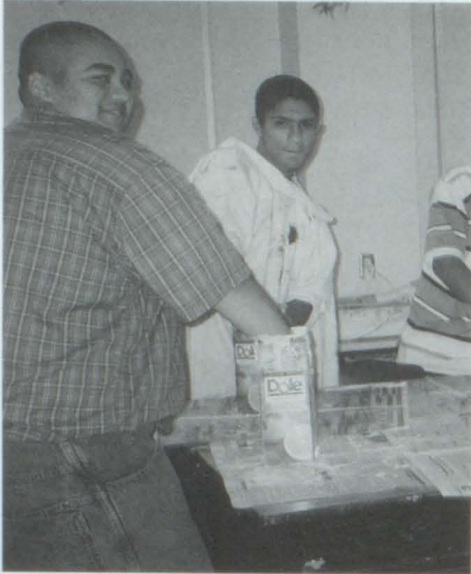

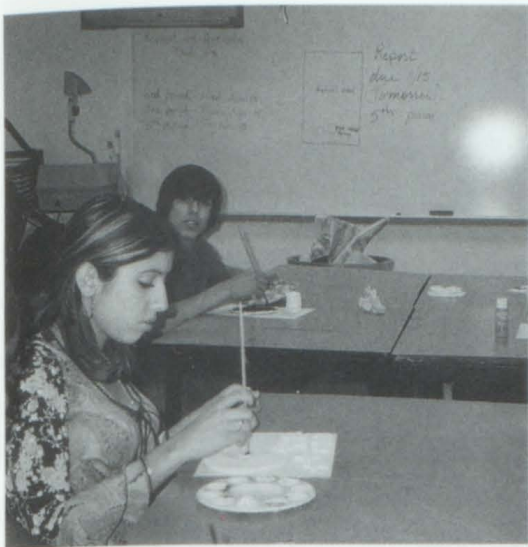

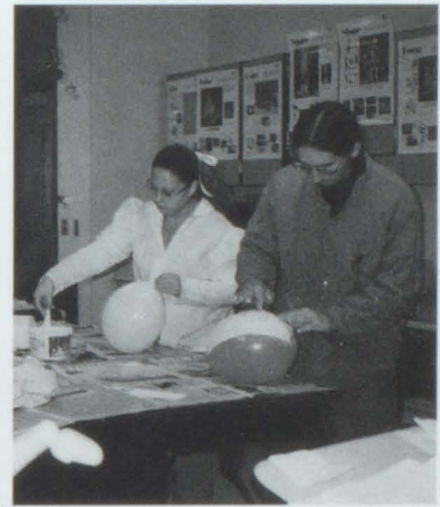

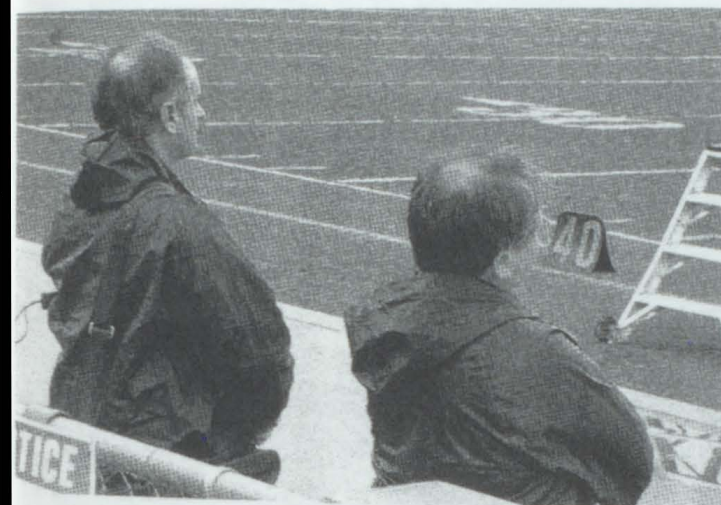

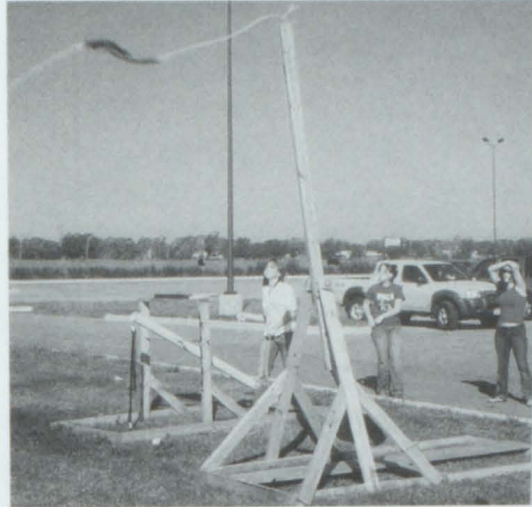

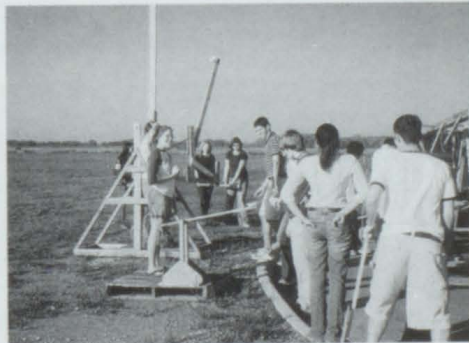

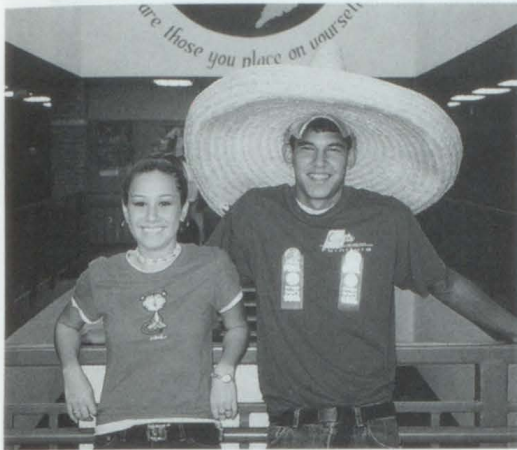

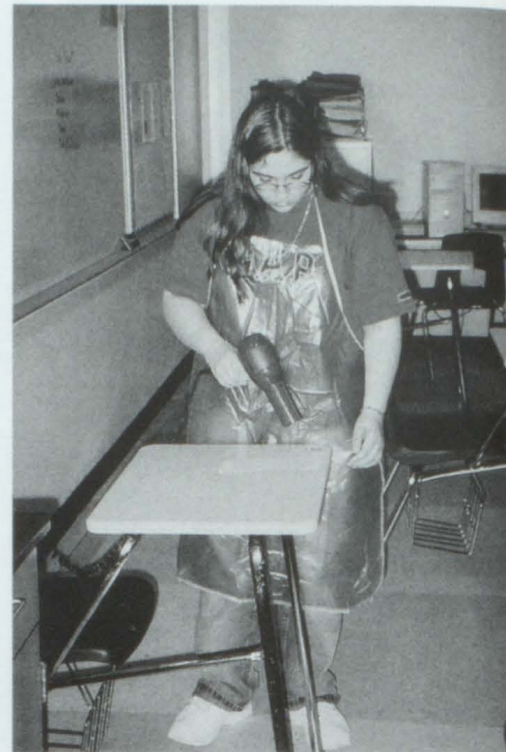

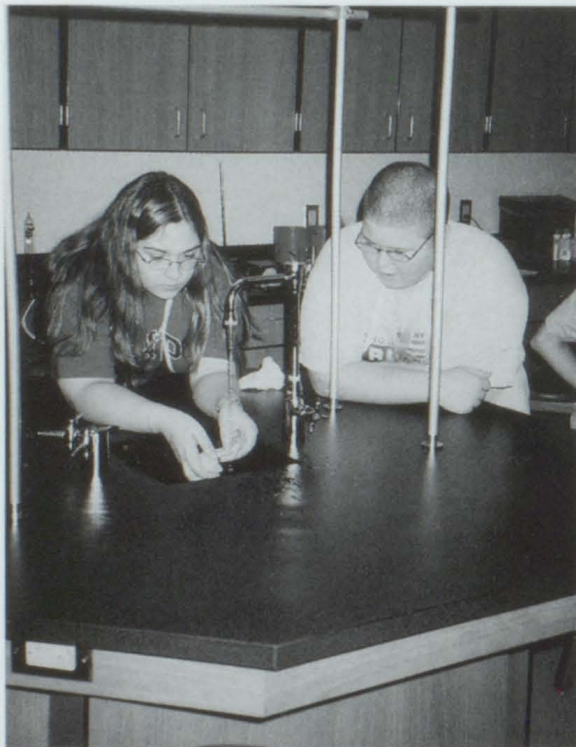

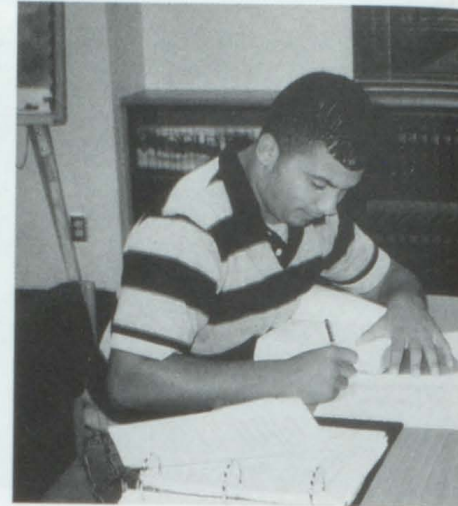

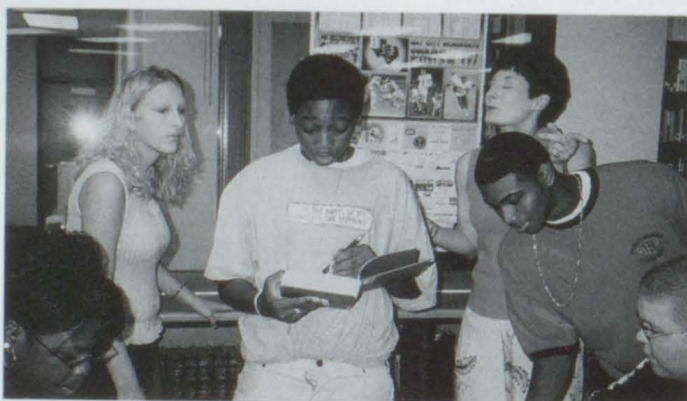

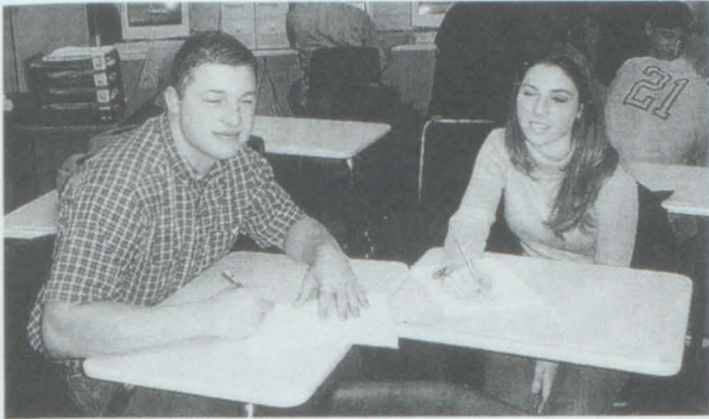

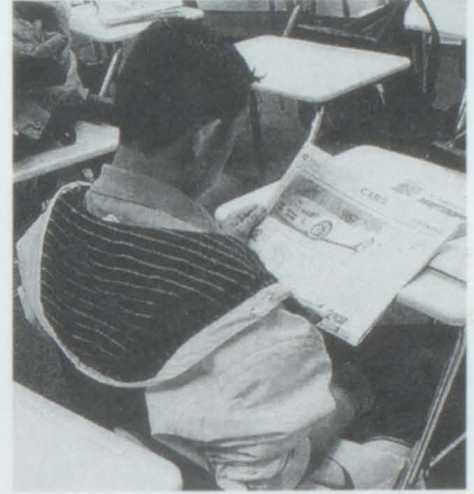

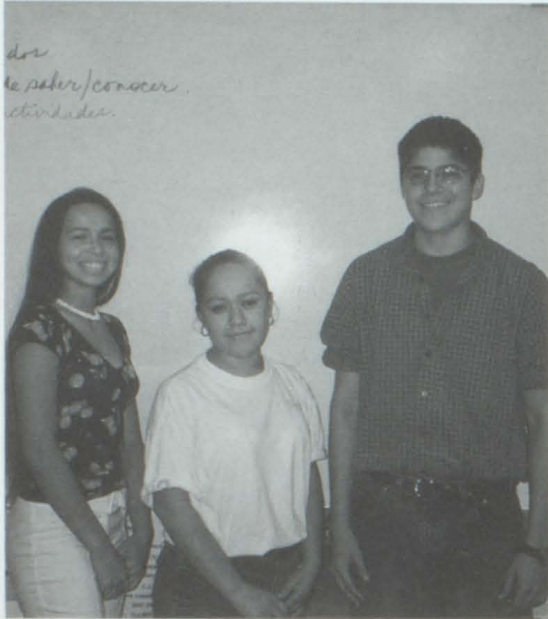

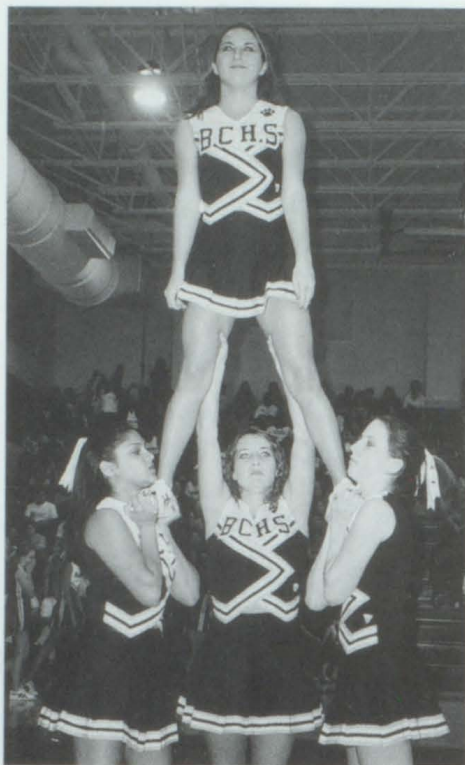

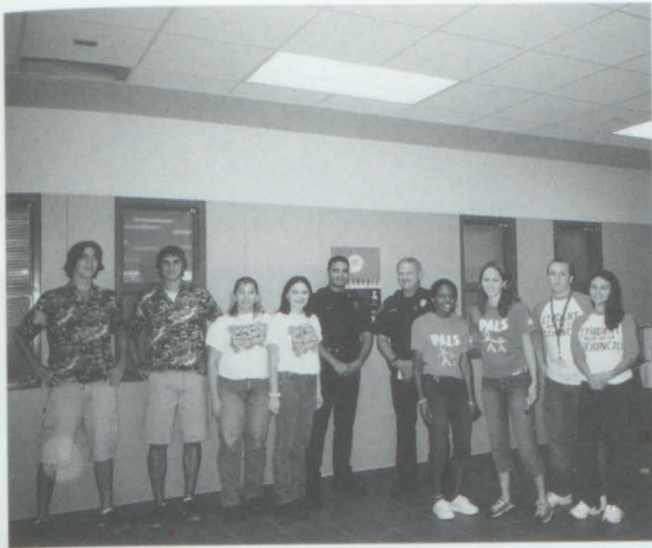

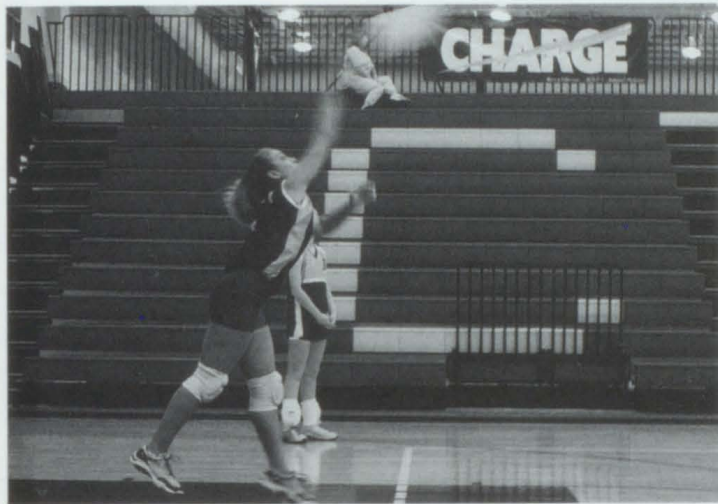

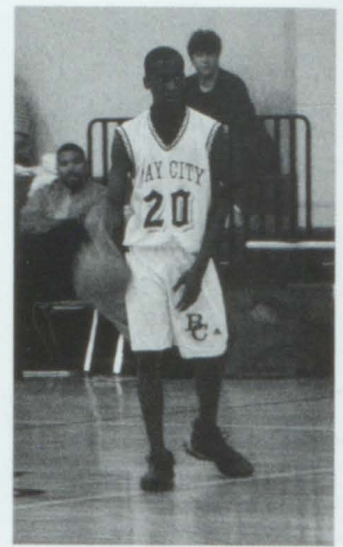

While in High School, she achieved the most athletic award and was all district in basketball. Some of her teachers that are still teaching today were Mr. Gray, Mrs. Salas, and Mrs. Green. She says things have not changed since she was in high school. She moved back to Bay City because her husband was working in his family business.

Leroy Cunningham graduated from Bay City High School in 1978. He was involved in football, basketball, baseball, and track. While in high school, he was named the most valuable player and received the sportsmanship award for the 1977 football season. Some of his teachers, still teaching today, are Mrs. Salas, Mr. Riggs, Mrs. Rawlins, Coach Nelson, Mr. Bullard, and Ms. Brown. Unlike today, the teachers were well respected and the students respected the teachers. He came back to Bay City to contribute to the BCISD and help all of the students to become productive citizens.

Veronica Dibbern graduated from Bay City High School in 1980. She was involved in Aristocats, NHS, and FTA. While in high school, she was the Aristocat captain, and outstanding aristocat her senior year. Some of her teachers, still teaching today, are Mrs. Cornman and Mrs. Crain. While in high school, she was the year's outstanding tennis player. Some of her teachers, still teaching today, are Mr. Gray and Mrs. Salas. Unlike today, there were no AP courses and no shorts or tight sweaters. She moved back home because her husband received a job offer.

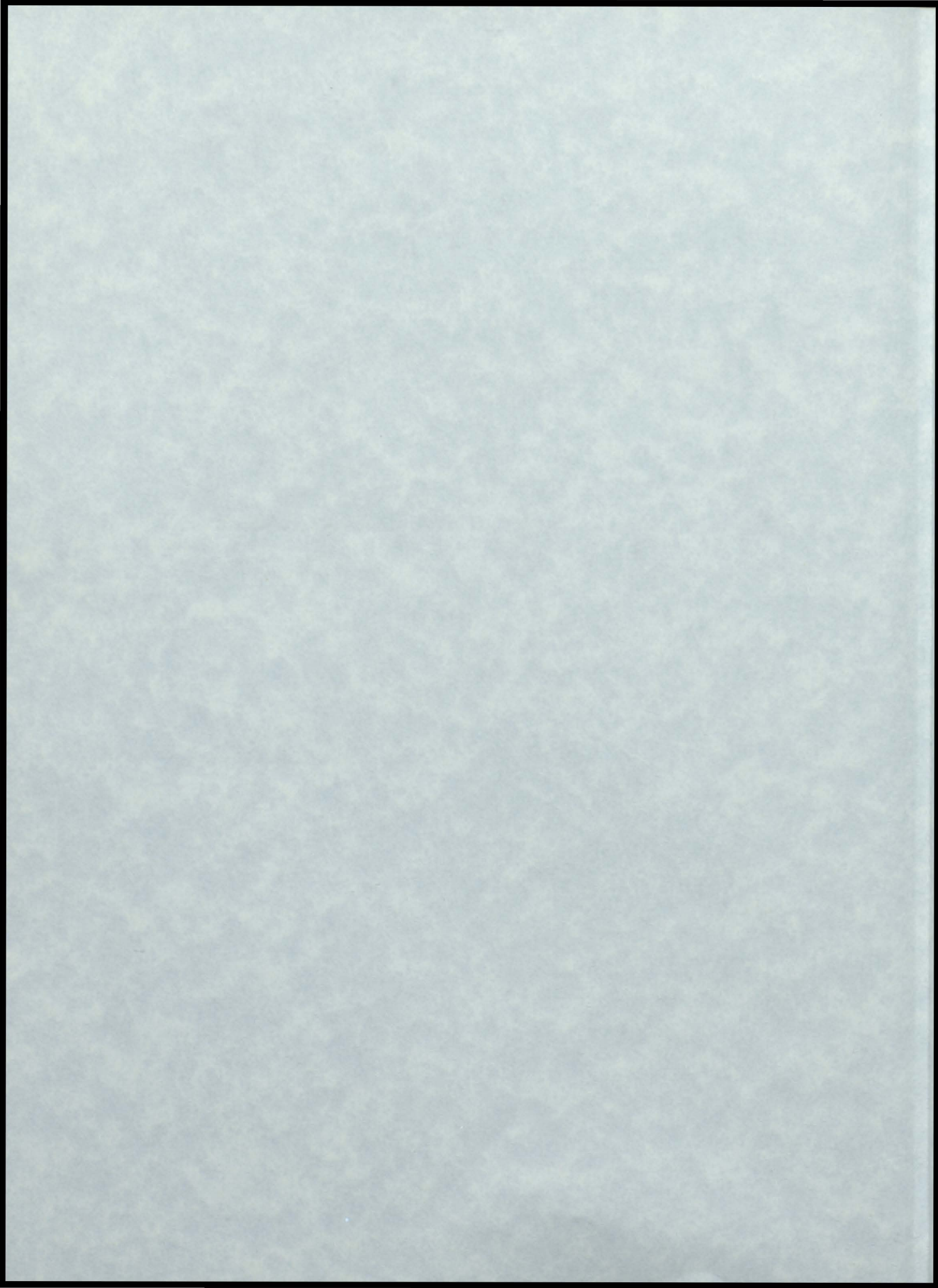
Colophon

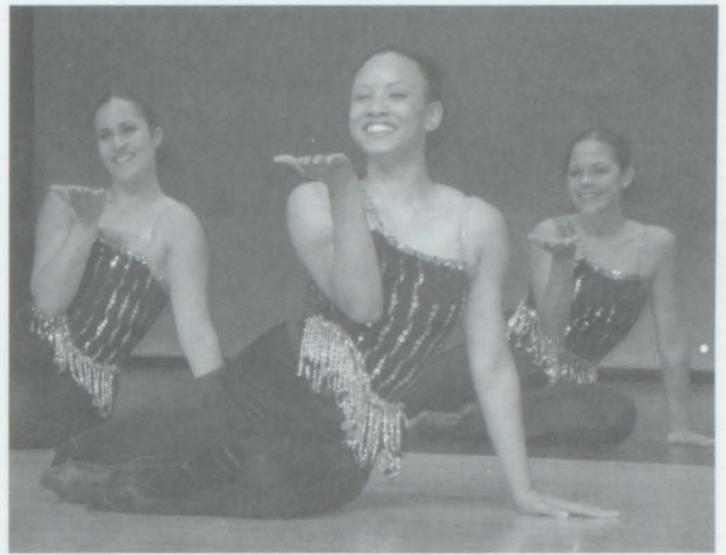

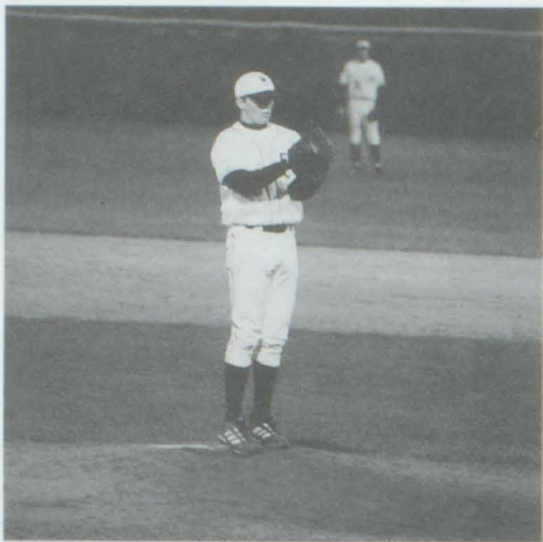

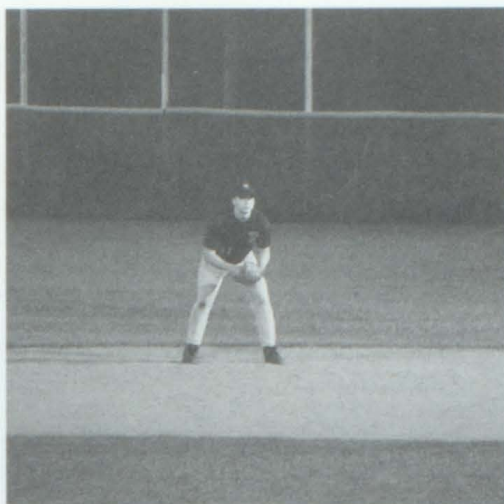

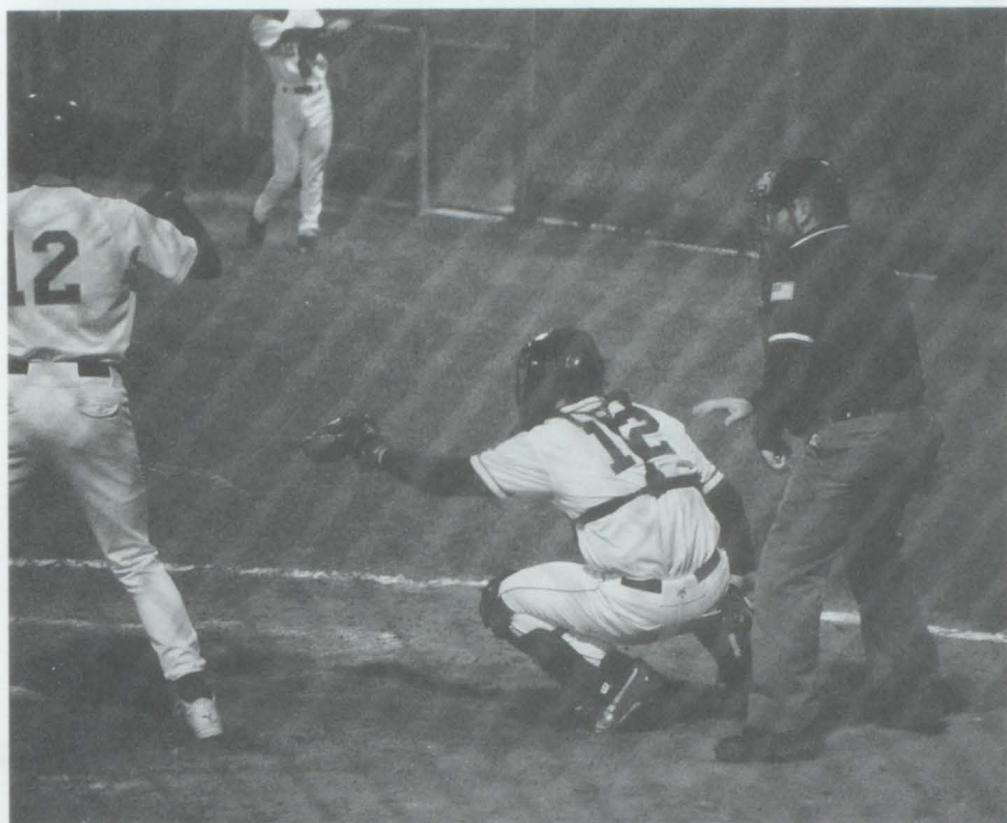
