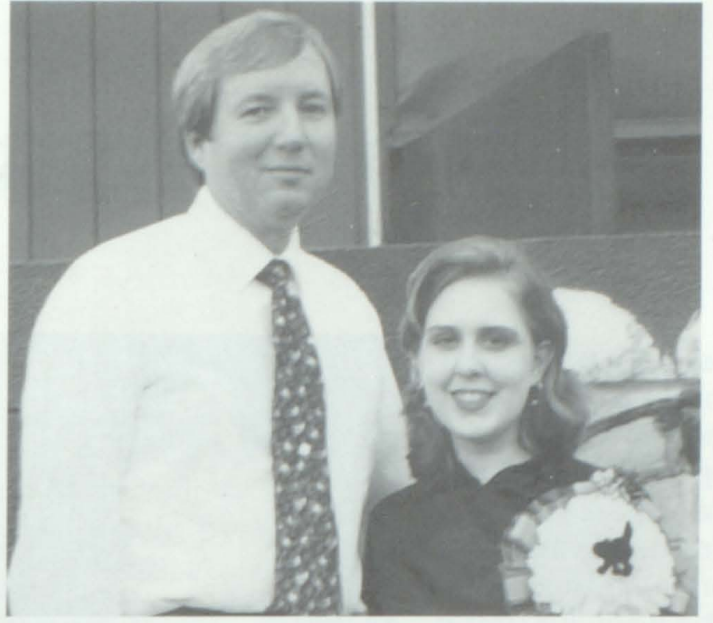

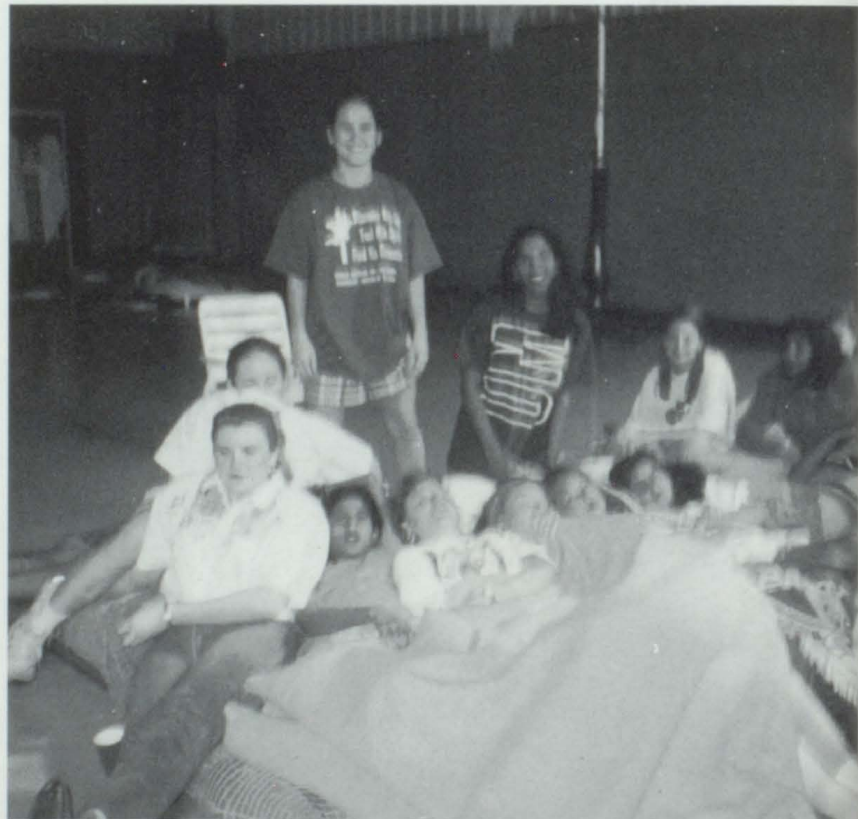


30 Hour Famine

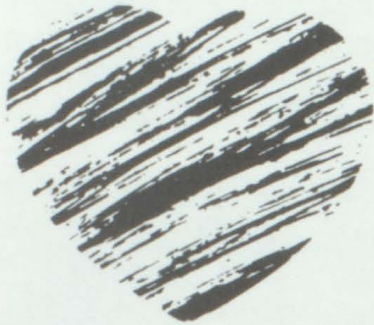

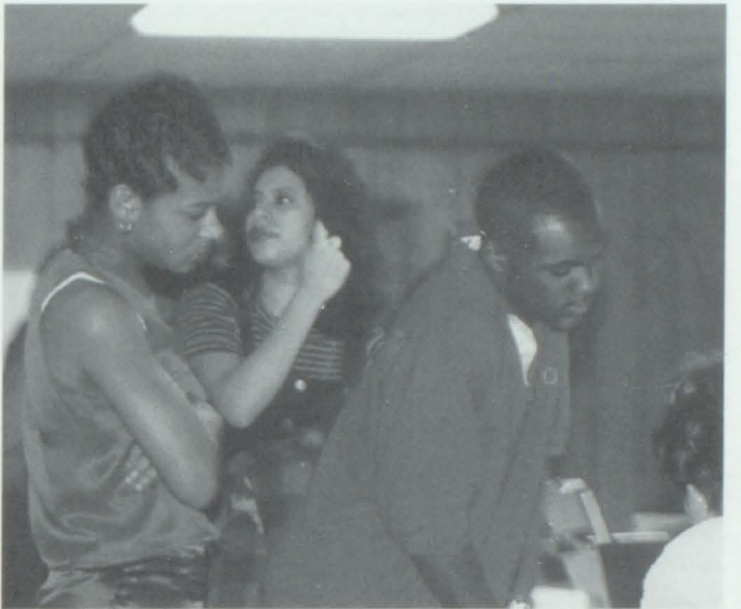

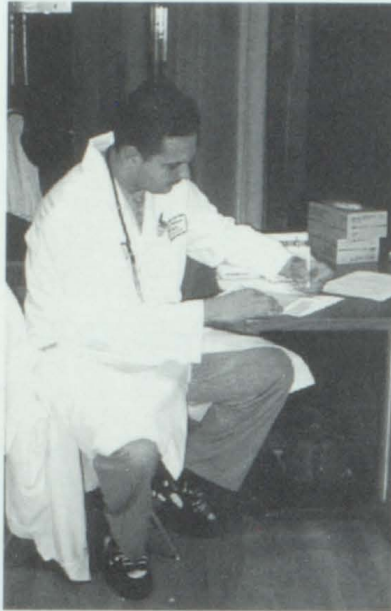


GIVE THE GIFT OF LIFE: DONATE BLOOD

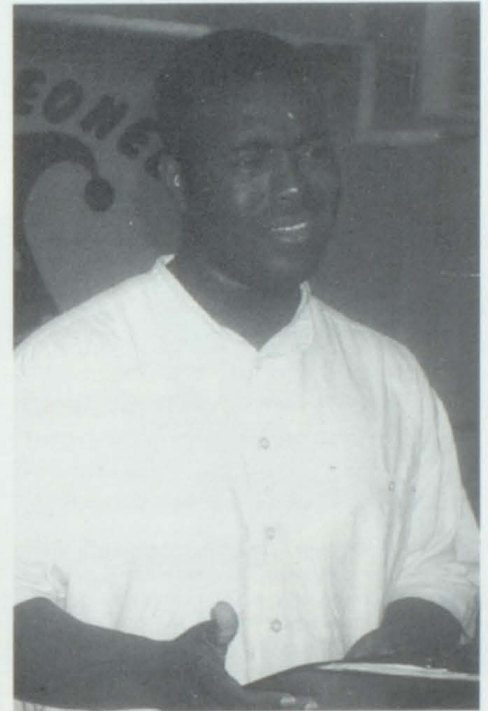

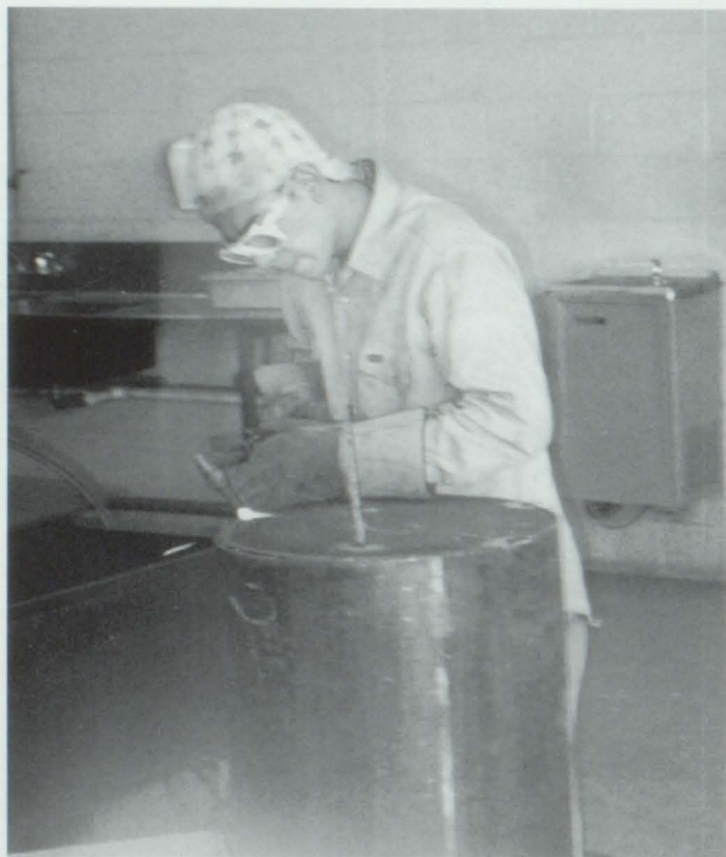

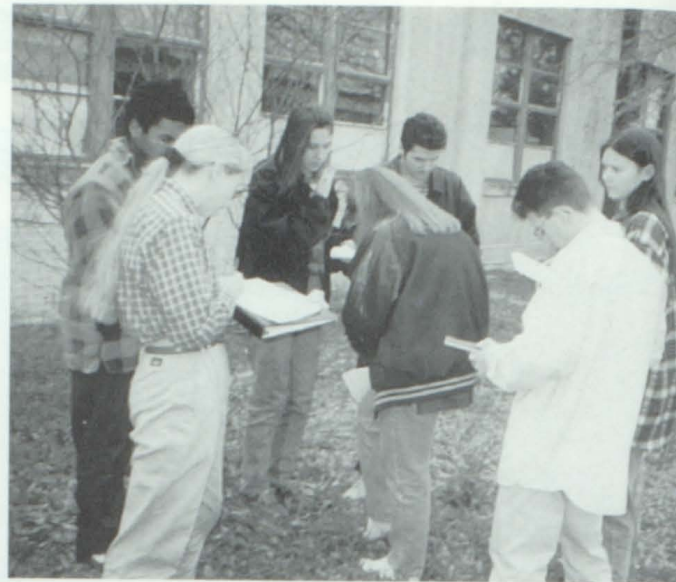

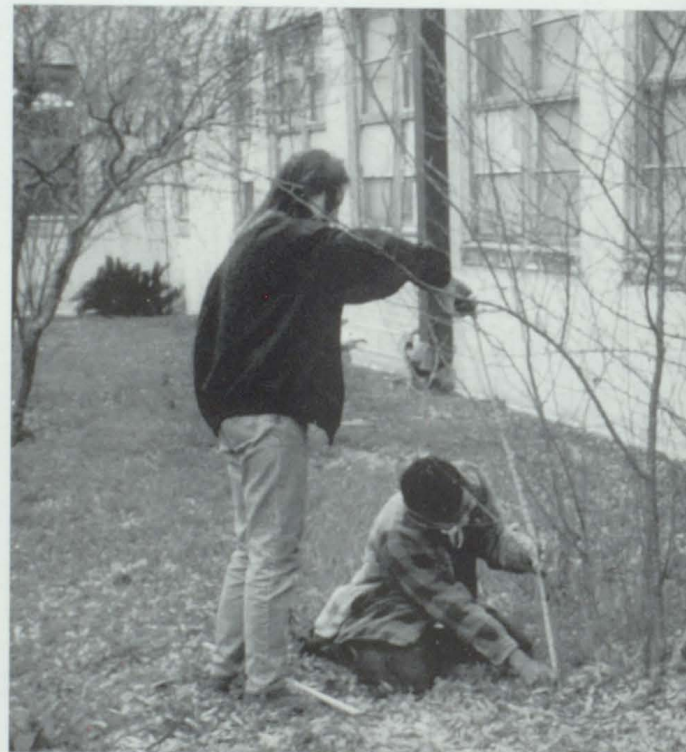

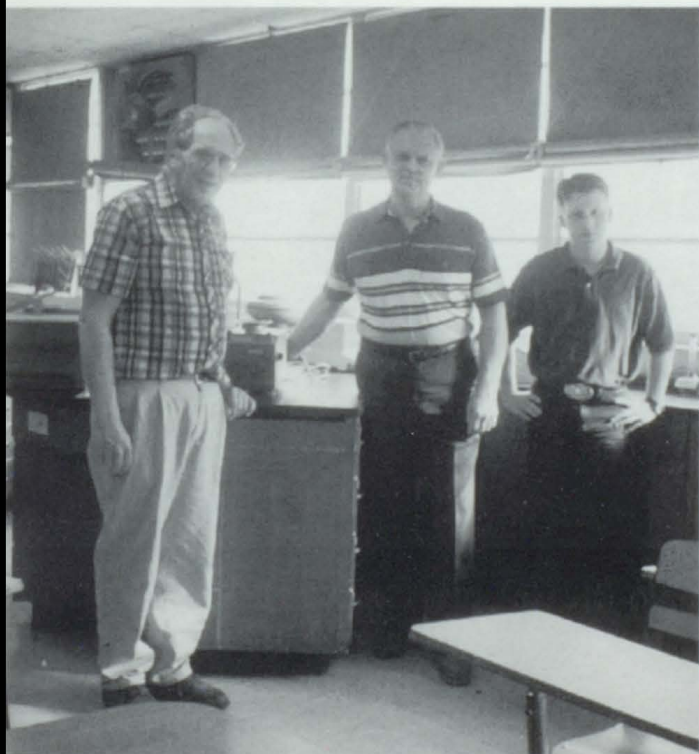

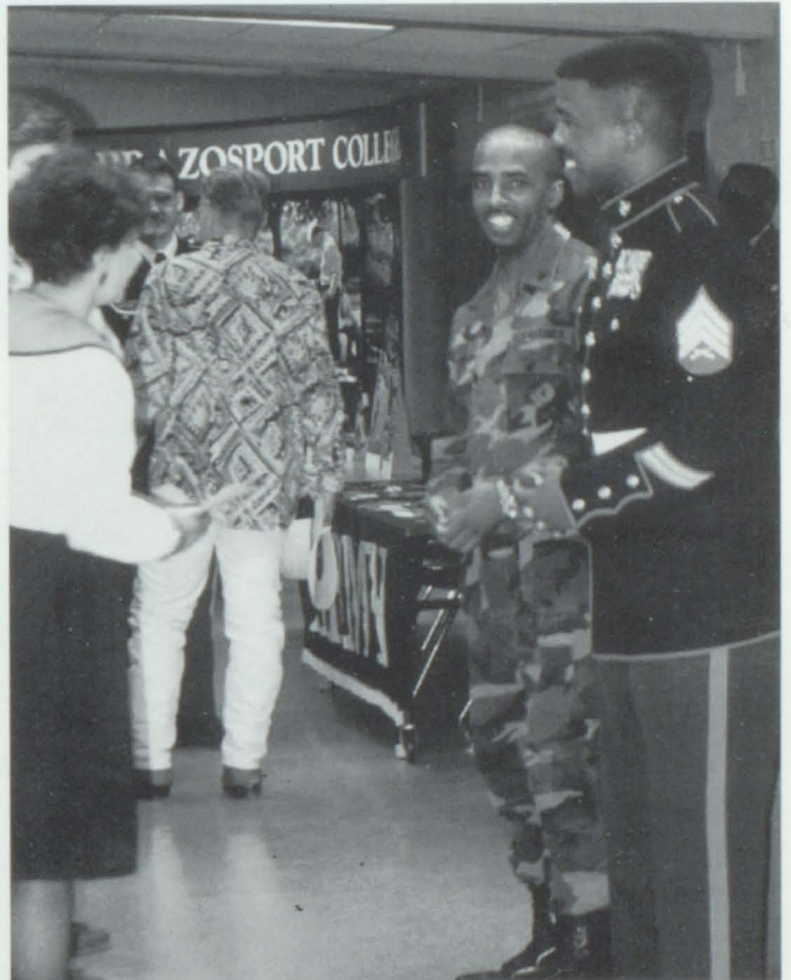

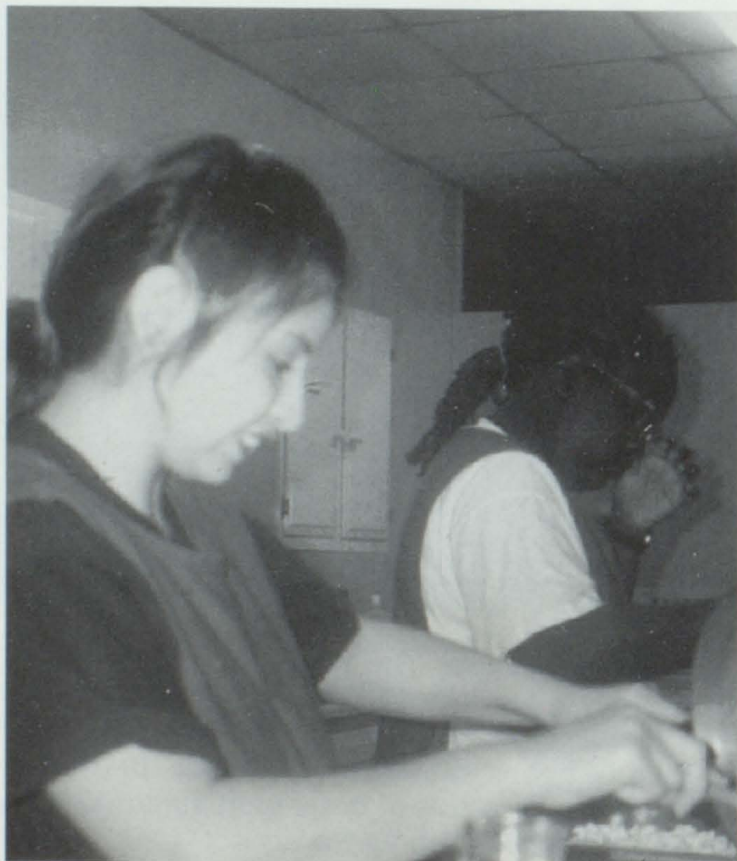

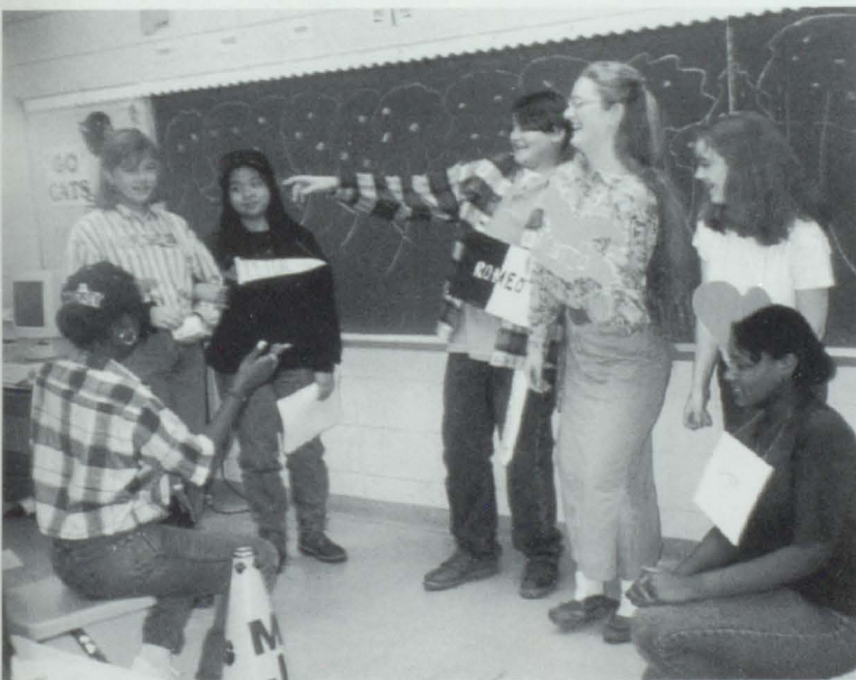

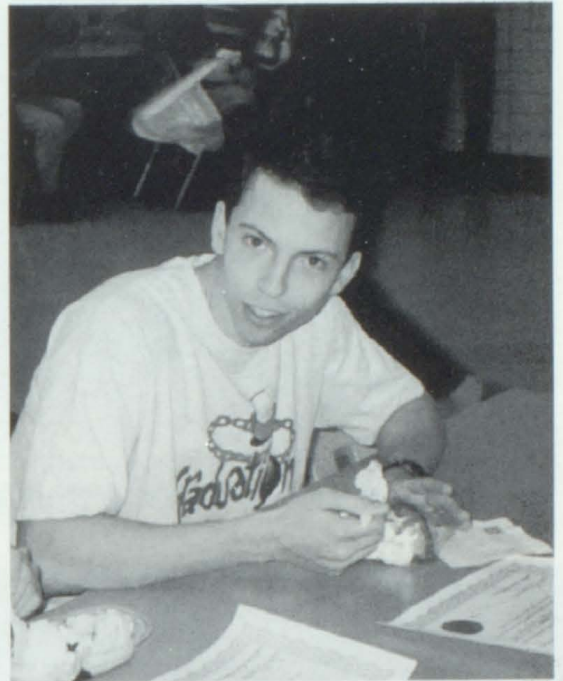

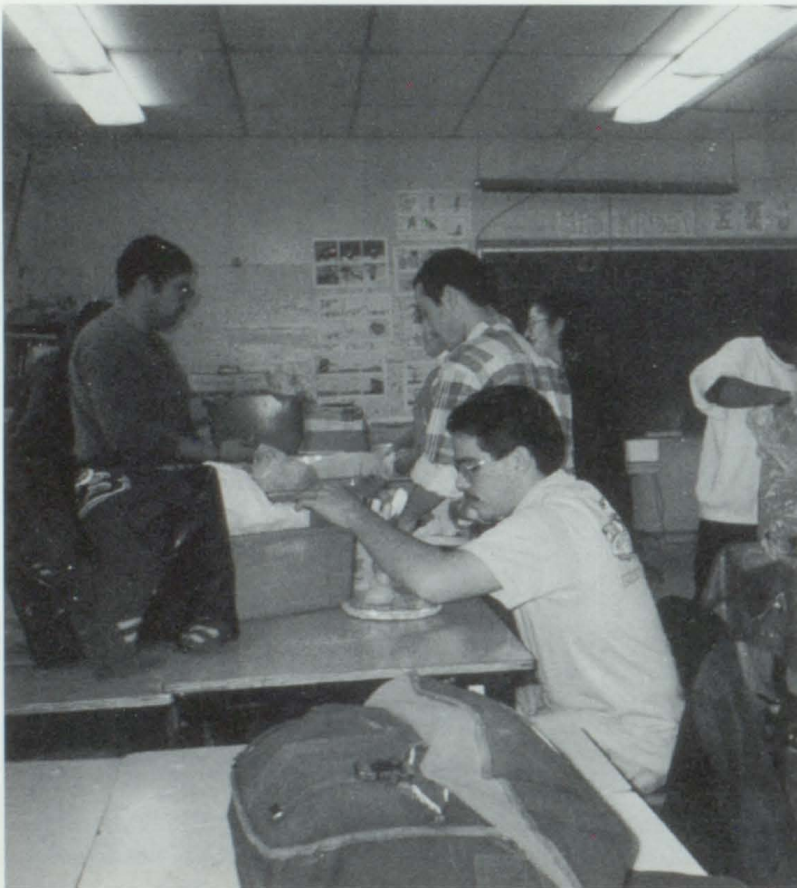

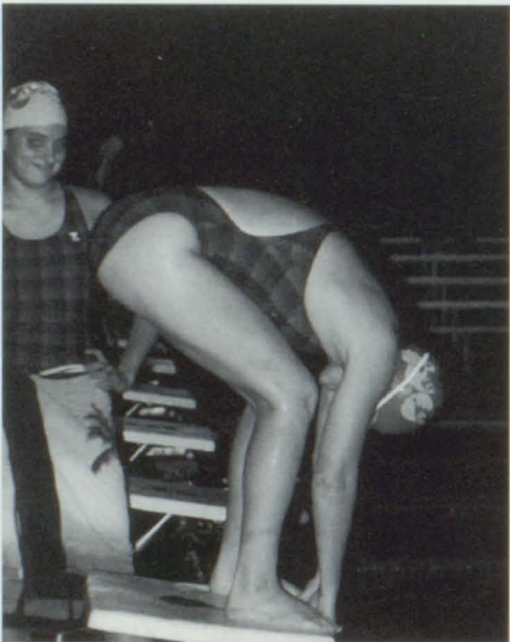

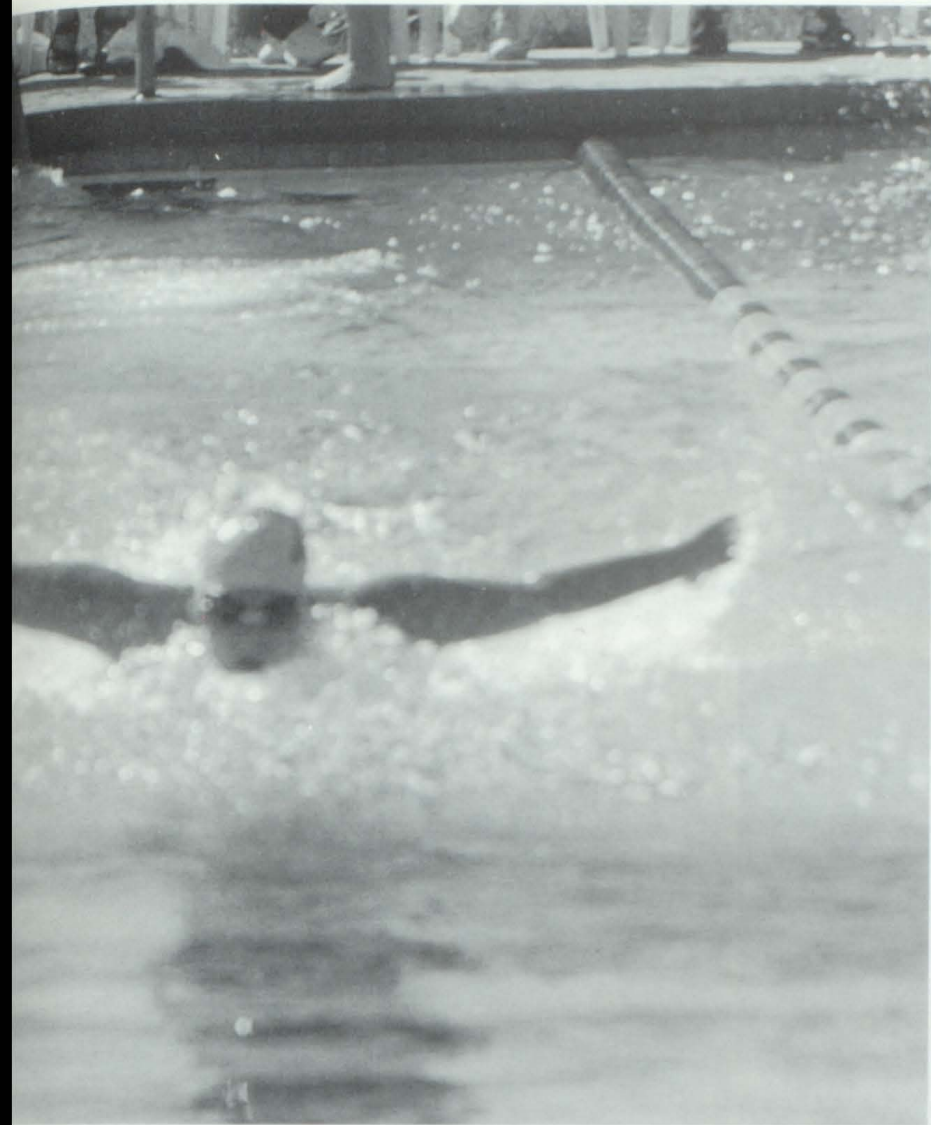

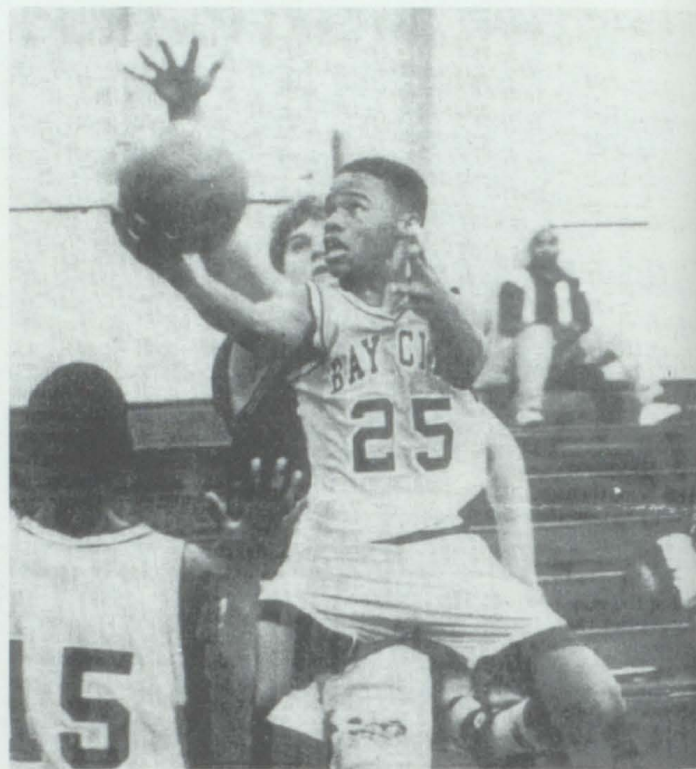

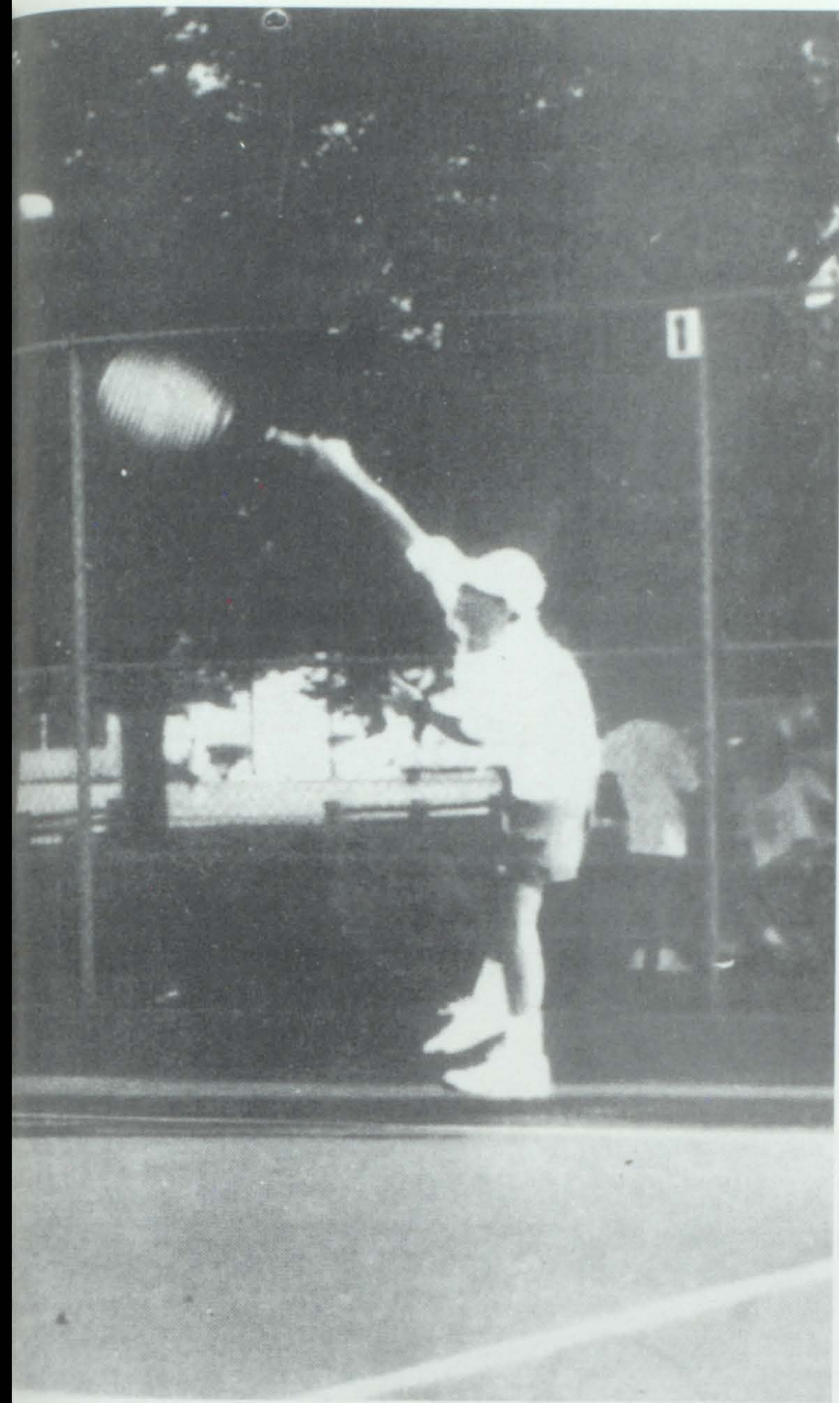

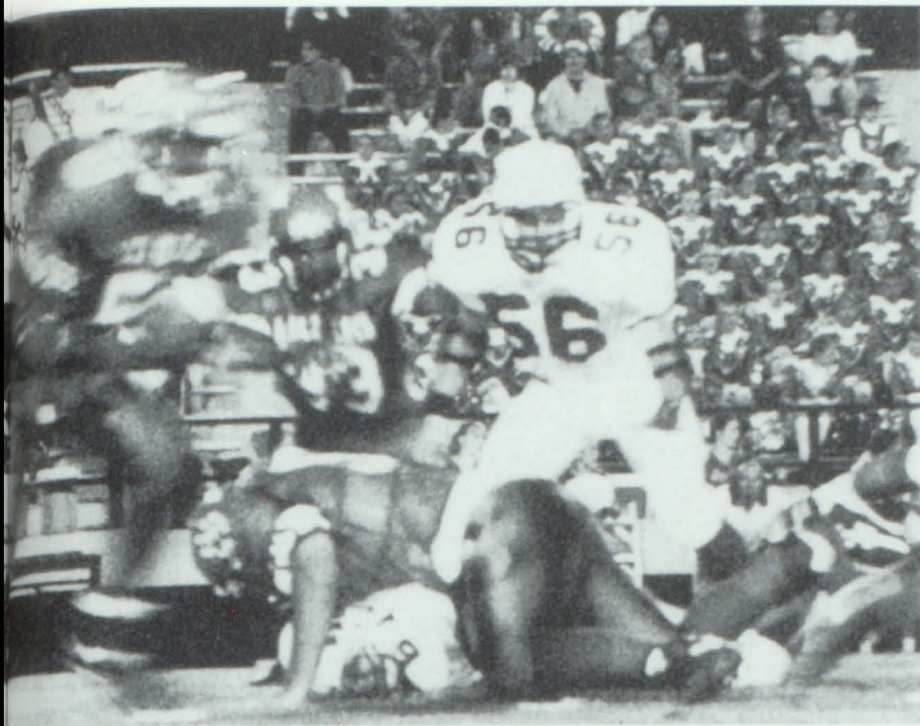

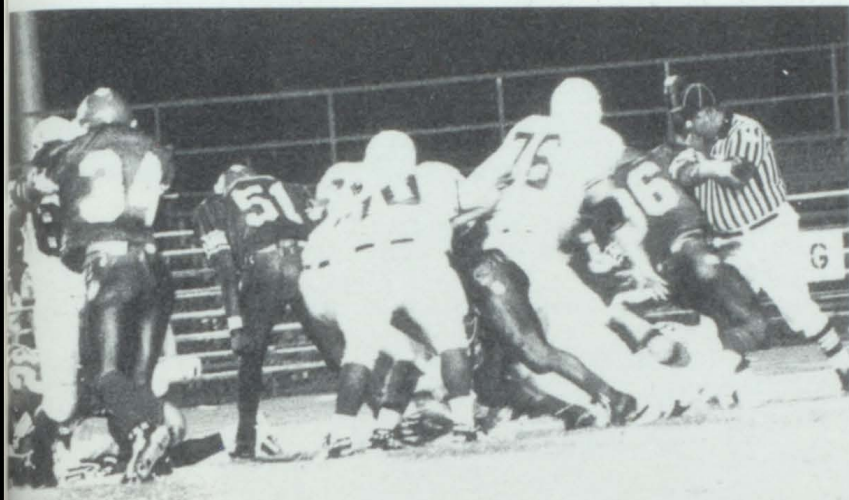


We started out the year with high hopes. Through the first 5 games we held our own. We lost several key players during those games.

Our young men played extremely hard all year long. Many a team would have completely folded. Our kids were in every game till the end.

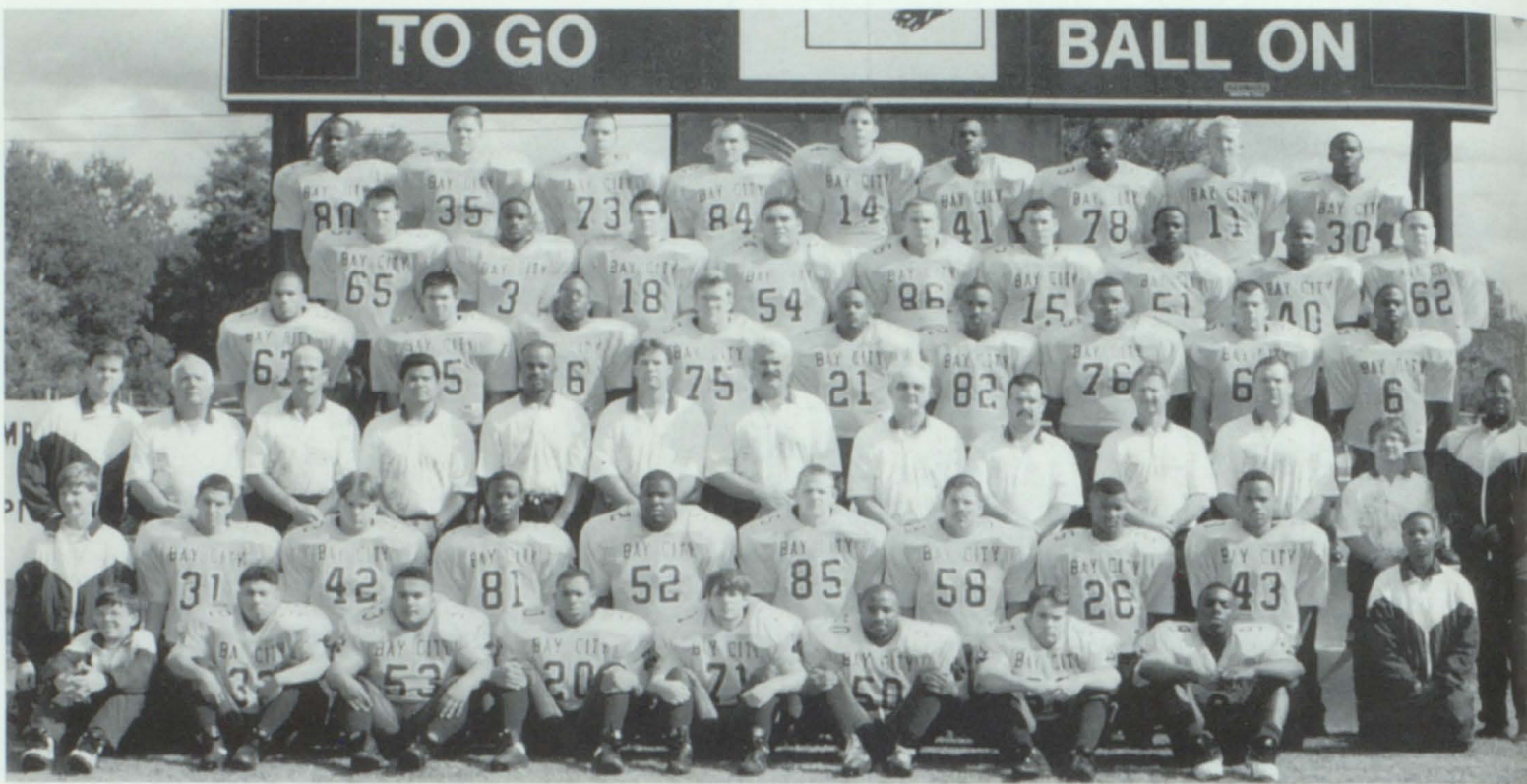

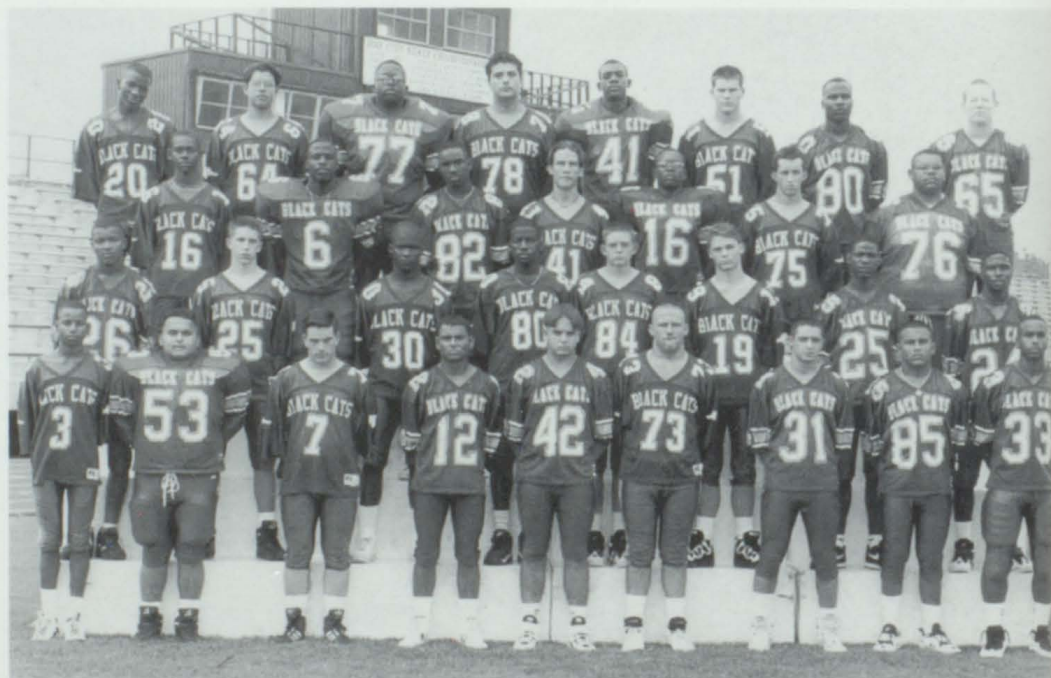

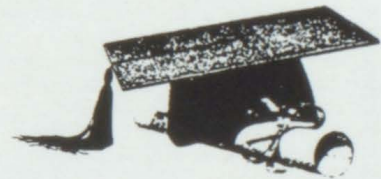
