









Appendix - Teachers That Are BCHS Graduates

Karen Crain graduated from Bay City High School in 1974. She was involved in Student Council, Basketball, Track, and Future Teachers of America. While in High School, she achieved the most athletic award and was all district in basketball. Some of her teachers that are still teaching today were Mr. Gray, Mrs. Salas, and Mrs. Green. She says things have not changed since she was in high school. She moved back to Bay City because her husband was working in his family business.

Leroy Cunningham graduated from Bay City High School in 1978. He was involved in football, basketball, baseball, and track. While in high school, he was named the most valuable player and received the sportsmanship award for the 1977 football season. Some of his teachers, still teaching today, are Mrs. Salas, Mr. Riggs, Mrs. Rawlins, Coach Nelson, Mr. Bullard, and Ms. Brown. Unlike today, the teachers were well respected and the students respected the teachers. 




